This territory is in shape to give homes and employment to 50,000 new settlers, and they should come next year.

WITHIN the past year Kansas has refunded \$5,000,000 worth of bonds and reduced the interest on them to 3 and 4 per cent.

SILVER CITY has secured improved train service through the efforts of Mr. Grayson and other enterprising citizens of that town.

This territory should own its own electric light plant at the capital building. The light furnished by the Santa Fe Electric Light company is poor and also expensive.

The sheriff of Apache county, Arizona, arranged to hang a condemned murderer in regular "Arizona kicker" style, and the governor has interfered with the "cheerful" proceedings.

The deadly railroad crossing nuisance in this city could be done away with by the erection of a viaduct across "C" avenue, and by throwing the switching in the Santa Fe yards south of Gold avenue.

THERE are more than 2,500,000 people dwelling in Paris within the old fortifications on an area of thirty square miles. This gives an average density of \$3,300 to the square mile, as against \$4,400 in London and 73,000 in New York.

REPUBLICAN PROSPERITY.
So far this year 100,000 New England cotton mill operatives have received an advance of ten per cent in their wages.

On December 1, fifteen window glass factories in Indiana, resumed operations with a force of nearly 2,000 workmen.

It is stated that Pennsylvania's industries are using 300,000 more persons than they did this time a year ago.

About 2,400 workers in the watch works at Kigin, Ill., are to receive an increase in wages January 1. The increase aggregates an expenditure of \$100,000 more a year.

For eleven months the total output has been \$129,531,307 this year, against \$121,021,186 in 1908, and \$90,304,805 in 1907. Gold coinage alone this year has exceeded 1809 by \$35,570,295.

During November there was a net increase of \$23,314,816, which was over \$7,000,000 in excess of the increase for the month of October.
