Let everybody decorate and celebrate next week.
Come to this city next week. Plenty of fun for everybody.

Just one week from tomorrow (Tuesday) the big New Mexico Territorial Fair will be in progress in this city.

The deposits in the forty-nine savings banks of New Mexico July 1 last were larger by twenty millions than they were January 1 of this year.

MISS ELIZABETH PEASE, of Denver, has been appointed a teacher in the Nutria Indian school, Pueblo and Jicarilla agencies, in New Mexico.

Gov. OTERO will touch the electric button on the Midway Tuesday afternoon, Sept. 19, immediately after Mayor Marmon makes a brief address of welcome, turning the keys of the city over to the visitors.

The Durango Democrat says: Albuquerque is making extensive arrangements for the Territorial Fair and the citizens of that city are pushing; they all push, and by so doing, lead all New Mexico cities in point of population, wealth, industrial and commercial importance.

The Williams News says: Every community has its "knockers" and Williams is no exception to the rule. They belong to the class that guess everything, haven't a cent invested, nothing to do but listen for some kind of deception report and then industriously circulate it.

Announces the unprecedented demand for iron and steel in this country, is the claim that the degree of a nation's civilization and enlightenment may be gauged by its consumption of iron. According to this rule, the United States ranks foremost. Statistics show that for every baby and adult in the land there is an annual consumption of 400 pounds of iron; fifty years ago the consumption was only 100 pounds.

"The Chicago Tribune has discovered that a man can support a wife and family on \$10 a week, and then proceeds to show how it is done," says the Springfield (Ill.) News. "We hardly see how the Tribune can claim a scoop on this bit of information. It will explain how some people get married on nothing and afterwards live in comfort on no more than it would take to support a family."

Commercial bodies at Bilbao, Burgos, San Sebastian, Seville, Valencia and Palma, six of the most important organizations of the kind in all Spain, have accepted invitations to be present by their representatives at Philadelphia in October on the occasion of the assembling of the International Commerce congress in that city. The announcement is extremely pleasing to the United States. This republic has ever been a generous foe and a not vindictive victor.

The property of a section depends largely upon whether or not the citizens spend their money at home or send it to outside points, from whence no returns can be obtained. THE WEIGHING OF MAIL MATTER.
On October 3 next every postoffice in the country will begin weighing all matter passing through it. There are nearly 80,000 offices and in each one of these this weighing will be kept up for thirty-five consecutive days. At the end of this time each office will forward to Washington its complete report, and from this enormous mass of statistics will be compiled, by a special staff yet to be selected, a wealth of information that can not fail to benefit the service greatly. Strange as it seems, the United States government has not taken a complete accounting of the matter carried by it for over twenty years.

EXPANSION AND COTTON.
Probably the most ardent and enthusiastic expansionist in the United States is Senator Morgan, of Alabama. He was for the annexation of Hawaii when President Cleveland opposed it, and his statesmanship has always been of that sort that looks ahead for great opportunities, and stands ready to take advantage of them.

Senator Morgan has a particular and specific reason for wanting the Philippines to remain under the control of the United States. He says that Manila is destined to become the greatest cotton goods market in the world, and he declares that the development of a great center there for the distribution of cotton goods to the people of Asia will add fifty millions a year to the value of the cotton crop in the United States.

OF COURSE A NATION.
A Washington correspondent makes public the inside history of the attempt to annex San Domingo in 1899. President Grant favored the annexation of the island, and the people of San Domingo voted almost unanimously in favor of the proposition. The treaty was defeated in the senate by a close vote. The correspondent says that President Grant was greatly disappointed over the vote of the Senate, and that he was determined to remain in the United States. He was now a resident of Albuquerque. He is opposed to the annexation of any land to this country outside the limits of the North American continent.

It is an interesting subject to contemplate what might have happened if San

Domingo had been annexed in 1899. The chances are that soon after the absorption of San Domingo, the islands of Cuba and Porto Rico would have been secured from Spain in a peaceful manner, and thousands of lives and millions of treasure would have been saved. The numerous revolutions in San Domingo could not have occurred under American rule. The democratic party in the United States have much to answer for. The crimes committed against humanity and civilization in its name are numerous and most foul. The rejection of the gift of the island of San Domingo is a deep disgrace to the senators who were so slighted and narrow, and who acted as they did to throw difficulties in the way of President Grant, who was trying to extend the outposts of this country for the best interests of the nation.

Capital Contracts Awarded.
The capital rebuilding commission awarded the contract for hardware for the new capital to P. & F. Corbin, of Chicago, for \$75,130, and 3 1/2 cents per foot for steel each ribbon. The contract for the eight vault doors was awarded to the Victor Safe and Lock Company, of Cincinnati, for \$25,500 per door. The bid had been for \$25.50 per door, but the commission ordered extra heavy plates, increasing the cost \$1 per door. The successful bidders bid far below the estimate of cost each firm that competed.

CLAIMED BY DEATH.

George Johnson, a Popular and Estimable Man, Answers the Summons.

George A. Johnson, a popular and promising young man of this city, died at 5 o'clock, after a brief illness of typhoid fever. He had been ailing all month, but it was only within the last few days that the illness took a serious turn. He was the son of the late J. L. Johnson, at one time prominent merchant of Santa Fe, and daughter, Maria Johnson, and was born twenty-nine years ago in this city. He attended St. Michael's college and proved an apt pupil. The necessity of helping towards the support of the family compelled him to begin early in life to earn a livelihood, and he manfully assisted the family until the fatal illness compelled him to cease work. After being employed in several stores, the young man was engaged as clerk by Territorial Secretary Lane, and for the past ten years has been a tried and efficient private secretary and stenographer of Solicitor General K. L. Bartlett. Deceased took an active part in the work of the Roman Catholic church in this city, and sang in the cathedral choir. He was devout, reserved in his manner, gentle and yet manly and self-reliant. Death came as a blow to his mother and sisters, as well as a deeply felt bereavement to many friends. The father of the young man died about two years ago, and his brother, Thomas Johnson, of this city, and Santiago Johnson of Albuquerque. The funeral will take place Sunday morning at 9 o'clock. Mass will be said at the cathedral and interment will be in Rosario cemetery. —New Mexican Sept. 9.

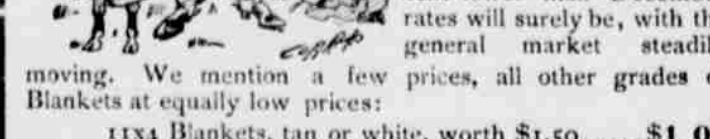
