Crude Oil Export Volume & Revenue, 1st Half 1992

According to a report released Aug. 16 by Petroleos Mexicanos (PEMEX), crude oil export volume over the first half of the year averaged 1.3693 million barrels per day. Total revenue came to US \$3.493 billion. PEMEX exported an average 301,200 bpd of Istmo (light), 153,600 bpd of Olmeca (extra light), and 914,500 bpd of Maya (heavy) crude. Income by crude type over the six-month period was US\$954 million, US\$536 million, and US\$2 billion, respectively. Average price per barrel was US \$17.41 for Istmo crude; US\$12.04, Maya; and US\$19.17, Olmeca. Of total exports, the US accounted for 53.3%; Spain, 17%; and East Asian nations, 7.3%.
