ADMIRAL DEWEY will attend the grand Army encampment at Philadelphia in September.

MEXICO has adopted a compulsory military law. Every citizen of the Republic must undergo military training.

BENJAMIN H. SHAW has been appointed postmaster at Bland, Bernalillo county, vice Elizabeth A. Philpot, removed.

LAS VEGAS proves itself to be an enterprising and patriotic town, by offering to pay all the expenses of the Rough Riders if the first reunion is held there on June 24.

APRIL treasury receipts for 1939 were about \$5,000,000 greater than for 1938, but the expenditures for April, 1939, increased \$21,700,000 because of the payment of interest.

WITH a tariff 62 per cent less, General Brooke in Havana is collecting 25 per cent more revenue than was taken under Spanish rule. No wonder the Spaniards didn't want to go.

It appears probable that as Aguinaldo began his campaign against the Spaniards near Manila on May 19, 1898, he may have had just a year of an extraordinary career brought to a close very near May 19, 1939.

THE dowager empress of China will hold a grand review in Peking next month, when nearly 2,000,000 men will be under arms. It is understood that the empress will proclaim a new emperor at that time.

PROF. GEORGE E. PUTNAM, of Alamo, is at Santa Fe. The professor has been engaged by Messrs. C. B. Kildy and J. A. Kildy and associates to associate with them in developing the country in Otero county, to conduct a Chautauque or summer school in the mountains.

SINCE the British government formed its plan for establishing a telephone system for the public service, terror has seized the National Telephone company. The company is now willing to sell its entire plant and business to the government for a sum not greatly beyond \$30,000,000.

SINCE electricity has come into general use for power and lighting purposes the production of copper has been greatly stimulated. Arizona offers a fair illustration of what has taken place. In 1938 the total copper production of that territory amounted to 43,773,675 pounds; in 1939 it reached over 110,000,000 pounds.

THE new Methodist Episcopal church at Pinos Altos was dedicated last Sunday afternoon. The Silver City Independent, in its comments about the dedication, says: "The church is a credit to the little city. It cost \$2,000 and is all paid for. It is a monument to the vigor, pluck, tact and energy of Pinos Altos."

THE Japanese are going railroad crazy. Charities have been granted for the construction of 3,667 miles in that little patch of land to the six companies, who have already collected \$73,395,000, out of a subscribed capital of \$118,867,500. Provisional charities have been granted to seventy-four other companies to build 1834 miles of road, with \$46,827,810 subscribed capital.

IT is proposed to construct a tunnel from England or Scotland to Ireland, and no less than five plans are being considered. The cost is estimated from \$35,000,000 to \$80,000,000 the shallowest sounding is seventy-five fathoms and the length would be forty miles. The tunnel would shorten the journey to America by over 500 miles. A government guarantee is being sought.

THE ROAD IS NEEDED. The Durango Democrat says there is no better field for railroad builders than from Durango to Albuquerque, or to some point in Arizona, where greater and more competitive connections can be made. The through road traffic in coal alone would afford a dividend without considering local traffic, concessions or intermediate haul. Durango has a vast area of superior coal and the route would traverse the New Mexico fruit belt and several sections where traffic in lumber would be profitable. A line independent of the Rio Grande route would be generously dealt with in way of concessions as to depot grounds and right of way.

INJURY TO ARIZONA. The Phoenix Republican enters a vigorous protest against the proposed government exhibit of Indians and cavities at the Omaha exposition. The Republican says: "The Indians are to be drafted from every tribe in the territory and the cavities show is to extend to every variety that grows in Arizona. Indians and cavities! What an appalling picture for homecoming to gaze upon! What an interesting story it will tell of the possibilities in mining, in grazing and in agriculture in the treasure territory! There can be no doubt that this display, made possible through the enterprise of the Indian commission, will lead all others at the exposition in point of general interest."

THE GALLANT CAPTAINS. In the current Century Admiral Philip, then Captain in command of the battleship Texas, tells of the fight off Santiago, as do the commanders of the other ships of the fleet, each narrating the experiences of his ship and men. The narrative is extremely entertaining but there is at least one paragraph that is more than topical, more than a simple account of something that was. It breathes the spirit of what the American is and tells the reason why he is able. Admiral Philip writes: "It was a terrible strain, that month of watching for no man knew what. For weeks hammocks were unknown on the Texas, with half the entire crew by

turn on watch at night. Every one on board, from practice to officer, met the arduous conditions cheerfully. That our officers and men were so well under this strain, during a trip to Guantanamo for coal was a welcome relief, and the bombardment of the Santiago fortifications a joyous distraction, is a cheering instance that the American character has plenty of that dogged steadfastness which is more valuable to the doing of things than dash and brilliancy alone."

SOLDIERS' SANITARIUM. Proposition to Turn the Montezuma Hotel into a Soldiers' Home.

It has been proposed to turn the Montezuma hotel, at Las Vegas hot springs, into a sanitarium for malaria-ridden soldiers who are soon to come home from the Philippines, says W. E. Curtis in the Chicago Record, and those who are now scattered among the hospitals throughout the country trying to recuperate from their encounters with the miasma of Cuba. Accommodations for 300 or 400 patients, and by a little alteration they might be considerably enlarged. The government has already decided to turn the abandoned barracks at Fort Stanton, N. M., into a permanent hospital for consumptives, but it is a long haul to reach. The Montezuma hotel is on a branch of the main railroad, and a scheme is now on foot to equip it with electric cars.

OFFICIALLY INVITED.

City Extends Invitation to Rough Riders to Hold Reunion Here.

COMMITTEE TO WAIT ON BRODIE.

The city council met in special session last night for the purpose of formally inviting the Rough Riders, in the name of the city, to hold their first reunion in Albuquerque on June 24. There were present Mayor Marron and Aldermen Neustadt, Kieck, Leonard, Hopping, Tierney, Rogers and McKee, together with a number of citizens, who are enthusiastic supporters of the reunion idea.

Alderman Neustadt introduced the following resolution which was unanimously adopted: Whereas, It is proposed to have a reunion during the month of June next of the survivors of the regiment of American volunteers known as the Rough Riders; and Whereas, This regiment, by its gallant conduct during the Cuban campaign, won for itself a name and fame known throughout the world, which reflects honor upon the American arms and in the pride in every patriotic American heart; and Whereas, A large majority of the men who composed the regiment were from the southwest; and Whereas, Albuquerque furnished men for the regiment than any other place in the country, and is a most desirable place than any other point in New Mexico or Arizona for the purpose of holding the proposed reunion; therefore,

Resolved, By the city council of the city of Albuquerque, that the officers and men of the Rough Riders be, and hereby are, most cordially invited to have their first reunion in this city; be it further Resolved, That the Rough Riders and such individual Rough Riders, from the colored down to the youngest private in the ranks, are hereby officially assured that if this invitation be accepted, the city and all its contents will be at their disposal during the time of their stay with us. Be it further Resolved, That the city clerk be and he hereby is directed to forthwith transmit to the officers of the regiment a copy of these resolutions; be it further Resolved, That Hon. J. W. Crumpacker, T. S. Hubbell, E. K. Fox and E. W. Dobson, be, and they hereby are, designated as a committee to represent the city in presenting this invitation to the officers of the regiment; and be it further Resolved, That these resolutions to Colonel A. O. Brodie.

The last resolve was added at the suggestion of H. E. Fox, chairman of the Commercial club committee having the preliminary arrangements for the reunion in charge, who stated that Judge Crumpacker, Sheriff Hubbell, Colonel Dobson and himself had been designated as a committee to present the invitation to Colonel Alex O. Brodie in behalf of the Commercial club and that it might be well for the city council to authorize the same committee to represent the city in the same. Calvin Whiting delivered an eloquent address on the glory that would be attached to securing the reunion for Albuquerque and stirred his hearers to the highest pitch of enthusiasm.

It was decided that the mayor should telegraph Colonel Brodie soliciting the privilege of a personal interview on behalf of the committee and this was done. The council then adjourned, the mayor and aldermen feeling that the work of securing the reunion had been placed into the hands of a quartet of men, who will perform herculean tasks before Albuquerque loses the reunion.
