According to an Aug. 6 report by the Mexican government's international news service Notimex, the Environment and Urban Development Secretariat (SEDUE) ordered the partial or total shut-down of 13 plants in the Valle de Mexico for violations of environmental protection codes. Two of the 13 were completely closed down due to the absence of required pollution control equipment, and failure to obtain operating licenses.
