June 15, 1962

The Regents of the University met at 2:30 PM on Friday, June 15, 1962, in the Council Room of the New Mexico Union.

Dr. Wilkinson asked for any changes in the minutes of the meeting of May 2, 1962. It was suggested by Mr. Roberts that the first sentence in the third paragraph of the third page be changed from ". . . the chairmen of the various legislative committees . . ." to ". . . the chairmen of the Education and Finance committees . . ." It was then moved by Mr. Roberts, seconded by Mrs. Brandenburg, that the minutes be approved as amended. Carried.

Dr. Reginald H. Fitz, Dean of the Medical School, reported to the Regents on the current status of planning in connection with the new school. Dean Fitz stressed the complexity of the numerous relationships to be considered -- with related disciplines at the University; clinical and teaching facilities such

as the Bernalillo County-Indian Hospital and the Veterans Administration Hospital; the Los Alamos Scientific Laboratory and possibly the Sandia Corporation; the medical profession; and the various city, county, state, and national health agencies. He said, too, that in present planning there must be kept in mind the possibility of later needs such as a four-year curriculum, a dental school, a University hospital, and a psychiatric hospital.

With regard to the location of the initial building of the Medical School, Dean Fitz pointed out that it should be readily available to existing related programs at the University and also to the Bernalillo County-Indian Hospital, which can be considered a \$6,000,000 asset, including the adjacent Indian tuberculosis sanatorium. Access, parking areas, and space for future development would be other site considerations, he noted. He said that the geographical center of the new structure should be its library, which would serve local physicians and health agencies as well as the Medical School and would therefore receive a measure of outside financial support.

The dean said that the size of the first building -- an estimated 150,000 to 160,000 gross square feet (110,000 net) -- would be predicated on the School's departmental structure and the scope of the faculty's teaching responsibilities. Slides exhibited by Dean Fitz indicated that there would be departments of anatomy, physiology, biochemistry, microbiology, pathology, pharmacology, and clinical and behavioral sciences, possibly organized in divisions, and that persons in the following categories would receive instruction: medical students, graduate and postdoctoral students, interns and residents, and other university students. In addition, there would be a program of continuation education for practicing physicians.

Dean Fitz pointed out that a person of stature, in order to consider a position as departmental head, must be promised a staff of at least five full-time persons, with approximately five additional research workers for each person on full time. The latter, he said, would be financed by outside sources, but space for them must be provided. In other words, he noted, there would be a full-time faculty of approximately 40 to instruct the 100 students enrolled in the two-year school.

A third slide exhibited by Dean Fitz divided the work program into five major phases: phase I -- policy and analysis (early 1962); phase II -- functional and space program (mid-1962); phase III (physical planning) -- site master plan (1962-63), architectural schematics, preliminaries, contract drawings and specifications (1962-63), bidding (1963), equipment (1962-65); phase IV -- construction (1963-65); and phase V -- occupancy and activation (fall, 1964).

The dean informed the Regents that the program is presently on schedule but that some "go-ahead" signals are urgently required: (1) A decision is needed concerning the land north of the Bernalillo County-Indian Hospital; (2) site studies must be approved; and (3) funds of approximately \$1,500,000 from the University (in addition to what is already on hand from the Kellogg Foundation) must be committed so that matching funds may be sought from the Government. (1/1 funds are presently available from Health Research Facilities Construction Act, and there is a good possibility that a 2/1 matching fund program will soon be available.)

It was moved by Mr. Roberts, seconded by Mrs. Brandenburg, that the University attorney be authorized to prepare the necessary papers for the acquisition of approximately 7.8 acres of land north of the Bernalillo County-Indian Hospital, such papers to be ready for submission to the Regents at the July meeting. Carried.

Dean Fitz reminded the Regents that a planning consultant, Lester Gorsline, and an architect, W. C. Kruger, have already been retained, and he asked for permission to start preliminary architectural studies. President Popejoy noted that preliminary plans must be approved by the Board of Educational Finance and the State Board of Finance before any commitment of fees to an architect, and he said that pre-preliminary plans are generally requested as the first step.

It was thereupon moved by Mrs. Brandenburg, seconded by Mr. Roberts, that the architect be requested to proceed with pre-preliminary plans and that the planning be carried out under normal University procedures, i.e., in consultation with the Academic Vice President and the Master Plan Committee. Carried.

Dean Fitz said that it appeared that the annual operating budget of the new school would eventually total from \$1,500,000 to \$2,000,000, with the state furnishing \$5-600,000 and the balance coming from research and other non-University sources. Planning research space is essential, he said, for without research facilities it would be impossible to recruit teaching faculty. In this connection, he commented that the school would have unique opportunities in the areas of socio-cultural medical studies and radio-biology, and that these factors should be instrumental in attracting faculty to the Medical School.

President Popejoy said that it had been customary procedure for a number of years to transfer any excess of income over expenditures in the current funds budget into the plant funds budget at the end of each fiscal year. The last audit report, he said, suggested that this be done by formal motion of the Regents. In accordance with this suggestion, therefore, it was moved by Mr. Roberts, seconded by Mrs. Brandenburg, that the transfer of surplus be so made. Carried.
