THE LEGISLATURE.

Council Wrangle Over Division of Grant County.

NUMBER OF BILLS INTRODUCED.

When the council assembled at 10 o'clock yesterday morning Mr. Hughes moved to go into committee of the whole for the purpose of considering council bill No. 53 the Luna county measure. Motion failed. Mr. Easley raised the point that the Hinkle compromise substitute bill on the subject was properly before the council as an unfinished business, and not the original bill. The chair announced the parliamentary status of the two measures, ruling that the two were on equal footing, but that the substitute had prior right of way at this stage. On motion of Mr. Easley the Hinkle substitute was called forth for its third reading, 7 to 5, those in the negative being Messrs. Burns, Harrison, Hughes, Martinez and Springer. Mr. Fielder addressed the council. He opposed the division of Grant county, but of the two bills the substitute was in his opinion much fairer toward Grant county than the original measure.

Mr. Spies agreed with Mr. Fielder that the original bill menaced the best interests of the citizens of Grant county, and considered the substitute a fair and just measure. Mr. Hughes stated that the subject of county division had constituted a disturbing element in legislative circles for six years, and he thought it time to tackle the matter and settle it definitely, and for all time. Mr. Easley stated that the substitute bill had been practically agreed upon by the parties most concerned, and he advocated its passage. Mr. Harrison expressed the opinion that the substitute had been brought forward with a view to killing off the original bill. President Chaves called Mr. Cruikshank to the chair and made a vigorous speech, saying he hoped the matter would now be taken up and finally determined, as the people of Grant county had been fighting it over for years and he thought Silver City and Deming should be divorced. On the motion to pass the Hinkle substitute the vote was 6 to 6, Messrs. Burns, Harrison, Hughes, Cruikshank, Martinez and Springer in the negative. The same vote developed on a motion to table indefinitely the original bill. Mr. Hughes presented an amendment to the substitute bill providing that the governor, auditor and solicitor general shall ascertain the proportion of debt to be assumed by the new county, and changing the boundary lines so as not to include so large a part of Grant in the new county. Mr. Springer offered a substitute for the Hughes amendment to the effect that all territory now covered by Luna county and taxed for existing debts. This was adopted, and the house, after hearing the first section of the Hinkle substitute read a third time, took a recess to 2 p. m.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

At 2 p. m. when the council met, Mr. Martinez moved a reconsideration of the vote by which the Hinkle substitute for council bill No. 53, the Luna county bill, failed to pass at the morning session. Motion prevailed by a vote of 7 to 5. The bill was then placed on its passage, and passed, 7 to 5, and on motion of Mr. Fielder the matter was clinched by reconsidering that vote and laying same on the table indefinitely. The following new bills were introduced and referred:

Council bill No. 105, by Mr. Hinkle, to repeal chapter 60, session acts of 1899, relating to the sale of coal and its products and abolishing the coal oil commission after May 1, 1901.

Council bill No. 106, by Mr. Cruikshank (by request), to protect laborers of New Mexico; prohibiting the employment of laborers brought into New Mexico by coal, railroad construction and stone quarrying corporations. Mr. Fielder moved the passage of the bill. Mr. Hinkle moved its reference to the committee on territorial affairs. So ordered. Adjourned to 10 a. m. today.

HOUSE.

The running at large of "twine and bogs" was the first subject to occupy the attention of the honorable members of the house yesterday morning. The debate coming on Mr. Trujillo's bill, house bill No. 32, to prevent such animals from running at large. The bill passed, 14 to 8, after a lengthy and sometimes humorous debate.

Mr. Barnes moved to reconsider the vote by which house bill No. 108, regulating the practice of osteopathy, passed Monday, desiring to recall the same for a slight amendment. Mr. Abbott said without the proposed amendment the bill would not amount to much. Mr. Dales said he opposed the bill Monday, and was glad it had become involved in difficulties. The house refused to suspend the rules.

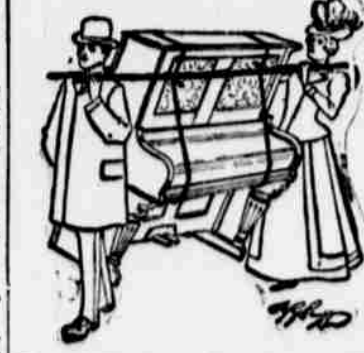

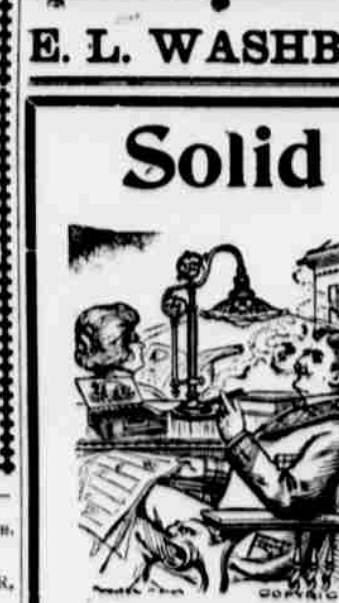
