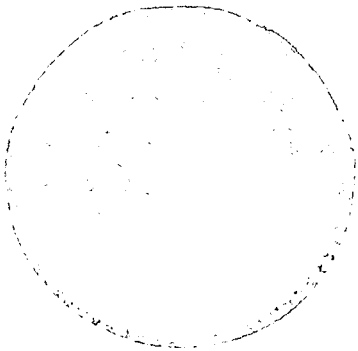

CONTRIBUTORS

From the age of fourteen, when she found and copied her great-grandmother's memoirs, JUANITA BROOKS has continued to find time for this interest during an active and responsible life. In the 1930's, as area supervisor for the Historical Records Survey of the WPA, she began the collection and transcription of pioneer Utah manuscripts which was continued under the auspices of the Utah State Historical Society and the Rockefeller Foundation. She is the author of many articles on Mormon history and culture, and in 1950 the Stanford University Press published her study of *The Mountain Meadows Massacre. A Mormon Chronicle: The Diaries of John D. Lee, 1848-1876*, which she edited in collaboration with Robert G. Cleland, was published by the Huntington Library in 1955. Her biography of Lee, *John Doyle Lee: Zealot, Pioneer Builder—Scapegoat*, appeared in 1963.

Mother and daughter, RITA and JANALOO HILL live at the ghost town of Shakespeare which the Hills acquired for a ranch in 1935. Rita's immediate interest in collecting information from old-timers came to be shared by her daughter, who has searched written records in New Mexico, Arizona, Texas, and New York City in the hope of shedding further light on the old stories and legends.

GERTRUDE HILL, now Special Collections Librarian, Charles Trumbull Hayden Memorial Library, Arizona State University, Tempe, has also served as Librarian at the Museum of New Mexico Library and the New Mexico State Library, Santa Fe. She has published articles in various Southwestern periodicals.
