Meeting of Republican Territorial Com-  
mittee.  
Held at 10:30 a. m. at the N. M. J. Hotel.

A meeting of the Republican Territorial Com-  
mittee of New Mexico is being  
called to meet at the office of the secretary  
located in the city of Albuquerque, for the purpose  
of holding the annual meeting of the territorial  
convention to be held in the city of  
Albuquerque on June 1, 1909, for the purpose  
of nominating candidates for presi-  
dents and vice-presidents of the United States,  
and to transmit such other business as may  
properly be brought before the committee.

There is a strong religious sentiment  
abroad in New Mexico, as is evidenced  
by the numerous revivals in progress in  
the churches.

CONGRESSMAN ROBERTS, of Utah, was  
excluded from congress by a vote of 278  
to 60. He will retire from politics and  
retain his plural wives.

The adjutant general of the various  
states have decided to ask congress to in-  
crease from \$400,000 to \$2,000,000 the ap-  
propriation for state troops.

The suicide record at Monte Carlo is  
well maintained this season, no less  
than seventeen dependent victims hav-  
ing already taken their lives.

The depopulation of Peru is illustrated  
by the fact that the valley of Santa,  
which in the days of the Incas had a  
population of 700,000, now has only 5-  
000.

The public schools of New Mexico will  
soon be receiving a large sum annually  
from the leasing of the public lands do-  
nated to the territory by the govern-  
ment.

The gold democrats of New Mexico are  
generally affiliating with the republican  
party, and are cordially welcomed to the  
ranks of the party of progress and prosperity.

NEW YORK has money to throw to the  
birds. Ten million dollars are said to  
have been subscribed to the capital stock  
of a mammoth new hotel it is proposed  
to erect there.

MEDICAL inspection of public schools,  
which was started by the city of Boston,  
has been adopted by the Philadelphia  
authorities. Chicago has also put the  
idea into practice.

The cost of educating a pupil in the  
public schools of Chicago in 1877 amounted  
to \$8.41. It has been steadily in-  
creasing each year until the record of  
1898 showed a cost per pupil of \$18.41.

THERE is a great scarcity of hired  
girls in this city. One hundred could  
get work here inside of a week. The  
scarcity of hired girls is said to be caused  
by the marrying habit which prevails in  
the territory.

THE bureau of navigation has received  
complete returns of shipbuilding in Eu-  
rope, which show that 1899 was a record-  
breaker, with a total of 1,713,353 tons  
of vessels, as compared with 1,661,252  
tons in 1898.

"THE CITIZEN advocates at all times  
decent treatment for laboring men, and  
this is why it has denounced the condi-  
tion of things at the Clarkville coal  
mines. This paper hopes to hear better  
reports from that camp in the future.

THERE is considerable discussion  
about "What Jesus Would Do" in con-  
ducting a daily newspaper. There is  
none whatever about what the newspaper  
man would do if they had the power of  
Jesus. They would wipe out at once all  
the opposition papers.

SANTA FE officials announce that the  
company has no intention of removing  
the railroad shops to La Junta. This is  
good news. La Junta is one of the best  
towns in New Mexico, and the assurance  
of the permanency of the shops will cause  
it to continue to grow and prosper.

THE Pueblo Chieftain says that all the  
power of the Colorado press is to be ex-  
erted to put an end to the extortions of  
the white paper trust, which has run up  
the price of this necessity in newspaper  
production to a point that is entirely un-  
justified by any of the conditions.

The present congress will be memora-  
ble for years to come as the one in which  
the west took a part it had never hereto-  
fore occupied. The present speaker is  
the first man from the vast region west  
of the Mississippi river to wield the gavel  
over the deliberations of the more num-  
erous house.

DID NOT KEEP FAITH  
The El Paso News says that the sheep  
men of New Mexico charge the cattle  
men of Texas with not keeping faith in  
the matter of voting on the proposition  
for leasing government lands for graz-  
ing purposes. They claim that when

Fort Worth was agreed on as the place  
for holding the convention, it was under-  
stood, in view of the fact that Texas has  
no government land, that when the ques-  
tion of leasing government lands should  
come up the Texas members of the con-  
vention would take part in the discus-  
sion and voting. When the question  
of leasing government lands was brought  
up, however, Texas voted a unit, 100-  
strong, and thus the measure was car-  
ried by 101 majority.

THAT TRUST CURE.  
That public opinion very often serves  
as a corrector of private morals is quite  
true, but public opinion is of little avail  
in correcting an evil in which the great  
majority of those composing "the public"  
would indulge if they had the chance.

For this reason Professor Haller's al-  
leged cure for the trust evil would be  
about as potent as would a crusade  
against eating pie.

Supporting all the merchants and  
miners and newspaper men and farmers  
in the United States should resolve to  
elect John D. Rockefeller every time they  
should meet him on the street and re-  
frain from inviting him to their social  
functions; what would he care for that  
so long as they were compelled to buy  
his oil, use the products of his mines and  
ship goods over his railroads? The  
chances are that he would never find out  
he was snubbed unless he should happen  
to read about it in the newspapers, and  
he is so accustomed to newspaper arti-  
cles and so busy with his own affairs  
that he would find time and inclination  
to give the subject only a passing thought.
