Canadian Firm Bombardier To Submit Bid For Mexico City Subway System Cars

On Aug. 1, spokespersons for the Canadian firm Bombardier, announced plans to bid on supplying cars to the Mexico City subway system. "Metro" expansion plans include the addition of 105 new cars. Bombardier, which recently acquired a 100% stake in the Compania Constructora de Carros de Ferrocarril (CONCARRIL), plans no changes in product lines. The CONCARRIL manufacturing facility, located in Ciudad Sahagun, is to become "one of the most modern in Latin America." Ninety percent of the company's sales receipts are generated abroad.
