OFFICIAL NOTES.

BOARD OF EQUALIZATION.
 The board of equalization has fixed the valuation of railroad property, telegraph and telephone lines, sleeping cars, live stock, banking and other stock and lands.

INCORPORATIONS.
 The Meadow City Mining company has filed incorporation papers in the office of Secretary Wallace. The incorporators are: H. C. Pittenger, of East Las Vegas; Captain, \$10,000; Edward Hutton, Paul George, E. C. Abbott and H. C. Brown have filed incorporation papers for the Bankers' Toll Road company, which will construct a toll road four and a half miles long from Red River City in Taos county to several mining properties. Capital, \$2,000.

SHEEP GRAZING ON FOREST RESERVES.
 Superintendent of Forest Reserves I. B. Hanna has received an order from the department of the interior prohibiting sheep grazing on the Black Mesa forest reserve in Arizona. The commissioner of the general land office, Hon. Binger Herman orders: "Enforce the prohibition against sheep grazing on the Black Mesa forest reserve. The order will be enforced on all the remaining reserves as soon as the investigation in respect to them is concluded. Thus far grazing has been positively prohibited upon the Gila, the Pecos and the Black Mesa reserves in Superintendent Hanna's jurisdiction, which covers New Mexico and Arizona."
