## RED SOX SPRINT IN EIGHTH AND DEFEAT BROWNS

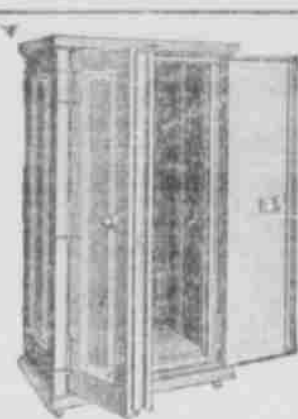
