1.0% Inflation In June

On July 9, the Banco de Mexico (central bank) reported that the consumer price index rose 1.0% in June, bringing the accumulated rate for the year to 9.1%. The June rate was the lowest for the month in 15 years. The average monthly rate for the first half of 1991 was 1.51%, compared to an average 1.1% per month projected by President Carlos Salinas de Gortari's economic team for the year. Purchasing power of the minimum wage declined by 8.3% in the first half of 1991. The minimum wage is 11,800 pesos per day (slightly less than US\$4).
