Some Aspects of the Farmers' Problems

By BERNARD M. BARUCH

(Reprinted from Atlantic Monthly)

Now, what is the farmer asking?
Without trying to catalogue the re-
medial measures that have been sug-
gested in his behalf, the principal pro-
posals that bear directly on the im-
provement of the distribution and mar-
keting relations may be summarized as
follows:

First: storage warehouses for cot-
ton, wool and tobacco, and elevators
for grain, of sufficient capacity to meet
the maximum demand on them at the
peak of the marketing period. The
farmer thinks that either private cap-
ital must furnish these facilities or the
state must erect and own the eleva-
tors and warehouses.

Second: weighing and grading of
agricultural products, and certification
thereto, to be done by impartial and
disinterested public inspectors (this is
already accomplished to some extent
by the federal licensing of weighers
and graders), to eliminate underpay-
ing, overcharging, and unfair grading,
and to facilitate the utilization of the
stored products as the basis of credit.

Third: a certainty of credit sufficient
to enable the marketing of products
in an orderly manner.

Fourth: the Department of Agricul-
ture should collect, tabulate, summa-
rize and regularly and frequently pub-
lish and distribute to the farmers full
information from all the markets of
the world, so that they shall be well
informed of their selling position as
buyers now are of their buying pos-
ition.

Fifth: freedom to integrate the busi-
ness of agriculture by means of con-
solidated selling agencies, co-operating
and co-operating in such way as to
put the farmer on an equal footing
with the large buyers of his products,
and commercial relations to other
industries.

When a business requires specialized
talent, it has to buy it, and the farmer
wishes to get it; it would be reasonable
to let him do so. It is reasonable to
allow him to buy it in the form of
machinery and other equipment
of his products. If he wishes to
however, he would be wise to do
short of that. Public interest lies
opposed to all great integrations in
justice, though they be forbidden to
the farmer and permitted to others?

The corporate form of association can-
not now be wholly adapted to his ob-
jects and conditions. The looser co-
operative form seems more generally
suitable. Therefore, he wishes to be
free, if he finds it desirable and feasible,
to resort to co-operation with his
fellows and neighbors, without run-
ning afoul of the law. To urge that
the farmers should have the same lib-
erty to consolidate and co-ordinate
their peculiar economic functions,
which other industries in their fields
enjoy, is not, however, to concede that
any business integration should have
legislative sanction to exercise monop-
oly power. The American people
are as firmly opposed to industrial as-
tempted by rural or by urban industry.

For lack of united effort the farmers
as a whole are still marketing their
crops by antiquated methods, or by no
methods at all, but they are surrounded
by a business world that has been
modernized to the last minute and is
tirelessly striving for efficiency. This
efficiency is due in large measure to
big business, to united business, to
integrated business. The farmers now
seek the benefits of such largeness, un-
ion and integration.

The American farmer is a modern
machinist, and he has made vast
strides in recent years in scientific
tilage and efficient farm management,
but as a business in contact with other
businesses agriculture is a "one horse
show" in competition with high po-
tentialities. The American farm-

the greatest and most intrusable of
individualists. While industrial pro-
duction and all phases of the huge com-
mercial mechanism and its myriad ac-
cessories have articulated and co-ordi-
nated themselves all the way from nat-
ural raw materials to retail sales, the
business of agriculture has gone on in
much the one man fashion of the back-
woods of the first part of the nine-
teenth century, when the farmer was

still sufficient and did not depend upon
or care very much what the great
world was doing. The result is that
the agricultural group is almost as
much at a disadvantage in dealing with
other economic groups as the jay furni-
shers of the funny pages in the hands of
sleek urban confidence men, who sell
him acreage in Central Park or the
Chicago city hall. The leaders of the
farmers thoroughly understand this,
and they are intelligently striving to
integrate their industry so that it will
be on an equal footing with other busi-
nesses.

As an example of integration, take
the steel industry, in which the model
is the United States Steel Corporation,
with its iron mines, its coal mines, its
lake and rail transportation, its ocean
vessels, its by-product coke ovens, its
blast furnaces, its open hearth and
Bessemer furnaces, its rolling mills, its
tube mills and other manufacturing
processes that are carried to the high-
est degree of finished production com-
patible with the large mass it has
built up. At this is generally conceded
to be to the advantage of the con-
sumer. Now does the steel corporation
inadequately supply agricultural
products to the market? On the contrary, it is
so true that it is frequently a dominating
influence, as is often the case with other
large organizations. It is master of
its distribution as well as of its produc-
tion. If prices are not satisfactory
the products are held back or produc-
tion is reduced or suspended. It is not
compelled to send a year's work to the
market, but can get under such circum-
stances.

It has one selling policy and its own
import department. Neither are the
grades nor qualities of steel determin-
ed by the caprice of the buyer, nor does
the latter hold the scales. In this sin-
gle integration of the steel corporation
is represented about 40 per cent of the
steel production of America. The rest
is mostly in the hands of a few large
companies. In ordinary times the
steel corporation, by example, stabilizes
all steel prices, if this is practicable
and fair prices are essential to solid
and continued prosperity why would
it be wrong for the farmers to utilize
central agencies that would have simi-
lar effects on agricultural products?

Something like that is what they are
aiming at.

SPECIAL MEETING OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, HELD DECEMBER 19, 1921.

The Board of County Commissioners
of Valencia County met in special
session December 19th, 1921. There
were present Hon. Daniel Lucero,
chairman of the board, Hon. Selso Lo-
bato, member, Hon. Joseph F. Tondre
sheriff and A. A. Gutierrez, County
Clerk.

The minutes of the previous meet-
ing were read and approved.

The board being in order of busi-
ness the chairman of the board an-
nounced the purpose of the meeting which
was to find out the best course to be
pursued in meeting the payment of ex-
penses for the quarter ending Decem-
ber 31st 1921. As there are several
outstanding claims against the county
and according to the County Treasur-
er there is no money available to pay
these claims. The county treasurer re-
presented by Mr. R. Pohl his deputy
appeared before the board and pre-
sented an opinion of the District At-
torney in regard to bonds in the amount
of \$300.00 of the former Leonard
Wood County and said opinion is sub-
stantially as follows:

Los Lunas, New Mexico, December
19, 1921. Hon. Manuel P. y Chavez
Treasurer of Valencia County, Los
Lunas, New Mexico.

Dear Sir:

In reply to your inquiry regarding
the \$300.00 in bonds of the former
Leonard Wood County of this
State which you have been holding as
an asset of the County of Valencia
Fund will say that in my opinion it is
proper for these bonds to be sold and
the proceeds thereof credited to the
General County Fund.

I note that these bonds bear interest at
the rate of five per cent per annum
and are due and payable in October
1923 and I think it is important that
in disposing of these bonds no agree-
ment be made to the county.

It appears from your books that
you have several thousand dollars in
your interest and sinking fund and
that you will not be called upon to
meet any substantial payment from
this fund before 1929. The money in
this fund is bringing the county in in
trust only the rate allowed by law
from the depository banks, except of
course such of the fund as you already
have invested in government bonds.

I believe therefore that it would be
legal under such circumstances and
desirable from the standpoint of the
county to carry these Leonard Wood
County bonds in the interest and sink-
ing fund rather than dispose of them
by sale. They will be due and payable
only paid long before the fund is need-
ed.
