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# What's New in New Mexico

## AGUILAR IS NOT INDICTED UPON MURDER CHARGE

Forgery Indictment Only One Laid at Door of Former Employee of John K. Larkin, of Santa Rosa.

(SPECIAL CORRESPONDENCE TO MORNING JOURNAL)  
East Las Vegas, N. M., Oct. 2.—The grand jury has returned a no true bill in the case of Luis Aguilar, charged at a preliminary hearing with the murder of John K. Larkin, a Vaquero, rancher, in June, 1914. Forgery was the extent of the indictment of the jury, which Aguilar was arrested for in an indictment that he had more fully signed the name of Larkin to a bill of sale for a horse. The animal was found in Aguilar's possession after the disappearance of Larkin and he explained that the latter had sold it to him.

Aguilar was an employee of the Larkin ranch, and when his employer dropped from local news he stated that Larkin had told him that he intended to go to El Paso to purchase livestock and might be called to New York. This, Aguilar stated, was the sum of his knowledge in the matter. Aguilar was found to be wearing a suit of clothes that formerly belonged to Larkin, and officers said he gave conflicting stories as to how they came in his possession.

**Death Not Proved.**  
Inability on the part of the state to convince the jury of the death of Larkin, it is said, was responsible for the return of the no true bill. In the preliminary hearing of L. A. Larralde, attorney for Aguilar, stated that his client could not be held for the murder of a man not proved dead.

At 1:30 o'clock on Friday morning the jury in the case of Noah and Hugh Daniels, accused of the murder of J. A. Tatum near Santa Rosa late last May, returned a verdict of guilty of manslaughter in the case of Hugh and of not guilty in the case of Noah. Tatum was killed during a dispute between the men in one of Tatum's fields where the Daniels were said to have been herding sheep. Hugh, according to his story, stated that he had shot to save the life of his brother, upon whom Tatum was advancing with an open knife.

Guilt was the verdict returned by the jury in the case of Juan Valdez, accused of cattle stealing. Eighteen months to three years in the state penitentiary was the sentence given by Judge David J. Leahy.

**Argue Local Option Case.**  
Nelly Cuswell and Noy Owens, boys of fifteen years, pleaded guilty to charges of larceny from dwellings in Port Sumner. They received terms of not less than eighteen months and not more than three years in the reform school at Springer.

Arguments in the Santa Rosa local option election contest began Friday afternoon and were expected to be closed before noon today. Upon the result of this case depends whether Santa Rosa will remain wet, according to the result of the election of September, 1914, at the dry territory.

An indictment has been returned against Enrique Baca, charging him with criminal assault.

## NO COURT FUND LEFT IN OTERO FOR FALL TERM

Porter Trial at Las Cruces Uses Up Practically All Available Money; to Try Smith in Alamogordo.

(SPECIAL CORRESPONDENCE TO MORNING JOURNAL)  
Alamogordo, N. M., Oct. 2.—There will be no October term of the district court in Otero county this year. This is the decision of E. L. Meiler, presiding judge of the district. The decision is due to the fact that the county is without adequate funds to hold a term of court, rather than to a lack of business to transact.

At the beginning of September the court fund contained only \$2,000 and the Porter case, which recently was concluded at Las Cruces, having been settled there on the state's motion for a change of venue, cost more than \$2,000. There are now in the county jail six prisoners who have been levied over to the grand jury and are unable to make bond, while a seventh is under indictment for murder and is held without bond.

It is thought very likely that funds enough will have accrued in the court fund to hold a term next April. The trial of Porter E. H. Smith, under twenty-one indictments growing out of the failure of the First State bank at Otero county, has been transferred to Otero county, under motion for a change of venue. This case will be tried here next April, it is believed.

**May Establish Bank.**  
Application has been made to the Federal Reserve bank for a charter for the People's National bank, which the petitioners are making an effort to establish in Alamogordo. The capital stock will be \$25,000 and the petitioners are as follows: R. F. Pearson, L. H. Hughes, G. L. Wolfinger, W. H. Reber and W. G. Oldham.

The First National bank, which had been in business about fourteen years, was liquidated and merged with the Alamogordo bank only a few months ago. The reason given by the owners at the time of consolidating the two banks was that there was not enough business in Alamogordo to enable two banks to earn dividends.

**Hermis' Executor Appointed.**  
Clovis E. Aguilar, probate judge, held a special session of court yesterday to appoint an administrator for the estate of Gregory Simmscher, who died on his ranch near Tularosa, not long ago. Simmscher left a hermit's life and left an estate estimated to be worth about \$2,000. Two petitions were before the court, one for the appointment of Father Lucien Migeon, the other for Dr. J. I. Woodman, as administrator. The court compromised by appointing William Rindhy. His bond as administrator was fixed at \$2,000.

F. Miller \$20; E. L. Hewett \$10 and the rest of the expense being borne by Phillips academy and the Museum of New Mexico, about \$2,000 being expended altogether on the work.

RECORD AT CAPITAL

Washington, Sept. 29.—Sun a day without sunshine is the record for September at the United States capital. The average for the month was 85 per cent. The highest temperature recorded was 79 degrees on September 16 and the lowest 56 on September 26. The greatest daily range was only 23 on September 7 and the least 11 on September 29. Since New Year there has been a deficiency of 544 degrees from the normal. The precipitation was 1.62 inches and the greatest precipitation in any twenty-four consecutive hours, 52 on an inch on September 3 and 4. Since New Year there has been an excess over the normal of 2.10 inches in precipitation. The total wind movement was 4,867 miles, an average of only 4.5 miles per hour. The maximum was thirty-seven miles per hour from the southwest on September 17.

PRUSSIA ADMITS  
TOTAL LOSSES OF  
1,916,000 MEN

(BY MORNING JOURNAL SPECIAL LEASED WIRE.)  
Amsterdam, Oct. 2 (via London 9:50 p. m.)—The Prussian casualty lists No. 220 to No. 229, covering the period from September 17 to September 29, give the names of 63,488 men killed, wounded and missing, according to the Nieuws Rotterdamse Courant of Rotterdam. The Courant says that these figures increase the total Prussian casualties to 1,916,000.

The lists from No. 200 to No. 209, amounting to 49,704 casualties, the lists from No. 210 to 219 contained 52,394 names, the lists from No. 220 to No. 229 gave 53,445 names, and the remaining lists as above.

Besides the Prussian lists there have been published 224 Bavarian, 189 Saxon, 274 Wurttemberg, four-nine imperial and four lists of Prussian officers and non-commissioned officers in the Turkish service.

200,000 GERMAN MAY  
FREEZE IN SIBERIA

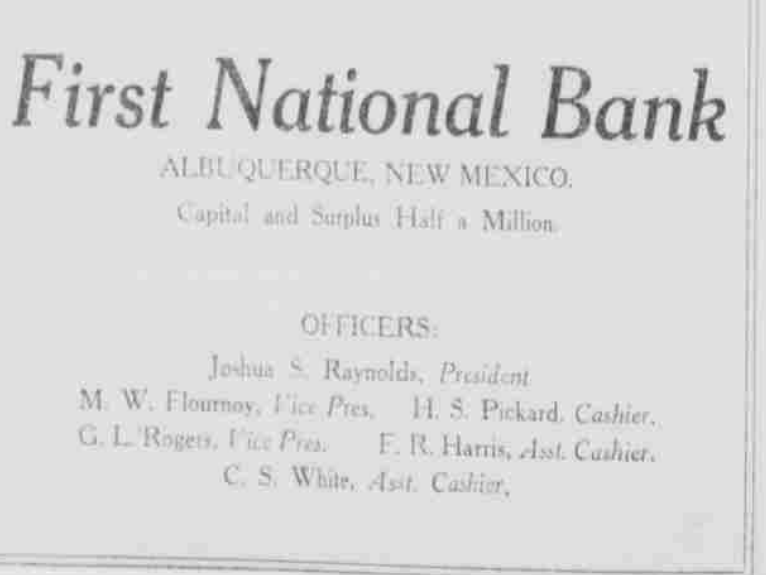

## SENUSSI RISING MAY BE FEATURE OF WAR IN EAST

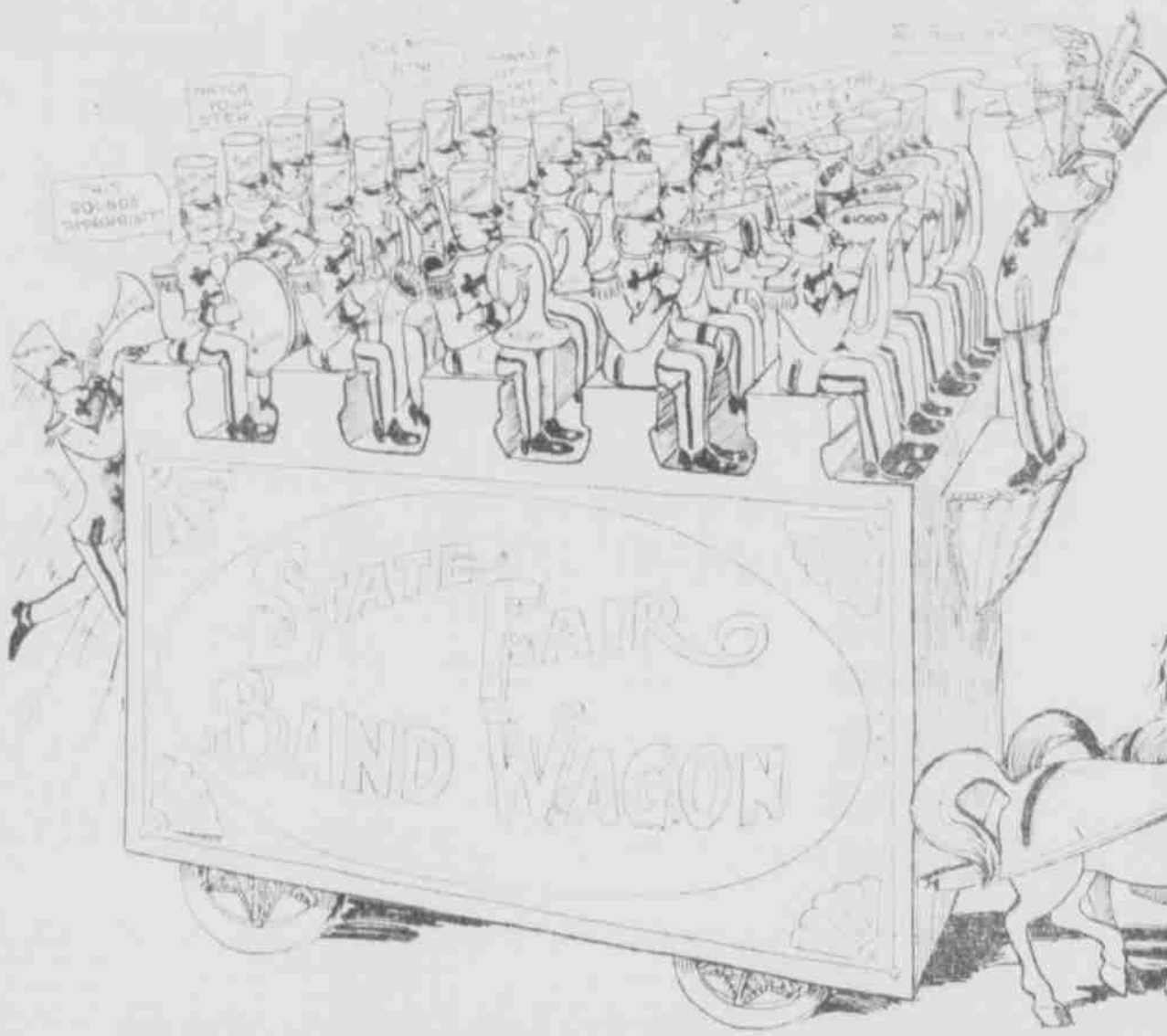

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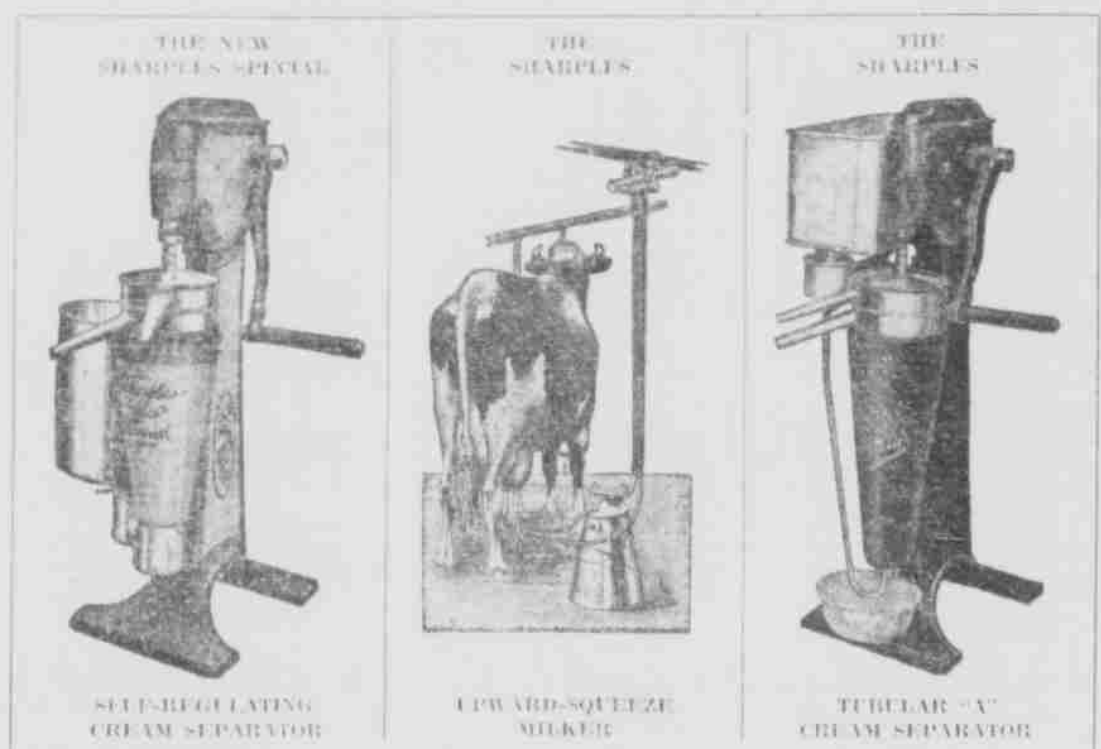

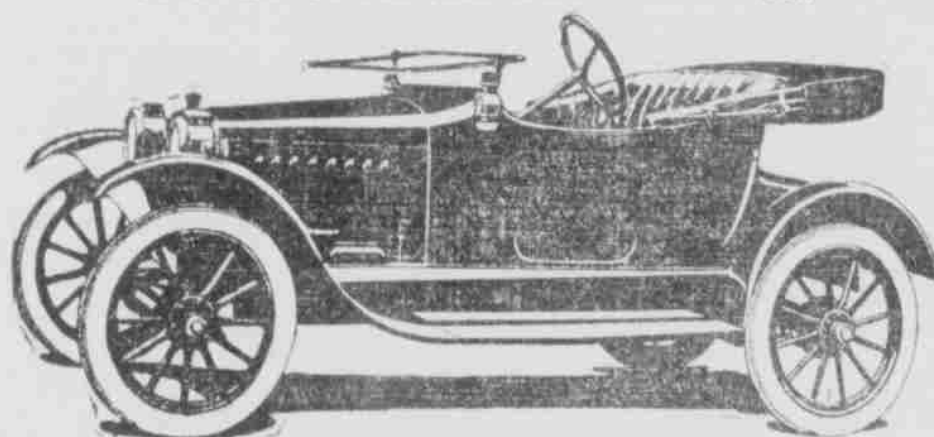
