## JOUBERT DEAD!

### Brave Boer Leader Dies From Disease.

### Boers Are Concentrating at Wyndburg.

### South African Coal Mines are Be- ing Blown Up.

### CONSUL HAY AT KROONSTADT.

Lorenzo Marques, March 28.—General Joubert is dead. Pretoria, March 28.—General Joubert is confined to his bed, seriously ill. [The dispatch from Lorenzo Marques announcing the death of Joubert, it will be noticed, is dated to-day.] Pretoria, March 28.—General Joubert died last night, at 11:30. He had been suffering from stomach complaint. The town is plunged into mourning for a true patriot, a gallant general and an upright, honorable gentleman.

Consul Hay at Kroonstadt. Pretoria, March 28.—United States Consul Hay and secretary have gone to Kroonstadt to make necessary arrangements for United States representation in the Free State. A dispatch from Bloemfontein at Natal announces the destruction of coal mines likely to be useful to the British.

The Dundee colliery has been blown up and the machinery destroyed, and the mine rendered useless for three months. According to a dispatch from Kroonstadt, Commandant Oliver joined General Dyer and Lemmer, who are safe. General Dyer is still sick at Pretoria, but will proceed to the front on Sunday. Trains are frequently leaving with burghers for the fighting line this side of Bloemfontein.

The Standard and Diggers News says it learns that General Oliver, Grobler and Lemmer have arrived at a point, not far north, to relieve all apprehensions of their being cut off. It is expected that they will arrive at Wyndburg in a few days and effect a junction with General Dyer, when the federal troops will formally oppose Lord Roberts.

Pacifying Orange Free State. London, March 28.—The British high commissioner, Sir Alfred Milner, arrived at Bloemfontein last night, and was met by Lord Roberts. Pacification of the Free State and the treatment of insurgents are the subjects of discussion.

General French has occupied the four miles near Bitter, where are considered important acquisitions. General Clements' column entered Paarlsmouth on March 27, having previously occupied Jagersfontein.

Further advices from Mafeking, dated March 16, reiterate that all was well there and that the cordons were not so tightly drawn as the British allowing the natives to pass through the lines, which they had previously forbidden. The bombardment just before the dispatches were sent was unusually vigorous.

A dispatch from Bloemfontein says: "The period of inaction is coming to an end. Troops are being pushed to the front. Transports and stores are being collected. The men are in grand condition, the horses picking up wonderfully." However, reports regarding the influence of a forward movement are so conflicting that they can not be taken as authoritative.

Russian Squadron. St. Petersburg, March 28.—The Russian squadron which recently called at Chemulpo, Korea, has arrived at Port Arthur. It would appear from this that the uneasiness felt at Yokohama in regard to Russia's intentions was not warranted.

Price of Sugar Reduced. New York, March 28.—Archieke Bros. have announced a reduction of five points in the price of all grades of refined sugar. Up to noon no similar move had been made by other refiners.

Repeal of Boxing Law. Albany, N. Y., March 28.—The bill repealing the New York boxing law passed the senate today and now goes to the governor.

The former alleges that the latter extracted ore from the disputed ground of the Pennsylvania mine after having been enjoined last January by the court.

Boer Victory. Kroonstadt, O. F. S., March 27.—Commandant Crowther reports that he has retaken Ladybrand after the British were there an hour.

Death of a Millionaire. Cleveland, March 28.—A telegram received from Baltimore to-day reports the death of W. J. Rainey, millionaire coal and coke operator, at John Hopkins hospital.

Substitute Amendment Defeated. Washington, March 28.—The substitute offered yesterday by Wolcott to Carter's amendment relating to the mining of gold in the sea off the Alaskan coast, was defeated, 21 to 28.

Death of a Consul. Washington, March 28.—The state department has been notified of the death last night at Cologne of United States Consul John A. Burnes. Burnes was born in Ohio.

Deny Confession. Frankfurt, March 28.—Youtsey and Cul-ton, two of the men accused of being accessory to the murder of Goebel, deny that they made confessions.

## MACRUM CASE!

### His Charges Against Great Britain.

### President McKinley's Position on Kentucky.

### Continuous Testimony in the Idaho Mine Troubles.

### HEAVY SNOW IN DAKOTA.

Washington, March 28.—Charles E. Macrum, American ex-consul at Pretoria, appeared before the house foreign affairs committee to-day and told of alleged indignities that he suffered at the hands of the British during his incumbency. Macrum said the statement he made some time ago to the Associated Press practically embodied all he had to say. Macrum said he had received two open letters. He produced the envelopes. One was from a private citizen of the United States addressed to the United States consul at Pretoria, and the other was from Consul Stowe at Cape Town. William Allen Smith, of Michigan, interrogated the witness sharply on his reasons for stating his belief that the British authorities had possession of the state department's cipher code.

He explained that on November 6 he called the state department in cipher asking leave of absence. Next day he was informed that a newspaper at Durban printed the fact that he had asked leave of absence. Macrum said that before the war Consul Stowe, at Cape Town, appealed to President McKinley, at the request of President Bryan, to use his good offices to settle the difference between the republics and Great Britain, but received an unfavorable answer. Stowe had written him to this effect.

After hearing Macrum, the committee went into executive session. Chairman Hitt presented a letter from Secretary Hay saying that Macrum had never made any representations to the department in regard to mail being opened. That Consul Stowe reported two letters opened by the censor at Durban, for which apology was made; that he also reported that he had an interview with the British high commissioner to see if he would consent to arbitrate the differences with the republics, and he refused.

IDAHO INVESTIGATION. Committee Indulge in Sharp Talk to a Senator. Washington, March 28.—The fifth day of Governor's investigation began this morning. The governor said the mine owners were opposed to the permit system, and wanted to keep the mines open for the purpose of securing subscribers. The citizens also learn the same individual was around last week collecting subscriptions for the St. Louis Globe-Democrat. The Globe-Democrat has no official collectors on the road—it has solicitors, and the collection of subscriptions is made direct from the office in St. Louis.

## BLAND BURNED!

### Heavy Loss to the Gold Camp.

### Prisoners Break Jail at Sil- ver City.

### Smelter at Cerrillos in Active and Successful Operation.

### TO VOTE ON PUERTO RICO BILL.

Special to The Citizen. Tuesday, March 28.—Last night fire originated at the south end of the canyon in H. H. McDowen's general store, where two men were boarding themselves. The building burned over in a very little time. A. Simpson's undertaking rooms; T. A. Abbott's residence; Cooper's residence and a livery stable, and Zachariah and Landman's carpenter shop, the last named being partially insured. The fire made some progress against the north wind, and it looked at times as if the camp was doomed. Cooper saved his live stock and part of the stable paraphernalia. McDowen saved his entire stock of merchandise, having moved the same yesterday morning prior to the fire. The Bonham Lumber company had a slight loss, the lumber being carried beyond reach of the fire. The total loss is about \$2,000.

PRISONERS BREAK JAIL. Silver City, March 28.—Six prisoners, named Brooks, Stevens, O'Neill, Bixby and two Mexicans, broke jail here last night. O'Neill was a United States prisoner, held for smuggling cattle from Mexico; Stevens was under sentence of five years in the penitentiary for murder and was awaiting a commitment to be issued before being taken to Kansas; Brooks was under indictment for horse stealing and was also held as a witness in the Bowman and Son bank robbery at Las Cruces. Bixby and the Mexicans were held for minor offenses.

It is not known how the prisoners effected their escape. Sheriff Blair is at Santa Fe with a bunch of convicts, but will return home today.

An interesting subject of discussion

in Europe. According to Herr Franz  
Buettingbach, coal was mined before  
1115, and it has been thought that coal  
was first found in the Lidge district.

Of the fifty richest persons in the  
United States five owe their fortunes  
to copper, silver or gold mines. They  
are J. B. Haggin of California, Mrs.  
George Hearst and John Mackay of  
San Francisco, and W. A. Clark and  
Marcus Daly of Montana.

Among those mentioned as delegates  
from New Mexico to the national dem-  
ocratic convention in Kansas City are  
Judge E. V. Long and E. C. de la Haza  
of San Miguel county; Macario Galles  
of Mora county; Lorton Miller and

The information received by the in-  
terstate commerce commission shows  
that the total increase in railway ton-  
nage of the United States during the calen-  
dar year 1918 was 4,587 miles, the largest  
increase being in Iowa, 572 miles,  
the next in Minnesota, 450 miles, and  
the next in Arkansas, 269 miles.

The highest mountain peak in Alaska  
according to a bulletin about to be is-  
sued by the United States Geological  
survey, is Mount McKinley, about 20,000  
miles from Cook Inlet. It was formerly  
known as Mount Denali, but was given  
the name of the president in 1896 and  
prospectors, and the new designation  
has been adopted on the government  
maps.

Statistics of the state of Massachu-  
setts, covering a term of twenty years,  
show a record of 578,248 sentences for  
crime, 560,114 being for drunkenness,  
giving some faint indication of the cost  
of the vice to the community, aside  
from the maintenance of crowds of  
vagrants in workhouses and poor-  
houses. Every year some people in this  
country foot out \$700,000 for drink

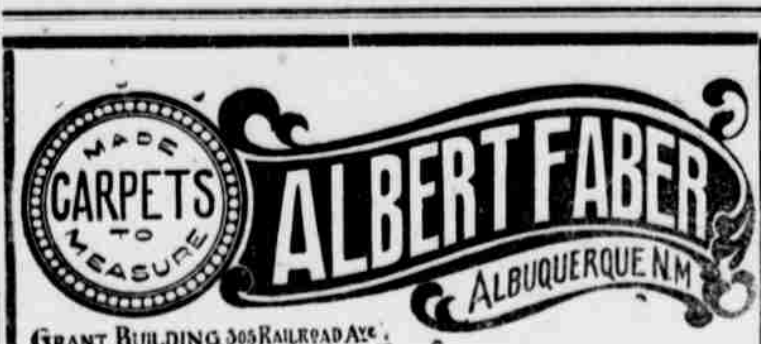
