

 At its April 25, 2000 meeting, the Senate approved changes to The Policy on Time Limit for Completion of Degree. The time limit for completion of a Masters degree was changed from 5 years to 7 years, with no exceptions, effective Fall 2000. At today's meeting, in order to solve many issues facing the Office of Graduate Studies for those students who are close to graduation, the Senate voted unanimously to retain the change "from 5 years to 7 years", but to

change the effective date for with no exceptions from "Fall 2000" to "Fall 2001". A concern was expressed that faculty salary inequities within departments need to be addressed. A situation in Austria regarding defamation by a Political Science professor for expressing his views has raised concerns on infringements of academic freedom for academics around the

world. A resolution regarding this issue will be introduced at the Senate's next meeting. It has been rumored there is an initiative in process to cut back on the Regents' contribution to health insurance premiums for retired faculty and staff. It was suggested that the Faculty and
