Thos. O'Brien, the first baseman of the Pittsburgh National league baseball club, died at Phoenix, Arizona, Tuesday from pneumonia. He was a sick man when he came to Phoenix a few days before his death.

Advices from Dawson state that all mining claims in the Klondike will be held by the crown, with the exception of some involved in litigation and others reserved for compensation, will be thrown open on February 26 for staking.

A divorce has been granted to Francis Selby from Mary Selby. The parties to the proceedings are the parents of Norman Selby, the prize fighter, who is known as "Kid" McCoy. Mrs. Selby, on the stand, said she did not believe in the marriage relation.

Dr. Harrison's amendments to the present returning law for municipalities and counties is all right and the house ought to pass it. It will enable counties and municipalities to refund their present indebtedness at a rate of interest and will save money to them.

Proceedings are being instituted against Mr. Chas. Wright, editor of the South African News, at Cape Town, for criminal and obscene libel, contained in a letter over the non-compliment, "British Officer," which said General Kitchener secretly instructed his troops to take no prisoners.

A new series of 19 counterfeit notes have been put in circulation. They are described as "money" and are reproductions of the \$10 notes issued by the Comptroller of the National Bank of the United States, check letter S, treasury number T337976, check No. 1061, bank number 394, series of 1882.

The annual report of the commissioner of patents shows that during the past year there were issued in Colorado 27 patents, being one to every 1,941 inhabitants. In Wyoming seventeen patents, being one to every 5,448 inhabitants, and in New Mexico nine patents, being one to every 21,711 inhabitants.

The New York Evening Post, under date of yesterday, says: "It was reported on Wall street that a lunch had been encountered in satisfying some minor interests of the Carnegie Steel company which threatened to delay closing the negotiations. Some of Carnegie's associates said, as far as they could see, no provision had been made for them. This dissatisfaction related, among others, it was said, to Henry C. Frick, whose relations with Carnegie have been strained for some time. The minor element is powerful enough to impose formidable opposition to carrying out the new scheme if not satisfied with the contract."

MILITIA ORGANIZATIONS.
 The strength of state militia organizations was reported to congress this week by the secretary of war. Colorado has one general officer, thirteen staff officers, seventeen regimental officers, fifty-four company officers, 823 privates, 141 non-commissioned officers, twenty-three musicians, 28a privates, total strength, 507.

Wyoming has eight regimental officers, twenty-one company officers, fifty-eight non-commissioned officers, thirteen musicians, 22a privates, total, 522.

J. A. Forehand was permitted to adopt a minor child, Romague Shanks, aged 8 years.

The following justices of the peace bonds were approved, viz: Juan Mondragon, precinct No. 1; Daniel Mondragon, precinct No. 2; Plutarco Nunez, No. 3; Juan Ojeda, No. 4; Salvador Armijo, No. 5; Severino Crotchet, No. 12; H. B. Ribble, No. 24.

CORONER'S JURY.
Inquest Held Over Remains of Abel Sedillo, Dead Cattle Thief.

KILLING WAS JUSTIFIABLE.
This morning, at 10 o'clock, Judge A. J. Crawford impaneled a jury and held an inquest over the remains of Abel Sedillo, the ruffian who was fatally wounded by the deputy sheriffs on last Wednesday morning. The jurors examined the dead body and then heard the evidence in the case. Arian and Leopoldo Contreras, of La Jota, testified that they traced the cattle from the ranch of their sister to the Indian pueblo of Iteia, and later identified several brands of cattle which had been stolen.

The next witness was Marcelino Abella, a native of Iteia, who testified that he had purchased two head of cattle from Sedillo on February 24th, for which he gave \$15, and at the same time received a bill of sale for same. Benjamin Williams, the deputy sheriff, was then sworn in and placed on the witness stand, and he made the following statement: On the evening of the 5th inst. I was handed a warrant for the arrest of Claude Doane, who was charged with horse stealing, and in company with Harry Cooper, started out to locate the man. In the morning, about daylight, we concealed ourselves and horses in a barn on Smith's ranch, and shortly after two men on horseback rode past the barn. Mr. Smith and Deputy Sheriff Maguerito Barera were in the residence at the time, and signalled to me and Mr. Cooper that the smaller man of the two horsemen was Doane. By this time the men had come to a standstill at a gate, and I called to them to surrender. Doane was on the ground in the act of opening the gate, and readily responded to the command by throwing up his hands; but the mounted horseman reached for his Winchester and had removed it from its scabbard on the ground, when we began firing on him. When the shooting started the horse began to pitch and run, and all the time Sedillo was attempting to raise his rifle to fire, but six arrows, N. E. Stevens, foreman, E. H. Quake, A. Kuhlman, Wm. O'Leary, R. W. Hopkins and Will Menta.

Deputies Cooper and Barera both rendered testimony and corroborated the statements of Mr. Williams, after which the following verdict was rendered by the jury:
We, the undersigned Justice of the peace and jurors, sitting as an inquest on the remains of Abel Sedillo, who died in prison, No. 13, Bernalillo county, on January 6, 1901, and that deceased came to his death from gunshot wounds inflicted by bullets shot from rifles in the hands of Ben Williams, Harry Cooper and Maguerito Barera. We further find that said shooting was justifiable.

Signed—J. A. Crawford, Justice of the peace; N. E. Stevens, foreman; E. H. Quake, A. Kuhlman, Wm. O'Leary, R. W. Hopkins and Will Menta.

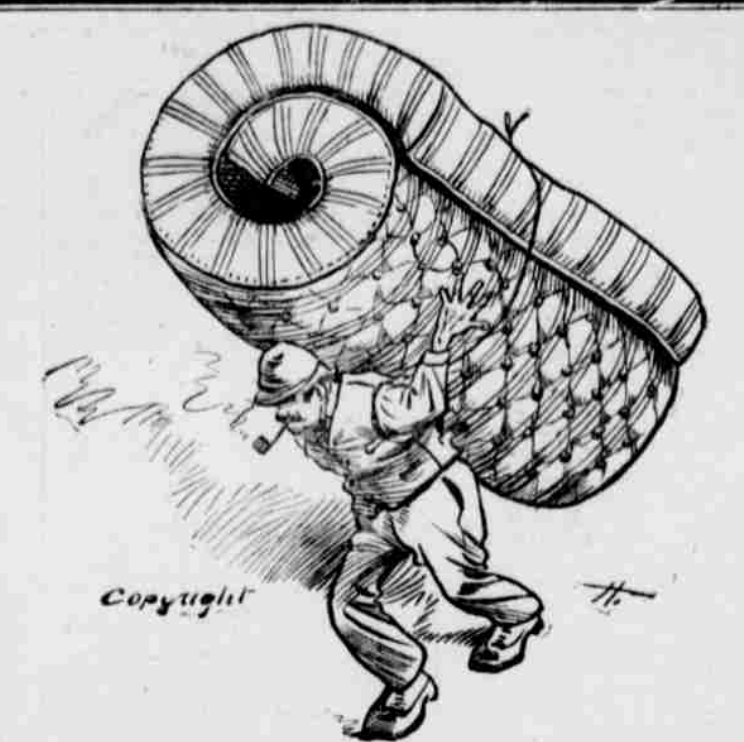
