On Aug. 28, Colombian Coffeegrowers Federation president, Jorge Cardenas Gutierrez, told reporters in Bogota that some 80% of the world's coffee-exporting nations have expressed interest in reestablishing export quotas. The issue will be discussed by member nations of the International Coffee Organization (ICO) Sept. 21 in London. Colombian coffee export revenues for 1987 are estimated at \$1.6 billion.
