## \$4.813 Billion Trade Deficit, First Half 1991 (s/s)

According to a report issued Aug. 14 by the Banco de Mexico (central bank), the trade deficit for the first half of the year totaled \$4.813 billion, compared to \$1.642 billion for the same period in 1990. Export revenues in January-June 1991 came to \$13.503 billion, a 17.2% increase over the \$11.525 billion figure for the first half of 1990. Import spending (including insurance and freight charges) totaled \$18.317 billion and \$13.168 billion, respectively.
