Telegraphic Tidings

DAVID WAS DONE UP.

Banker Moffatt Forced to Sign a Check for \$21,000 by a Denver Hold-up.

An Affable Man with Nerve and Nitro-Glycerine—A Most Remarkable Crime.

Denver, March 29.—A bold and successful robbery, in many respects the most remarkable in the criminal annals of the west, was perpetrated upon the First National bank in this city at 2 o'clock yesterday afternoon. David H. Moffatt, the president of the bank, was the victim, and the robber succeeded in getting away with cash to the amount of \$21,000.

Cashier Wood, of the bank, gives the Associated Press reporter the following statement of the affair:

On Thursday morning immediately after the opening of the bank a well-dressed man, with light mustache and complexion and of medium height, walked into the bank and asked the assistant cashier, Ross Lewis, where he could see Mr. Moffatt, the president of the bank. Ross Lewis informed him that he could see Mr. Moffatt, who is also president of the Denver & Rio Grande railway, at the president's office in the Cheeseman block. Nothing more was seen or heard of the stranger until the Friday morning about 10 o'clock, when he entered the railway office and asked to see Mr. Moffatt on important business. He was admitted to his private room and briefly stated that he had discovered a conspiracy whereby the First National was to be robbed of a large amount of money. Mr. Moffatt, at the time, was very busy at that moment but would be pleased to meet him at his private office in the bank at 1 o'clock. With this the man left the building. A few minutes after the hour appointed he called at the bank and was shown into the president's office. While remaining standing he inquired for Cashier S. N. Wood and was told that he was at luncheon. He then asked for a blank check for the purpose of showing how the robbery was to be perpetrated. The check was handed to him. He laid it upon the desk before Mr. Moffatt and said, "I will have to do this myself," and pulling a large revolver from his coat and then blew Mr. Moffatt's head and in a decidedly earnest but unexcited manner said: "I want \$21,000 and am going to have it. I have considered this matter and the chances I am running and the consequences if I fail and am arrested. I am penniless and a desperate man and have been driven during the past week to that point where I have considered suicide as the only means of escape from the poverty and misery in which I exist. You have millions and I am determined to have what I asked for or your life. If you make a noise, call a man, or ring a bell I will blow your brains out and then blow up the building and myself with this bottle of nitro glycerine (which he at that moment pulled out of another pocket). Now take your choice."

Moffatt started to argue with the man, but was stopped with the information that at 1 o'clock he was to be shot and two minutes in which to fill out the check before him for \$21,000. If he desired to live, Moffatt seeing no other alternative, filled out the check, and was then ordered to take it to the paying teller and get it cashed. Moffatt left his office, and with the man behind him with the revolver partially concealed under his arm, hurried to the building and myself with this bottle of nitro glycerine (which he at that moment pulled out of another pocket). Now take your choice."

After they had remained in the private office three or four minutes, the robber informed Mr. Moffatt that they were wasting time and that he had better step to the door and motion his teller to come to him, which he did. Moffatt instructed him to bring the money into his office, and as the teller turned to go away the robber told him that he wanted twenty \$1,000 bills and \$1,000 in gold. The money was brought in and handed over to the gentleman who for a few brief moments had owned the bank, and waiting until the teller had reached his desk, he backed out to the front door, making Mr. Moffatt remain standing in his door until he had reached the curbstone. He then raised his hat and walked around the corner, and has not yet been heard of. Mr. Moffatt is completely prostrated with the shock. Detectives are out after the man, but as yet there is no trace of him.

POSTAL POLICY.

Good Cause for Removal—How the Democrats Worked It.

WASHINGTON, March 30.—First Assistant Postmaster General Clarkson was questioned yesterday concerning certain newspaper criticisms directed against his policy in the appointment of fourth class postmasters. In answer he said that practically all of the changes thus far had been made for other than political reasons. A large number of the appointments made during the last administration were bad, as a considerable number of them have been found to be delinquent in their accounts. Other changes have been made in order to secure better locations for offices and in many cases appointments have been made with a view to the removal of offices from the vicinity of saloons. In every case of removal there has been good and sufficient cause therefor.

Perhaps, he added, it is not generally known that my predecessors within a month or six weeks prior to March 4, made over a thousand appointments of fourth class postmasters for the purpose, apparently, of forcing them on this administration. This course has not been pursued, to my knowledge, by any pre-

vious administration. During the last several weeks of President Arthur's term not a single fourth class postmaster was appointed except in rare instances where exigencies of services demanded it, and when Postmaster General Hutton resigned there were more than 3,000 resignations filed in his office. Commissioners of 1,000 appointments of my predecessors were, of course, withheld, and these vacancies, with others, are now being filled as rapidly as possible.

A Mind Reader's Feast.
MINNEAPOLIS, March 29.—Mind Reader Bishop yesterday performed his feat of finding a needle, but it nearly cost him his life, and may yet result seriously. Bishop was not feeling well, but was determined to keep his promise. The drive was a distance of over a mile, through the most crowded streets of the city. Bishop, blindfolded, went straight to the hiding place of the needle but immediately fell in it. His body became rigid and streams of perspiration poured from him. The doctors say the fit is something like catalepsy. At a late hour in the afternoon Bishop was in a very bad condition, coming out of one fit only to fall into another.

STOCK STATISTICS.

Horse Ranching Pays—Comparative Cattle Values.

Fort Worth, March 31.—The Gazette presents some figures in connection with the changes in the value of stock, between 1880 and 1889. At the beginning of the period horses averaged \$34.75 per head, and they have since advanced to an average value of \$71.89, an increase of 31 per cent. Mules have almost equaled this, the price per head advancing from \$31.26 to \$70.49, or nearly 33 per cent. In milk cows values have been more stable, the fluctuations not amounting to more than \$2 on the head. Oxen and other cattle show more advance than milk cows, the average value at the beginning of 1880 being \$17.95 against \$16.10, ten years before, an increase of 6 per cent. Sheep show a decline during the last nine years mentioned, as they began at a price of \$2.21, and are now only over \$2 on the head, or a decline of nearly 4 per cent. Swine show an advance of 35 per cent, the average price in 1880 being \$4.28, against \$5.79 at the beginning of 1889.

The Boomers Ready.
TOPEKA, March 31.—Simultaneous with the proclamation that Oklahoma was open was the formation in this city of the Oklahoma Loan, State Improvement company, composed of prominent resident capitalists. The charter sets forth the purposes of the corporation to be to lease and plat, improve and sell town sites and thereon in the public domain and elsewhere, also to open, build and operate roads, tramways, ferries and bridges in Oklahoma, and promote by lawful methods a rapid settlement and peaceful government of the Indian territory and the adjacent public land strip.

Immigrant Excursions.
CHICAGO, March 31.—Chairman Rich, of the Colorado association, gave notice some time ago that the lines in his association would reduce the western excursion rate from \$30 to \$25, beginning April 1. The Chicago, Kansas & Nebraska line has given notice that it does not join in the reduction, and that it will not do so before May 1, if it does then. The Missouri river roads had all issued reduced tariffs in accordance with Chairman Rich's notification, but have been forced to recall them by telegraph.

Pleasant Surprise.
LONDON, March 29.—The dispatch announcing that President Harrison had nominated Robert T. Lincoln as American minister to England was read at a dinner given last evening by Earl Cowper, Viscount Cranford, son of Lord Salisbury, was a guest and upon hearing the news immediately hurried to Arlington street and imparted the news to his father. The prime minister said that the nomination was a pleasant surprise to him.

Boulanger's Mysterious Malady.
PARIS, March 31.—Gen. Boulanger continues indisposed. He is unable to receive visitors. There are numerous stories current about his ailment.

NEW CORPORATIONS.

Albuquerque Townsite Scheme—Another Deming Corporation.

The Albuquerque Townsite company filed articles of incorporation with the territorial secretary to-day. The incorporators are Dr. R. H. Longwill, of Santa Fe; M. S. Otero and Dr. G. W. Harrison, of Bernalillo, and Neill B. Field, of Albuquerque. The capital stock of the corporation is \$100,000, and its objects are the improvement and sale of lands adjoining the city of Albuquerque.

The Old and New Mexico Improvement company, is also the title of a new corporation chartered to-day. The incorporators are S. Lindauer, Gustave Wormer, R. W. Webb, H. L. Warren and Albert Lindauer. The capital stock is \$500,000, and the principle place of business is Deming. The objects of the company are to lay out town sites, buy and sell mines, mineral springs, lands, etc., and to colonize lands in Old and New Mexico along the line of the Sonora, Sinaloa & Chihuahua railroad projected to build from Deming into the republic of Mexico.

BETTER BUILDINGS.

A Business Demand—The Old Adobe Doomed—An Illustration.

"The old adobe on the plaza has got to go," said a citizen this morning. "Frick and mortar are too cheap not to succeed them in short order. In this as in other things modern methods are getting the swing. The time is not far distant when even our old time merchants will refuse to pay exorbitant rents for the use of a 30-year damp and stuffy adobe room simply because it happens to be located near the business center. It will be a matter of pride with them to demand better accommodations for their money or else throw their influence toward changing the center of trade. THE SPIRIT AND THE LETTER.

The Chicago Inter Ocean, the leading and staunchest Republican paper in the northwest, thusly comments on the policy of President Harrison in appointing anti-bona fide residents to federal offices in the territories.

The president seems intent upon re-deeming the pledges made in the Chicago platform in spirit as well as in the letter. During Mr. Cleveland's administration the territories were treated as outlying provinces of some empire, rather than as incipient parts of a republic. Whosoever was too greatly disliked at home to venture to solicit a federal office which would keep him in close and constant relationship with his old neighbors, debarred to be made governor or secretary of justice or land agent for some one of the territories. Some of Mr. Cleveland's territorial appointments were so flagrantly bad as to insure rejection by the senate; none of them was excellent, and only in one case was the office of territorial governor conferred upon a resident of the territory.

The Chicago platform protested against this state of affairs and demanded home rule for the territories. The demand is based on sound policy; the territories some day will be states, and capacity for the proper exercise of the functions of statehood are best developed by a tentative system of government in which the officers are residents of the territories. The chance of appointment to a high executive or judicial position in a territory is a stimulant to the exercise of those qualities which the voters of a state are quick to recognize and honor. Home rule while in the territorial stage is the best apprenticeship which can be served to the duties and honors of statehood.

It hardly was expected that the president would carry the principle of the Chicago platform to the extent of appointing the judiciary of the territories from resident lawyers, but he has shown himself inclined to do so. And most wisely. It is a great mistake to suppose that the territorial bars are made up of either uncouth or unlettered lawyers. Some of the brightest and best trained young men of the eastern and middle states have gone to the far west in search of less crowded fields of action, and in long years of residence have made themselves familiar with the habits and tempers of the territorial people as with the written statutes.

And it is to be said that the best kind of lawyer or judge is he who not only knows the law, but knows also the kind of people to whom it is to be applied. Law is the materia medica, as it were, of social disease, but it is but half the province of a physician to know what remedies to prescribe in general; a knowledge of the temperament of his patient must supplement it. For the first time in the history of the republic we have a president who desires to intrust the interpretation of the law of the territories to the lawyers of the territories; it is a most wise and liberal policy.

SOME NEW LAWS.

Acts of the 28th Assembly of Interest to the People.

An act fixing the fees of justices of the peace and constables.

Section 1.—That justices of the peace in this territory shall hereafter be allowed and entitled to demand and receive the fees hereinafter stated, to wit:

- For each summons, warrant or mittimus50
- For a subpoena or attachment for a witness or witnesses, including all names asked to be inserted therein at time of issuing same25
- For filing each paper necessary to be filed10
- For each oath administered to witness in court10
- For trial of an issue of fact in case of no appearance by the defendant25
- For entry of a judgment or order of sale of each execution or order of sale25
- For receiving and recording the return on an execution, order of sale, writ of possession or restitution25
- For docketing each case with the various steps in the case25
- For the trial of the case without a jury where defendant appears and defends the action50
- For each order for a jury to be paid by the party demanding the same and taxed as costs50
- For presiding at each trial with a jury, including all services incident thereto, to be paid for as provided next above50
- For each order of continuance50
- For drawing each affidavit or complaint or information, swearing the party thereto, and certifying each oath25
- For swearing the party and certifying same without drawing it10
- For drawing each bond10
- For receiving and approving each return, including the acknowledgment and justifying of sureties thereto25
- For taking a recognizance and noting same on docket25
- For each original writ of attachment, replevin, capias in a civil case, writ of forcible entry and detainer, or either peace warrant or writ of habeas corpus or in any other extraordinary remedy, and no summons shall be charged for in connection therewith50
- For each copy of either of said writs25
- For taxing and delivering to each party when called for by him, a written statement of his costs15
- For entering on docket each witness' attendance and giving a certificate thereof, if demanded by him, at the trial10
- For entering on the docket an allowance of an appeal10
- For making transcript of all entries on his docket in any case and certifying same, for the first one hundred words or less50
- For each additional one hundred words of such transcript or fraction of one hundred words15
- For a transcript of the judgment in any case and of the execution and return thereon and certifying same, but the same shall not be charged for in a transcript on appeal25
- For making return of the papers on an appeal or certiorari, as required by law, unless he be in default on a certiorari50
- For presiding in examining trials in felony cases, per day, to be paid for out of the county treasury3.00
- For holding an inquisition on the body of a dead person, per day, for each day necessarily employed in holding such inquisition, and returning the inquisition to the office of the probate

judge, the same to be paid for out of the county treasury.5.50 And if such person have no visible estate out of which to defray the costs of his burial, and no friend of such decedent will undertake to bury him, the probate judge, pending such inquisition may contract with some suitable person to decently bury such decedent, at a price not exceeding \$15, and shall give such contractor a certificate of such contract, and the same shall be allowed by the county commissioners and be paid out of the county treasury. "Provided, that if such decedent have any visible or available estate the cost of holding said inquisition and said burial, not to exceed the sum of \$15.50, as aforesaid, shall be paid out of the same."

For taking and certifying the knowledge and power of attorney for each person25 For taking, writing and certifying a deposition, per day, if no more than one be taken2.50 If more than one be taken during the same day, then for each additional deposition taken for same party, writing and certifying same1.25 For drawing a record of conviction for contempt and other special cases50 For an execution upon any such conviction25 For a precept to summon a jury in special cases50 For presiding at the trial concerning which said jury is summoned50 For receiving and entering the verdict of such jury25 For making and certifying copies of deposition or other papers in his office not herein otherwise provided for, for each 100 words15

Sec. 2. That constables shall hereafter be allowed to demand and receive the following fees, to wit:

- For serving a peace warrant50
- For serving a warrant or any warrant charging a misdemeanor or an attempt, against any witness, juror or party to the suit, or any person for contempt of court, for each defendant, and making return thereon75
- For making an arrest without a warrant, where the same is lawful, and carrying the arrested party before the justice of the peace and making or causing to be made a return thereon in writing of the charge for which such party was arrested, for each defendant1.00
- For taking a party arrested for or convicted of crime or contempt of court, or a debtor under a capias, to jail and delivering him to the jailer75
- Provided, that if the distance from the place of conviction to the county jail be more than one mile, then the officer shall receive in addition 5 cents per mile as mileage both ways75
- For serving a writ of capias, civil suit, taking bond and making return thereon1.00
- For taking property under a writ of attachment or replevin, causing same to be appraised, taking bond therefor and making his return thereon75
- For taking and approving a bond required by law to be taken by him and not otherwise provided for75
- For taking property under a writ of replevin and returning same to the defendant on failure of plaintiff to execute a replevin bond75
- For serving any summons, or writ of forcible entry and detainer, and making return thereon, for each defendant or garnishee50
- For serving a subpoena, or writ for summoning and attending each jury75
- For levying on any live stock, goods or chattels under an attachment or execution and making return thereon75
- For removing and taking care of live stock, goods or chattels taken under attachment or other mesne process, 25 cents per day for each head of live stock and \$1 per day for any quantity of inanimate chattels75
- For executing a writ of restitution or a writ of possession, issued on a judgment in a case of forcible entry and detainer, and making return thereon1.50
- For advertising and selling property under an execution or other legal process, receiving and paying over the money and making return thereon, 5 per cent on sums not exceeding \$50, and on any greater amount 3 per cent, to be paid as costs in the case by the defendant in such execution or other process, and if such advertisement be necessarily and lawfully made in a newspaper under any provision of an express statute, then, in addition the reasonable costs of such advertisement3.00
- For collecting and paying over money without levy and sale, 3 per cent on sums not exceeding \$35, and 2 per cent on any greater amount, the same to be paid by the defendant as provided next above75
- The fees herein allowed for the service of an execution shall be collected by virtue of said execution, in the same manner as the sums therein directed to be levied75
- For confining, keeping and selling large a reasonable sum of money shall be made to the constable by order of the justice of the peace of the precinct and taxed as costs25
- For killing and burning or burying each glandered horse or ass, to be collected from the owner of such animal1.00
- Sec. 3.—The fees herein provided for constables shall apply to and regulate the fees of sheriffs for all services rendered by sheriffs in courts of justices of the peace, except in making arrests and other services incident to the execution, in which cases sheriffs shall receive the fees provided by law for sheriffs.

OF THE TAXATION OF COSTS.

Sec. 4.—Upon demand of a party from whom costs are claimed, or of his attorney, the justice of the peace or constable shall make out and deliver to the party a bill itemizing the costs at length and in figures, sign the same in his official capacity and deliver it to such defendant.

Sec. 5.—No justice of the peace or constable shall collect any fees after having been required in writing to have the same itemized and taxed without such taxation having been made in writing.

Sec. 6.—No justice of the peace or constable shall split up and divide his charge for services so as to make two or more charges, when the law intended but one, and no officer or constable shall receive his services any other or more fee or reward than is allowed by law, or any fee for services rendered or to be rendered when the law has not fixed on a compensation therefor.
