## THE CARNEGIE PEACE TEMPLE

**It Is to Cost One and a Half Million Dollars.**

### POSTOFFICE IN MISSOURI IS ROBBED

**The Proprietors of the Denver Post Plead Guilty and Paid a Fine.**

Washington, April 25.—Before sailing for Scotland, Andrew Carnegie donated \$1,500,000 for a temple of peace for the permanent court of arbitration at The Hague. The gift was made through Baron Gevers, the minister of The Netherlands, and was made with the understanding that Holland will be responsible for its administration.

#### Postoffice Robbed.

St. Louis, April 25.—Three men blew the safe in the postoffice at Ferguson, a suburb of St. Louis, at 2:30 this morning, and secured \$120 in cash, \$18 in stamps, and escaped after a running battle with citizens, led by Mayor Reed, in which many shots were exchanged, but no one was injured.

#### Plead Guilty and Fined.

Golden, Colo., April 25.—Messrs. Tamm, Schroeder, Sadler and Thomas appeared before Judge De France this morning accompanied by their attorneys. Tamm, Schroeder and Sadler plead guilty to the charge of embezzlement and were fined \$100 and ordered to serve one day in jail. In the case of Judge Thomas the court accepted a nolle prosequere. All the cases pending against the four defendants were at once dismissed. This finally settles the cases which have been in court for the past two years.

## THE COLORADO

**Launching of the Big Fighting Cruiser at Philadelphia.**

### DINNER GIVEN TO SENATOR DEPEW

**The Prominent New Yorker the Guest of Montauk Club in Brooklyn.**

#### KING EDWARD VII AT NAPLES.

Philadelphia, April 25.—The new cruiser Colorado, to be launched here today, is an armored cruiser of the first class. Coupled with her tremendous battery power, she has the speed of the ocean liner.

The vessel is 520 feet long, 59 feet 6 inches wide, with a draught of 24 feet 6 inches. Her speed requirement calls for 22 knots an hour for four consecutive hours. She is fitted with twin screws, twin triple expansion engines, which must develop 23,000 indicated horse power. All the armor is of the most improved Krupp type.

The fighting force of the Colorado is centered principally in two batteries. She will carry a main battery of four up-to-date 8-inch and fourteen 6-inch rapid fire rifles; a secondary battery of eighteen 4-pounders and twelve 3-pounders and a supplemental force of eight 1-pounders, two field pieces, two machine guns and six automatic guns for service on the bridges and in the tops. The 8-inch guns are designed to fire once every fifty seconds, and the 6-inch guns are expected to fire three times a minute. The contract price was \$3,780,000.

#### The Launching of the Cruiser.

Philadelphia, April 25.—The armored cruiser Colorado was launched today at Cramp's ship yard in the presence of a distinguished gathering of officials from Washington and the state of Colorado, including the entire congressional delegation. Miss Cora May Peabody, daughter of Governor Peabody, of Colorado, broke the bottle of wine on the prow of the cruiser as she glided down the ways at 12:35 and into the Delaware river. Miss Peabody was escorted to the christening stand by Charles H. Cramp, president of the Cramp shipbuilding company, and the fair sponsor was followed by her father, Governor Peabody, Mrs. Peabody, James C. and Miss Jesse Peabody. Among the guests from Colorado were Mrs. Wright, wife of Mayor Wright, of Denver, and her daughters, one of whom, Roberta, recently christened the cruiser Denver; Mr. and Mrs. Roberts, Mr. and Mrs. J. A. Steinmetz, Mr. and Mrs. J. B. Grant, Mr. Grant, Judge O. E. Lefevre and Mrs. Lefevre, Mr. and Mrs. A. L. Welch, ex-Governor Thomas and Mrs. Thomas, Mayor Weaver and other Philadelphia officials were among those invited.

New York, April 25.—The annual dinner of the Montauk club of Brooklyn in honor of the birthday anniversary of Senator Chauncey M. Depew, takes place at the club house tonight and preparations for the event, it is said, have been made on an elaborate scale. Senator Depew's birthday was last Thursday, but it is the custom of the club to hold the dinner on the Saturday night following.

The Depew dinner is always a unique affair and is a popular event with Brooklyn clubmen. The guest of the evening is the only speaker, and the birthday cake always comes in the nature of a surprise. #### King Edward at Naples.

Naples, April 25.—King Edward was enthusiastically greeted upon his arrival in Naples today, en route to Rome and Paris. The town and harbor were astir early. Immense crowds assembled along the bay front, and rounds of cheers mingled with the British national anthem and salutes from the harbor ships and land batteries as the royal yacht Victoria and Albert neared shore. The bay presented a striking spectacle, owing to the great gathering of war and merchant ships, dressed from stem to stern in rainbow fashion. After the exchange of salutes the royal yacht was boarded by the civic and military dignitaries of Naples who officially welcomed his majesty. Later in the day the visits were returned by King Edward. The king will remain here until Monday when he will proceed to Rome.

#### Wage Scale Rejected.

Philadelphia, April 25.—Local unions affiliated with the brotherhood of carpenters and joiners of America, have rejected the compromise offered by the master carpenters relative to the new wage scale to go into effect May 1. It now seems probable that unless the latter agree to the demands of the brotherhood before next Friday a general strike will be ordered and 15,000 men will stop work.

### A JEWELRY THIEF.

**Nabbed, With the Goods, Last Night in This City.**

#### WILL BE TAKEN TO LAS VEGAS.

Henry B. Hill, a good looking and demure youth of 18 summers, who says his home is in Richmond, Va., was arrested at the station last evening on the arrival of No. 1 from the east. During the latter part of the afternoon Chief of Police McMillin received several telegrams from Chief of Police Curtright, of Las Vegas, telling him that Hill was on his way to this city with a bunch of jewelry that he had stolen at the residence of J. E. Lewis in that city on Thursday night. Special Officer Barton found Hill on the front car, and he submitted to arrest without a murmur. In his handkerchief was found a lady's small watch, several pins and rings and other small jewelry notions. He was taken to the jail and locked up for the night.

This morning a Citizen representative saw him and he was feeling pretty bad over his predicament. He said he left his home in Richmond about two weeks ago and was bound for Los Angeles, where he was going to work for an uncle who was a plumbing contractor. He had about \$32 when he stopped off in Las Vegas, where he fell in with bad company and gambled and drank his money up.

In a semi-intoxicated condition he formed the friendship of a young man who was also broke, and together they tried several back doors on Thursday evening. At the Lewis residence they found the door open and he went upstairs into a bedroom and collared all the jewelry in sight. His friend meanwhile waited on the porch, and he took one lady's gold watch as his share for acting guard. Hill said he was a printer by trade, and this was the first time he had ever been in trouble; that his father, who was an old man about 80 years old and formerly a Baptist minister, would be badly grieved if he heard of his troubles. Hill's grief was genuine and he asked what would be done with him, for he said he was guilty. He said the skeleton keys found in his handkerchief bag were given him by his friend in crime.

Sheriff Romero, of San Miguel county, who is in the city on official business, will take Hill to the Meadow City this evening.

#### Disabled Oil Steamer.

New York, April 25.—The Standard Oil steamer Maverick, from Port Arthur, Texas, was reported shortly after noon today off the Highlands, bound in, towing the steamer City of Everett, belonging to the same company. The City of Everett left here April 22 for Port Arthur with the Standard Oil barge No. 32 in tow.

## THE PRESIDENT IN NEBRASKA

**The Sabbath to Be Spent in Grand Island.**

### MAD MULLAH'S FORCES SLAUGHTERED

**America's Cup Defender, the Reliance, is Given a Trial Spin.**

Lincoln, Neb., April 25.—President Roosevelt will become the guest of Nebraska at 4:40 this afternoon with the arrival of the special train at Alliance. General Culver and a special reception committee, on behalf of Governor Mickey, will welcome the party to the state.

#### President's Train.

Gillette, Wyo., April 25.—The president's train arrived here at 9 o'clock this morning and remained about ten minutes while the crowd was addressed briefly by the president.

#### Made a Speech.

Norwalk, Wyo., April 25.—President Roosevelt made a thirty minutes' stop here today. His train arrived at 11:30 a. m. and left at 12 o'clock for Edgemond. The president was escorted to a stand near the station, where he made an address. The stand was handsomely decorated and the pathway was strewn with flowers.

#### President in Nebraska.

Alliance, Neb., April 25.—The first day of the president's tour after his two weeks outing in the Yellowstone country lay through a mountainous and picturesque country and it was not until after the Nebraska state line had been crossed that the tourists were greeted with the familiar sight of little groups of waving watchers stationed at the cross roads and straining their eyes to catch a glimpse of the chief magistrate as the train whisked by. No stops were made during the day except those necessary to replenish the water and fuel of the engine. This point was reached on scheduled time this afternoon and a brief stop was made to change engines. Without unnecessary delay the journey was then resumed toward Grand Island, where the party will spend Sunday.

#### To Spend Sunday at Grand Island.

Grand Island, April 25.—Grand Island is donning her best bib and tucker in honor of President Roosevelt and his party who are scheduled to spend Sunday here. After the president has been formally welcomed to the city he will be left free to enjoy the day as he desires. It is expected that he will attend church in the forenoon and if the weather is favorable, take a gallop through the surrounding country in company with Senator Dietrich. Senator Dietrich and probably Senator Millard will join the presidential party here and remain with it to the end of the Nebraska trip.

### THE PRESIDENT'S BLANKET.

**The Navajo Squaw, Elle, Starts Work on It.**

Judge Baker was at the Harvey curio rooms this morning and brought the design for the president's Navajo saddle blanket. The loom for the Navajo squaw, Elle, who is to weave it, was marked off as much as possible so that the work for her will be somewhat easier. Elle had done some little work on it up to this noon. The inscription that will be on it has again been changed so that the original one of Judge Baker's will be woven. It will read:

Honorary

This souvenir will be presented to the president by some member of the Commercial club at the club quarters.

### SLAUGHTER OF AFRICANS.

**British Troops Defeat the Forces of the Mad Mullah.**

Aden, Arabia, April 25.—Brigadier General Manning, after an engagement with the Mad Mullah's forces, has relieved Colonel Cobb, near Gumburru, Somaliland, forty-five miles westward of Galadi. About 2,000 of the Mullah's men were killed. The British loss is not known.

#### America's Cup Defender.

Bristol, R. I., April 25.—The new cup

defender, The Reliance, was given her first trial sail today. The weather was not all that was desired, there being only a light breeze from the west, but as the run was mainly to give her builders a chance to look over their finished workmanship, there was wind enough.

#### Kentucky T. P. A.

Paducah, Ky., April 25.—The Kentucky division of the Travelers' Protective association is in a highly flourishing condition, to judge from the large and representative attendance at the state convention in session here. The day was occupied almost entirely with the transaction of business relating to the affairs of the association and tonight there will be a wind-up of festivities arranged by the Paducah members of the organization.

#### Miners Won a Victory.

Stockton, Cal., April 25.—The Amador miners' strike has been settled and the miners have won quite a victory. At a meeting last night between representatives of the mine owners and representatives of the miners' union an agreement satisfactory to all sides was reached. The agreement affects all the mines which were concerned in the strike and takes effect immediately. The miners will begin work at once, but it will take a couple of weeks to get the mills in shape again.

### DISTRICT COURT.

**A Suit for Taxes Engaged Attention of Court This Morning.**

#### OTHER PROCEEDINGS.

The court this morning tried the case of the territory against Nathan Barth, suit for taxes for the years 1901 and 1902. The assessments made by Mr. Barth were for the years 1901 and 1902, and were made on the basis of one-third of the market value of his real estate, and on the basis of owning the Mexican grade of sheep at \$1 per head. The assessor raised the valuation of the real estate to about one-half its market value and assessed the sheep as graded sheep at \$1.50 per head. The case was tried by the court without jury. The court struck out two mules, one horse, one wagon and three burros and a musical instrument which the assessor assessed, on the testimony of Mr. Barth that he did not own them. The court also allowed the assessment of the real estate as made by Mr. Barth to stand, on testimony being given that it is the general custom of owners of real estate in this city to assess their property at about one-third its actual value. The court reduced the assessment of the sheep to the figures as returned by Mr. Barth, at one dollar per head, although Mr. Barth testified that his sheep were graded, but on evidence that other owners of graded sheep only paid on the basis of \$1-per head, the court allowed the assessment at \$1 per head to stand. The territory sued for \$1,224.65 and the amount recovered was \$633.65.

Carmel Montoya and Felicitia Montoya have filed papers with District Clerk Dame against Lucero Montoya, administrator of the estate of Juan Maria Montoya, claiming that they should receive the sum of \$5,205, which administrator collected from the government on Indian depredation claims. It is claimed that he has only turned over \$100 of the entire amount.

The Co-operative Building and Loan association of this city has filed papers for the foreclosure of a deed of trust against Samuel R. Otero and Anna M. Otero, heirs at law of Fanny J. Otero, deceased.

Frank Sturges confessed judgment of \$33.53 this morning for back taxes on lots 1 and 7 in block 26 of the original town of Albuquerque, since March of 1899. This case was allowed to be brought so as to make the title clear.

Carrie Nation announces that she will do no more saloon smashing. The saloon men have been liberal purchasers of Carrie's little hatchet, and after all it was only money Carrie wanted. She achieved notoriety by smashing saloons and now on the strength of her notoriety she is selling hatchets to the saloon men.

The decision of Postmaster General Payne that postmasters seeking political preferment must resign their positions in the department will meet with general approval. The neglect of duty by postoffice officials in caring for their political fortunes has long been a curse to the department, and the postmaster general will deserve the commendation of the country by stopping the abuse.

### COST OF BOER WAR.

That the British taxpayer may know what the South African war has cost, the Daily Telegraph of London has taken the trouble to compile figures which show the total liabilities of the United Kingdom now amount to \$4,000,000,000, as compared with \$3,175,000,000 in 1899. By a simple operation in subtraction the cost of placing the British ensign over the Boer republics is found to be \$825,000,000. All of this immense sum cannot be credited to the budgets for war, but a great deal of it undoubtedly may be traced to conditions caused by the conflict.

This estimate places Great Britain next to France, which is at the top of the list of European nations when they are assembled for comparison of national debts, and relegates Russia to third place, with Austria-Hungary and Italy following in the order named.

### RIO GRANDE DAMS.

The El Paso Herald says that the time is ripe for a conference, to be participated in by representative El Pasoans and New Mexicans, to arrive at an understanding with regard to the problems of storing the flood waters of the Rio Grande, so that such action as may be undertaken at the seat of government may be done in harmony, which alone can bring success. The fight has continued too long already. Many of our people fully understand the fundamental points of the problem. The Herald says:

"Conditions have changed in the last few years, through the educating of public sentiment in the east, and notably among the members of the national legislature, upon the questions of irrigation in the arid west. They have changed in the enactment of the new irrigation law, one of the most important measures put upon the statute books of the nation since the purchase of the Louisiana domain from France. It is time the various elements that have been in conflict in this valley should come together and plan to secure some of the benefits of the new conditions they have helped to create. 'The most practical solution of the whole difficulty is for the government

to condemn the Elephant Butte property, pay the private company suitable damages, and build a great reservoir at that point under the provisions of the new irrigation law, modified to suit the necessity. It will be time taken to take up the matter of the construction of a reservoir here, and the equitable distribution of the waters between Mexico and Texas.

"If the reservoir at Elephant Butte could be so adapted as to provide ample and regular supply of water for irrigation purposes on both sides of the river below this city, then, under proper government restrictions, that plan would suffice. If it should become necessary to store the waters of the river anew at this point, in order to secure a regular and adequate supply, then the government of the United States, having the entire system of river reservoirs under its control, could build such a structure and establish such regulations as would meet the necessities of the case, state and international."

### FOREIGN IMMIGRATION.

The number of immigrants arriving in this country last year was 648,000. This was the largest figure since 1882, the only other year that has surpassed last year was 1881. It is apparent, therefore, that the immigration movement this year bids fair to eclipse anything that the country has ever known. The rate of arrival this year indicates an excess of probably one-third over the figures of last year. That would give 1882 a close call, if it does not exceed it.

Fears are expressed about the number of foreigners coming to the United States. The 789,000 who arrived in 1882 are no longer thought of as a menace to our institutions. Their children are growing up quite thoroughly with the affairs and customs of the country. The original immigrants are lost in the great American civilization. So it will be with the rest. We have here a population now of probably 80,000,000. To add to that number in a year 800,000 foreigners is to put one new-comer down in a body of 100 people. That is not enough foreign blood to cause any alarm. The fact that the foreign element has been absorbed without difficulty so far is enough to show that it will be absorbed again by the more populous and busy country.

### YOUNG MEN'S CHANCE.

James J. Hill, president of the Great Northern railroad, and regarded as one of the greatest of business men in an age of industrial and commercial giants, had a few significant words for the young man the other day.

"The young man of the proper make-up can put himself in any position he wants," said Mr. Hill. "There are more chances than ever, but the man must be honest, quick and think and act in the same breath. There is a growing demand for young men of ability."

Mr. Hill's views do not differ materially from the views of other successful men who look over the field today and compare the chances of success with the chances met by themselves. A few months ago ex-Secretary of the Treasury Lyman J. Gage told Denver young men that no young man of honesty and ability need despair of finding a position at the top of the ladder, as the supply was far below the demand, according to his actual experience. Mr. Hill merely adds to the burden of proof when he declares the chances of the young man to be better today than ever before.

The significant words of the acknowledged leaders of the country's activity should not be lost on the young man who is at the foot of the ladder today and who is inclined to despair of ever reaching the top. The hearty encouragement of such a man as James J. Hill ought to put new life into many a youth who is inclined to lag at the beginning of the race. It

A supplementary circular has just been issued by the El Paso & North-eastern, announcing the discontinuance of the Golden States limited after April 30. Nothing could be more enjoyable than a fifteen-minute drive from the city, over the hill and across the mesa, breathing the light fresh breeze that is like unto an inspiring gentle gale from the ocean waters. The appetizing supper that is placed before the city visitor would satisfy the particular taste of any king, prince or other powerful personage. It is especially adapted to the taste that is acquired by living in the high altitude and the land of continual sunshine.

The large revolving windmill, the irrigation lake, and air free from all impurities, appeal to the artistic tastes of the visitor. Many people have already taken advantage of the opportunities afforded by this summer home on the mesa.

## BACK FROM BELEN.

Civil Engineer Ross Has Returned to the City.

City Engineer Pitt Ross, who has been devoting several months past to surveying and platting the new townsite of Belen, returned to his home here this morning.

He states that his work at Belen is almost finished. Only a few outlying additions to the townsite are as yet undone and requires but a few weeks to do them.

The Santa Fe yards there are laid out and the plat has been filed at Santa Fe. They are quite extensive, including close to 100 acres. Beginning a short distance north of the Santa Fe cut off spur from Belen west, the yards, 800 feet in width, extend south

about two miles gradually decreasing in width to 600 feet. The south extreme of the yard is several hundred feet below the east spur of the Santa Fe cut off, which crosses the Rio Grande. The vastness of the yards would indicate that the Santa Fe intends making some extensive improvements at Belen.

Mr. Ross will return to Belen on Tuesday.

The Sultana was a transport in the packet service which ran between Vicksburg, Miss., and Cairo, Ill. It left Vicksburg on the night of April 23, 1864, and reached Memphis on the morning of April 28, and left there for Cat Island and when near there the boiler on the boat exploded and the craft was burned. Over 1,500 people lost their lives, among them being over 1,200 soldiers who were returning from southern prisons, where they had been confined. The survivors of the catastrophe have maintained the organization many years, though of late the ranks have been so thinned by death that the membership now is very small.

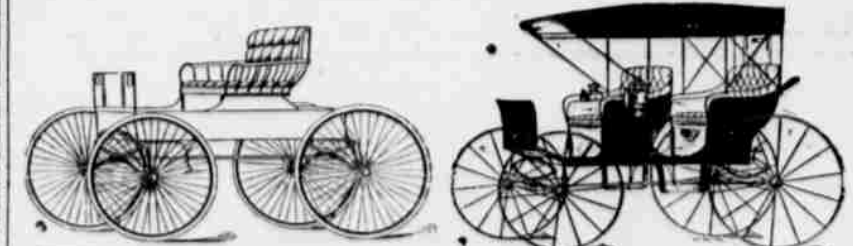

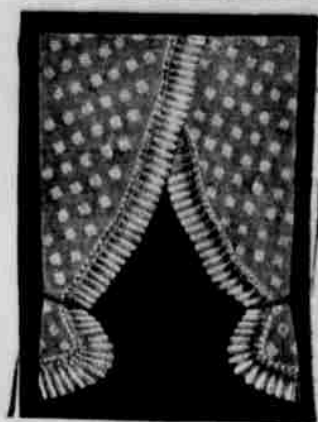

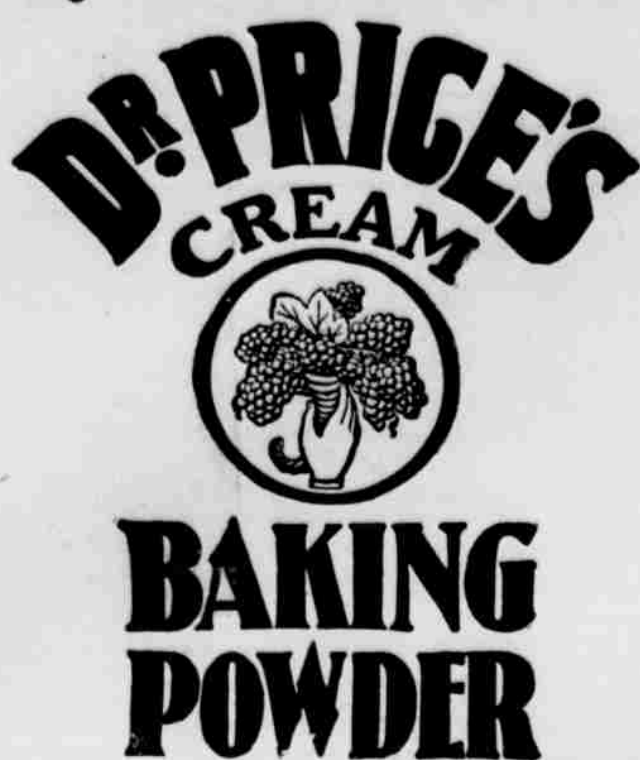

## INDIAN SCHOOL NOTES.

A teachers' institute of the day school workers is now in session at this institution. The attendance is good, as there are representatives from all the schools in the district. The institute is being conducted by Supervisor Wright, who has charge of this school. He is a very enthusiastic worker and has done much of this kind of work in the Dakotas.

Yesterday morning the visitors spent the time in inspecting the work being done in the various rooms of the literary department and in the afternoon they took up the regular work of the institute. Fannie J. Dennis, of Paraje read a paper on "How to Secure Attendance at Day Schools."

Mrs. N. A. Cook, of this school, read a paper on "Practical Arithmetic," and Miss M. E. Disette, supervisory teacher, gave an interesting talk on "Some Signs of Progress in Public Day Schools."

The evening session was spent in listening to a short but interesting program rendered by the pupils of this school, after which J. W. Travis, principal teacher, read an interesting paper on "Mexicans in Indian Schools," and Miss Ethel E. Gregg, teacher at Santa Ana, gave a paper on "Day School Gardens."

## Early Times of Albuquerque

Contributed by an Old-Timer

As far back as mythology takes us upon the subject of Lynch law at A. D. 1526, it teaches that James Lynch, the mayor of Galway, Ireland, had occasion to pass the sentence of death upon his own son who had been convicted of murder. The friends of the son were numerous, and as is characteristic of the people of that nation, sympathetic. Particularly so with the unfortunate, and who is more unfortunate than the poor devil who can see his immediate finish in a manner ignominious and violent. The neighbors of the Lynch boy massed for his rescue with the intention of aiding him to foreign terrestrial post, rather than to a celestial one. Knowledge of this coming to his father, he being beyond a doubt a righteous upholder as well as an expounder of the law, had his son brought home and saw that he was properly executed by hanging him from a window of his own castle.

We are also told that Lynch law is of American origin; that in the early days of our history there lived in the frontier of our colonies in Virginia a most upright man named Lynch, to whom, because of the distance to courts of law, was referred the settlement of all disputes and questions of right and wrong. His judgments were followed by immediate execution. In the one case we have the properly constituted court putting aside the law and as a civilian enforcing it. In the other, the civilian by common consent assuming judicial functions, and his judgments enforced by the people.

Whether the name Lynch law originated 377 years ago in Ireland, or 118 years ago in this country, it is true that man has been subject to violent death at the hands of a mob of his fellow man since the time of Christ to the present.

In the history of Albuquerque, from its foundation twenty-three years ago, there has been but two lynchings, one in triplicate and one single, both in punishment for the one crime. How it becomes known to a body of men that they are about to come together at a certain time, and within a limited time, for purposes of their own, can only be conjectured. All seem to know of it, none speak of it, yet at that appointed time and without a variance of ten minutes between the first arrival and the last, eighty men were with in the enclosure of an adobe corral on Main street in Old Albuquerque on the night of January 31, 1881. Few words were spoken, and those by but one. A column of two soon formed itself, and a light stepping march was being taken along Railroad avenue, passing Post's hotel through Shanker alley to the old town jail. This was an adobe building with massive porches in front and formed three sides of a square. Upon the east a large single room with grates inside and solid outside doors; this the jail proper. Upon the south was a court room and upon the west a living room of the jailer and his family.

Four men at the jailer's door when he appeared in response to a knock asked for the keys and went inside while procuring them. Leaving a guard they crossed the square, opened the jail and entered to return in a moment, leading at the end of a rope, with a noose around his neck, California Joe. Placed between two pillars of the porch, he was questioned as to his knowledge of the murder of Colonel Potter. He knew nothing, the other men did it. His rope was thrown over the porch rafter and Joe wilted, going to the ground in a heap. A second visit to the jail room and Miguel Herrera appeared, he being placed between adjoining pillars, and replying to questions confessed his presence at the murder, but that Marino Leiba had committed it. Again to the jail and Escolasto Perea was between adjoining pillars and answering questions. Yes, they all fired at Potter, but Leiba killed him. California Joe was not there, but he furnished the guns for all but Leiba. Yes, they tried to burn the body of the dead man, and afterwards buried it. Over the porch rafter the ropes had been placed and at the word all three were suspended, Joe from his collapsed position on the ground and the others from standing positions. Ropes ends were made secure to the pillars and three humans were suffering the judgment of the Lynch court. The bodies swayed slightly, but without any repulsive or convulsive movements. There was no contortion of the face; no evidences of pain or horror. After a few moments suspension there commenced a contraction of the muscles of the arms and legs. The forearms were gradually raised until the crossed hands reached the height of the shoulders. The legs were simultaneously drawn up, until they were as completely doubled as possible. Then came a gradual relaxation, until the bodies hung limp. These movements lasted possibly two minutes. There were no gasping nor gasping. The eyes remained open, the mouth closed and the face retained its lifelike expression.

So passed three of the Potter murderers. They had had three months' freedom, and would have taken more had not the people decreed otherwise. It is often a long legal step between the commission of a crime and execution, but in the court of Lynch there is but short shift between detection and execution. There is another difference: In one case you are given a six foot drop from the noosed end of a legal string; this gives a man a severe jar into eternity. In the other case

you go into eternity by being quietly and easily lifted in.

The last execution under Lynch law occurred February 21, 1881, the victim being Faustino Gutierrez. It was at the same place, under like circumstances, and for the same crime as the former lynching. Pinned upon the breast of the victim was this card: "Assassin Col. Potter; hanged by 601."

Santos Domingo was at that time county jailer and he resigned at once, giving as a reason that a mistake might be made some night, and he himself hung, and that he would take no more chances.

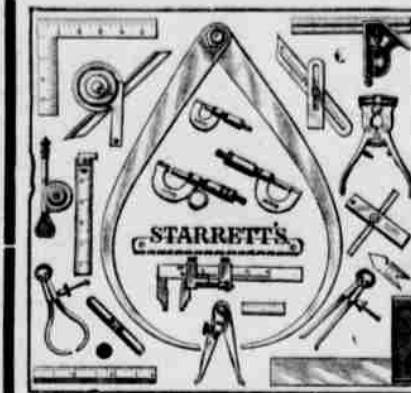
