JOE C. M'CLELLAND ELECTED MAYOR OF CITY OF CLOVIS

The city election in Clovis created much interest, there being 718 votes cast, about 100 more than it was estimated would be polled. Two tickets were in the field-The Citizens Ticket and the People's Ticket, the latter making a clean sweep of everything except two sidermen in Ward No. 3 and a tie between the candidates in Ward 4. The tabulated returns on this page will give the vote each candidate received. The voting was spirited all day long and workers were busy at all the boxes.

As a result of the election Joe C. McClelland will be Clovis' new mayor and there will be at least two new members in the council—J. D. Looper from Ward No. 3 and J. W. Mordecai FIRST ANNUAL SALE from Ward 4. Aldermen I. C. John son and C. Anthony who were reelected are at present members of the council. It is not known just what disposition will be made of the tie in Ward four between E. T. Jernigan and D. C. Houk.

The mayor elect and the new aldermen will take their oath of office and be installed on Monday the 19th, the council.

The Bond Issues.

Not much interest was evidenced in the four bond issues voted on. Quite a few failed to register any choice whatever. All the issues passed with the exception of the one proposing to build a fifty thousand dollar city that Clovis was not quite ready for this expenditure. The water works sale. SOLDIER PRESIDENTS

The soldier presidents of our country may be divided into two classes the first embracing those who were piected wholly or at least largely because of their military service. It begins with Washington, "first in war, first in peace, and first in the hearts of his fellow citizens." Following him came General Jackson, whose brilliant victory at New Orleans made him a hero of the day, and enabled him to defeat John Quincy Adams for a second term. William Henry Harrison had won renown by several victories over the Indians, ending with his defeat of Teeumsch. "Log cabin and hard eider" contribfuted to his popularity. He died a month after his inauguration.

General Taylor was fresh from the Mexican war, and his laurels gained there enabled him to win the presidency over so able and popular a man as Lewis Cass. He died sixteen months after his inauguration.

General Grant was the must conspicuous soldler who was elected solely because of his military record. He had never taken part in polities, nor held a civil office.

The second class of soldier presidents includes those who had reen service in war, but whose record contributed little or nothing to their election. Monroe took part in the Revolutionary war, holding the rank of major, and was wounded at the battle of Trenton. He was not elected president until thirty-three years after the close of the war. Pierce was a brigadier general in the Mexican war, and was injured by the falling of a horse. His service did not contribute much toward his election,

Hayes had a fine record in the Civil war, rising to the rank of brevet major general. But he served two terms in Congress, and was three times elected governor of Ohio, and his civil record gave him his chief strength. Garfield, Benj. Harrison and McKinley all served in the Civil war, but awed their election to their political record. Roosevelt's part in the Spansh war contributed indirectly to his omination and election.

The soldiers who were candidates, out failed of election, were General Scott in 1852, General McClellan in 1864, and General Hancock in 1880. The total number is fourteen, including the three classes.


