Honduran Trade Delegation Travels To Soviet Union

On August 18, a Honduran trade delegation left for the Soviet Union to complete bilateral cooperation agreements, according to sources in Tegucigalpa. The mission consisting of several government officials and private businesspersons is headed by Economy Minister Reginaldo Panting. Panting told reporters that Honduras expects to export sugar, coffee, cigars, palm oil and bananas, among other items. Priority imports from the USSR are fertilizers and industrial raw materials. The trade mission marks the first time that a Honduran delegation will have visited the Soviet Union. Diplomatic relations do not exist between the two nations. After completing the trade agreements in Moscow, the Honduran mission is expected to travel to Czechoslovakia for similar negotiations. (Basic data from PRENSA LATINA, 08/18/87)
