Mr. Jaramillo said that the Report by President
Administration, responding to a Jaramillo
request from the Regents, is working
on a proposal relative to the General College. This will be brought
to the Regents in April and all interested parties are invited to
attend that meeting.

Jaramillo stated that for over a year the Regents have been studying methods and procedures regarding presidential searches and have now reached a decision as to how such a search may best be accomplished for UNM. The Regents have received advice and input from several constituencies and have agreed to conduct a nationwide search in order to seek out the best possible person to lead the University of New Mexico. This will not be a political appointment, but will be an open search in compliance with affirmative action guidelines. Mr. Jaramillo asked for full and complete support from all university constituencies in order that a successful search may be conducted. He then read the following motion:

#### I HEREBY MOVE:

That a search be conducted for the next President of the University of New Mexico in accordance with the process described as follows:

- 1. A nationwide search will be conducted in accordance with applicable Affirmative Action principles.
- 2. The search will be conducted so as to protect the integrity of the process and the rights of privacy of the applicants.
- 3. Public announcement concerning the progress of the search will be made by the President of the Board of Regents from time to time.
- 4. Advertising and recruitment will begin in the near future and the process is expected to be concluded approximately June 30, 1984.
- 5. A consultant will be retained to assist the Board of Regents with the work of the search, screening and interviewing.
- 6. The Board of Regents will act as a committee to conduct the search. The faculty, administrators, staff, students, and alumni and other interested persons are encouraged to nominate qualified candidates.
- 7. The screening of applicants will be conducted by the Board of Regents with the assistance of the consultant.
- 8. Interviews will be conducted by members of the Board of Regents. Public interviews are not planned. The Regents will call upon members of various constituent groups to assist with interviews.

- 9. Prior to final selection, the Regents will invite members of the various constituent groups to provide an unranked assessment of the finalist candidates. The final selection will be made by the Board of Regents.
- 10. When the Board of Regents have agreed upon the person to be selected, the President of the Board of Regents is authorized to negotiate a contract of employment and will be responsible for making the public announcement of the selection.

The motion, seconded by Dr. Martinez, carried.

Carried.

Mr. Van Dorn Hooker, University Budget for Engineering/ Architect, explained that UNM Science Center originally applied to the Board of Educational Finance for funding at the level of \$12,498,000 for construction of the Engineering/Science Center. The BEF staff then reduced the figure to \$9.9 million which was appropriated by the legislature. After much study and consultation it was determined that it would be impossible to meet that budget without cutting space and if the space were reduced the building could not serve the purpose for which it is intended. Therefore, the administration would like for the Regents to approve an increase in the budget for a total of \$12,700,000 which would allow the square footage requested when the building was first programmed. The University has received \$300,000 from the Centers of Excellence for development of the microelectronic portion of the facility. If the Regents approve the \$12,700,000 budget, it must again be submitted to the BEF.

It was moved by Mrs. Jourdan, seconded by Dr. Martinez, that the Regents approve a budget of \$12,700,000 for the Engineering/Science Center. Carried.

Mr. Jim Wiegmann, Budget Director, explained the 1983-84 budget revisions for the main campus, UNM Hospital/BCMC, and Gallup Branch as further detailed in the agenda.

Skills Laboratory Facility at the Los Alamos Branch (UNM Project 328). Jaynes Corporation submitted the low bid of \$490,417 for the base bid and two alternates. Approval was obtained from the Regents via telephone in December and they are requested to ratify that action.

Partners, presented sketches of the
revised design for the Management/Social Sciences Building. Mr.
Brown said that, as suggested by the Regents, the corners have been rounded, more texture has been added to the surface, and the windows have been redesigned. He thanked the Regents for their timely suggestions, and said that members of his firm agreed that the new

design was more appropriate for the UNM Campus.

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Carroll Lee, Associate Vice

President and Comptroller, said that
disposition of computer equipment
required only the approval of the Regents and he asked William
Walden, Associate Vice President for Computer Services and
Information Systems, to explain the need for disposing of the
equipment as listed in the agenda.

Dr. Walden stated that computers become obsolete in approximately three years, that usage increases by 30-35% per year, and that maintenance cost on obsolete equipment increases drastically. Until a few years ago, UNM did not have state-of-the-art computers.

Mr. Lee explained that UNM will request bids from those institutions that can use the obsolete equipment.

Dr. Paez asked Vice President Walden to report to the Regents in two or three years about plans for computer equipment.

It was moved by Mrs. Jourdan, seconded by Dr. Martinez, that the Regents approve the disposition of the computer equipment as described. Carried.

\* \* \* \* \* \*

Mr. Lee said that the <u>Disposal of Surplus</u> remaining items of surplus property are mainly vending equipment ready for disposition by sealed bid. A walk-in freezer is the only item with a current sale value of over \$500 and will require State Board of Finance approval.

It was moved by Dr. Martinez, seconded by Dr. Paez, that the Regents approve the disposition of surplus property as described. Carried.

Mr. Van Dorn Hooker reminded

the Regents that some time ago they
had approved the design for a bus
shelter and landscaping on the corner of Girard and Central.

This project is a joint venture with the City of Albuquerque. Mr. Hooker introduced Mr. Howard Caplan, chairman of the City Art Commission, who said that the Art Board had allocated \$50,000 for a major piece of sculpture which would bring identity to the corner. The Board, upon the recommendation of a jury, selected a piece by Mr. William Drexel and Mr. O.K. Harris. Mr. Harris presented the design of the sculpture to the Regents. The piece will be a 20-foot high arch made of 3/16 inch nickel-plated chrome steel. Like a sundial, the arch will chart the sun's course through the day and shafts of light through regularly spaced slits will mark the correct hour on a grid on the ground below.

It was moved by Dr. Martinez, seconded by Dr. Paez, that the Regents approve the design as presented. Regents Jourdan and Maloof felt that the sculpture did not fit into the architecture of University, and voted against the motion. Dr. Martinez and Dr. Paez voted for the motion, and Mr. Jaramillo broke the tie by voting for the sculpture. The motion carried.
