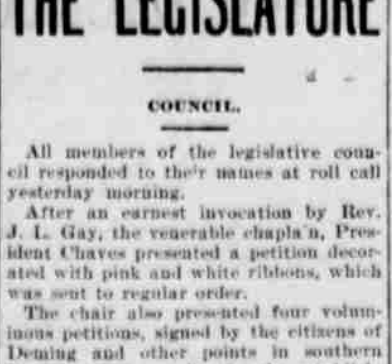

COUNCIL.

All members of the legislative council responded to their names at roll call yesterday morning.

After an earnest invocation by Rev. J. L. Gay, the venerable chaplain, President Chaves presented a petition directed with pink and white ribbons, which was sent to regular order.

The chair also presented four voluminous petitions, signed by the citizens of Denning and other points in southern Grant county, praying for the establishment of the new county of Luna.

The chair said there were, he had been informed, others yet to come on the same subject.

On motion of Mr. Hughes the petitions were referred to the committee on county and county lines.

Mr. Crickshaw introduced council bill No. 75, an act to provide for the protection of fish and for other purposes, which was read in full and referred to the committee on appropriations and finance.

By Mr. Burns, council bill No. 76, to amend the revenue laws of New Mexico referred to committee on finance.

President Chaves, by request, introduced council bill No. 77, revising sections 285 to 306 inclusive, the Bateman law, authorizing the issuance of county, municipal or school district bonds to finance the construction of public buildings, which was read in full and referred to the committee on appropriations and finance.

The pink and white ribboned petition was then read, and proved to be an appeal from the citizens of Albuquerque, members of the German Lutheran congregation, praying the assembly to pass council bill No. 67, suppressing houses of ill repute in cities. Mr. Harrison presented a similar resolution from the Masters and Wardens of Temple Lodge A. F. & A. M.; referred to the committee on internal improvements.

Mr. Fiedler called up house bill No. 152, making corrections in the measure recently passed relating to terms of court in the third and fifth districts, and the same was passed.

The finance committee reported adversely on council bill No. 56, and the same was adopted and the bill killed. It was an act to amend section 12, chapter 96, acts of 1890, and provided for paying probate clerks \$50 per annum for preparing jury lists.

Council bill No. 59, fixing the time for terms of court in the fourth judicial district, was called up by Mr. Spies, considered and duly passed.

The council then took up council bill No. 39, an act relating to evidence, introduced by Mr. Spies, and the same was explained by that gentleman. Mr. Fiedler regarded it as a radical departure from the present method of procedure. Mr. Spies supported the measure, saying, as an illustration, that if a man transfer his property to his wife with a view of defrauding his creditors, the burden of proof as a matter of right and justice should be upon that man, and he thought New Mexico needed such a law. After some discussion the adoption of the report of the committee was reconsidered, and the measure was sent back to the Judiciary committee.

House bill No. 29, Mr. Read's bill relative to the water rights of Indians, amending section 1876, Compiled Laws, as to the manner of the old law regarding the use of water by the Pueblo Indians, came up on a favorable report by the committee on agriculture. Mr. Martinez and Mr. Hughes spoke on the importance of the measure. Mr. Fiedler declared the bill gave the Indians prior right to the use of all waters flowing through their pueblos, regardless of the amount they had appropriated. Mr. Spies and Mr. Martinez thought the exception was well taken, and on motion of Mr. Spies the bill was amended and passed. Messrs. Easley and Fiedler in the negative. Adjourned to 10 a. m. to-day.

HOUSE.

Mr. Barnes, by unanimous consent, called up house bill No. 132, providing for the payment of school teachers monthly when there are funds in the treasury and the same passed.

Council bill No. 28, Mr. Burns' road bill, was taken up on motion of Mr. Abbott, and the house went into committee of the whole to consider it. A long discussion followed regarding the amendments, and Mr. Martinez moved the committee rise and the bill be referred to the committee on roads and highways. Motion prevailed.
