## MORE TESTIMONY.

**Gen. Howard a Witness Before  
War Investigation Committee.**

**Cubans Making Trouble With Span-

### COMMERCIAL TREATY WITH PERU.

Washington, Dec. 23.—The war investigation commission to-day was reduced to two members, chief engineers Gen. John M. Wilson and Col. Deady. Deady, called as interrogator, with Gen. O. O. Howard, retired, in the witness chair. Gen. Howard told how disappointed he had been in not securing assignment for active service during the war. He then accepted the office of visiting delegate for the Army and Navy Commission, commission, distributing tracts and other things in the southern camps. He said these camps as a rule were in good condition, but he noticed confusion in the railway arrangements at Tampa. There was an inundation of beer in one of the colored camps, and there was a plague of flies. The colors of Camp Thomas during July he said were repulsive. He suggested chloride of lime to Gen. Brooke, who received the suggestion favorably, and distributed thirty-nine barrels of lime in one day. He said that the Christian commission had done excellent work. Regarding Gen. Lee's camp at Jacksonville, Gen. Howard said he had not believed before that it was possible for a camp to be kept in such fine condition.

### ANNOYING THE SPANIARDS.

Cuban Insurgents Growing Insolent Under Protection of the Americans.  
Havana, Dec. 23.—Cubans entered the residence of Marquis de Pinar del Rio, at Cerro, a suburb, yesterday and compelled him to cry "Viva Cuba Libre." The marquis was one of the richest men on the island and of a noted family, complained to Captain General Castellanos. A note on the subject was sent to the American evacuation commission. The marquis and other prominent Spaniards are determined to leave Cuba, their friends say, "unless the United States establish a strong government and they are assured ample protection." The joint evacuation commissions held a meeting this morning. The United States flag was formally hoisted at Cardenas yesterday by Lieut. G. R. Byrum, of the Eighth regiment.

### Thanks For Aid.

Washington, Dec. 23.—The following has been received from Havana: McKinley, president United States. The city council in solemn session resolved in the name of the people of Havana to return its warmest thanks to you for contributions sent in aid of the needy poor. Marquis Kestaban, president.

### Fit of Sogus Retarded.

Chicago, Dec. 23.—Western headquarters of Arbuckle Brothers to-day announced another cut in refined sugar. Reductions of 3.14 cents a pound were made to retail dealers direct, jobbers being ignored. This is about 8 1/2 cents below the price of the American Sugar Refining company.

### A Wise Decision.

Cleveland, Dec. 23.—Judge Disette, of the criminal court, to-day sustained the demurrer to the indictment returned against ex Mayor F. K. McGowan, of Trenton, N. J. Mrs. McGowan and Mrs. Wynn, Mrs. McGowan's sister, upon the charge of child stealing. The court ordered all the defendants discharged, saying it is not natural for a mother to say I had own child.

### Gobbling Up Franchises.

Washington, Dec. 23.—Information has reached the administration that the local governments of the cities of Cuba and Porto Rico are constantly being besieged by promoters with a view to securing valuable railroad and other franchises and concessions below value. The matter was discussed at to-day's cabinet meeting. Instructions will be sent to the military governors to see that the people are not to the interest of the people or secured below real value.

### Stamp Duty.

Paris, Dec. 23.—The chamber of deputies to-day adopted a bill imposing a stamp duty of one per cent on foreign securities.

### Tried to Kill His Wife.

Silon, Mexico, Dec. 23.—C. H. Pope, traveling auditor of the Mexican Central railroad, stationed at this place, made a brutal attempt to kill his wife by shooting her, while she was on her way to dinner and unaware of her danger. He was disarmed by soldiers and taken away, she was saved, thus saving her life. The

wife did not have him arrested, although she asked the protection of the law. The couple, so it is said, resided in Albuquerque, some five years ago, when Mr. Pope was in the employ of the Atlantic & Pacific.

## MATTERS AT MANILA.

**News from the Western United  
States Pacific Islands.**

**Editor of Boston Traveller Jailed for  
Contempt of Court.**

**Admiral Sampson and Wife Arrive in  
New York from Havana.**

### ESTIMATED COST OF NICARAGUA CANAL.

Manila, Dec. 23.—The United States cruiser Boston and the guest ship Petrel, have arrived from Chinese ports. The steamer Union, which returned from Manila, with native and Spanish soldiers, has been refused a landing. Private Tyler, of company L, Nebraska regiment, in dead with typhoid fever. The steamer St. Paul has arrived with Christmas mail. The American flag was raised over the Manila school house yesterday. The honor of raising the flag was accorded to Father McKinnon, of California, in recognition of his services in reopening the schools. The attitude of an insurgent detachment at Pandanville bridge, on Wednesday, was such that the California, Idaho and Washington regiments were concentrated in light marching order at Pao, but trouble was avoided.

### Favors Building a Canal.

London, Dec. 23.—There seems to be little doubt that Great Britain will agree to abrogate the Clayton-Bulwer treaty. Great Britain desires the Nicaragua canal to be constructed, and is willing that the United States should control it, if the United States guarantee neutrality safeguards to British interests. The impression here is that the British foreign office and United States charge d'affaires, Henry White, will arrange a basis of action.

### Commander of the Navy.

New York, Dec. 23.—The press says: On Christmas day Rear Admiral Dewey will become ranking officer of the active service of the United States navy. Rear Admiral Bunsen, commandant of the navy yard, now holds that place, but as he has reached the limit, he will retire, while the remaining commandant of the yard until his successor is appointed, be officially retired.

### CONTempt OF COURT.

Editor of Boston Traveller Sentenced to Jail for Contempt of Court.  
Dedham, Mass., Dec. 23.—Torrey E. Wardner, editor of the Boston Traveller, was sentenced to thirty days in Dedham jail to-day for contempt of court in permitting the publication of comments and editorials on the Getchell case, which in the court's opinion would have influenced the minds of the jury had the paper containing the matter reached the court house before the case was submitted for final consideration. Engineer Getchell, of the New York, New Haven and Hartford railroad, was charged with manslaughter in connection with a railroad collision last August.

### Cost of the Canal.

New York, Dec. 23.—A preliminary report of the Nicaragua canal commission, consisting of General Haines, Admiral Walker and Prof. Hantz, has been completed and will be read before the senate committee either during the Christmas recess or soon after. On its figures \$135,000,000 will be a conservative estimate of the entire cost of the canal.

### Murder Trial.

San Francisco, Dec. 23.—Mrs. Cordelia Botkin was on the witness stand in her own defense to-day. She emphatically denied that she wrote the anonymous letters sent Mrs. Dunning or mailed the candy which caused the death of Mrs. Dunning and sister, Mrs. Deane.

### Death of Chicago Man.

Chicago, Dec. 23.—Edward F. Lawrence, one of the most prominent capitalists of Chicago and associated with many of the financial interests of the city to-day after a short illness. He was born in Massachusetts in 1835.

### Admiral Sampson.

New York, Dec. 24.—The United States cruiser New York from Havana, has arrived here. Admiral Sampson and Mrs. Sampson are on board. To newspaper men who boarded the New York at the quarantine, Sampson said he had come home to attend his daughter's wedding on January 4, at Glen Ridge, N. J.

### Extradition with Mexico.

Washington, Dec. 23.—The state department has not been advised of the reported negotiation of an extradition treaty between the United States and Mexico. Unless steps are taken speedily looking to the replacement of the present treaty, which is about to expire, condi-
