Telegraphic Tidings**HITCH OF STATE.**

Mr. Blaine's objection to the Samsom Agreement.

BIRMINGHAM, June 14.—The American commission to the Samsom conference have received instructions from Blaine in relation to the proposed drawn up by the conference. Blaine disapproves with several provisions of the proposed, and has no doubt that England and Germany have not gone far enough in respect to rights conceded to the United States. The conference had a sitting today to give Blaine's reply. The English and German commissioners will afterward consider Blaine's objections and decide upon what policy they shall pursue, and upon the attitude which they will adopt towards the continuance of the conference.

The Cologne Gazette says the reinstatement of Malletta is probable. It says Germany considers the question of ruler of Samsom secondary to that of security to the lives and property of foreign residents.

Senator Sablin's Divorce.

ST. PAUL, June 13.—The report that ex-Senator Sablin had applied for a divorce from his wife on the ground of habitual drunkenness is true in that such application was made some weeks ago, and has since privately been granted, the whole affair being kept from the public and being known only to a few intimate friends of the ex-senator. Mrs. Sablin's special mania is said to have been the extravagantly unnecessary purchase of costly clothing for herself and her adopted children when there was no demand for such purchases. This mania having gone to the point of seriously crippling Senator Sablin in his business. The divorce was now resorted to against the tendency to make extravagant purchases. Mrs. Sablin is now said to be located in an asylum at Fishling, L. I., the ex-senator paying all her expenses there. It is asserted that she had been an invalid some time before her marriage, and from its use as a medicine she became confined in the asylum. When Senator Sablin left the senate his wife requested that she be placed in this retreat. Mrs. Sablin did not contest the suit.

Returned Without Extradition.

NEW YORK, June 13.—The World says: The West Coast Telephone company has received notice from Santiago, Chile, that after a long fight the courts there have suspended the extradition of William A. Bushnell, alias Gerald F. Hanson, and he has been handed over to Detective Kelly, who left New York in October, 1888. He arrested Hanson for a 10-year old forgery of \$25,000 on Butler, Stillman & Hubbard, after he had succeeded under the name of L. Hanson in stealing \$25,000 from the West Coast Telephone company, of which he was agent in Chile. The case is one of the most extraordinary extradition cases in years. There is no treaty between the United States and Chile, and the prisoner is delivered as an act of courtesy to Chile.

The man made many friends in Santiago. The town took sides, a duel was fought, and wagers of thousands of dollars were made that he would never be brought back to New York.

In a Quagmire.
SAN FRANCISCO, June 14.—A special from Los Angeles says: Major Khaball, chief quartermaster of the department of Arizona, is in a quagmire as to how to proceed regarding an important contract. A few days ago bids were opened for supplying 3,000,000 pounds of grain and other supplies to military posts in Arizona, and one Gilbert Webb was found to be the lowest bidder. According to law the contract should be awarded to him. Webb has a large ranch situated between Fort Thomas and Fort Lowell, adjacent to the scene of the recent robbery of Paymaster Whitman, and when the contract was just about to be awarded him, word was received at headquarters in this city of his arrest on a charge of participation in that robbery. The authorities are not perplexed as to whether they are obliged by law to award him the contract or not.

Wants to Come Back.

DURANGO, Colo., June 14.—T. T. Burgess, the delinquent city treasurer, is expected to return to Durango within the next ten days or two weeks. During the May term of the district court Mr. Burgess was indicted and bound for his appearance at the next term of the district court, the bond being fixed at \$10,000. Last week Mr. Burgess' bondsmen paid the shortage due the city and the suit against Mr. Burgess and his bondsmen has been dismissed. The city has received its money and is satisfied, and the bondsmen have agreed not to prosecute him if he will return and help them out.

Mr. Burgess is at present in Old Mexico, where he is safe from prosecution, but we understand he is anxious to return and repair for his crime, but to do this the bond will have to be reduced to \$2,000.

The "Little Louisiana."
NEW YORK, June 14.—Anthony Comstock made a successful raid yesterday. He arrested Oliver D. Chase, manager of the Great Lithographing and Engraving company and seized 1,000,000 lottery tickets, fifteen lithograph stones, about half a ton in weight, five numbering machines and the paper for printing. Five hundred thousand tickets were printed for a lottery company which Comstock says has no existence. They are "The Original Little Louisiana Lottery company of San Francisco, Cal., supplement of the Louisiana State lottery, Kansas City and New York, and the original Little Louisiana Lottery company of Oakland, Cal." Chase was held for trial at the Tombs police court.

Will Make a Political Move.

ALBANY, June 14.—A requisition was presented to Gov. Hill yesterday from Gov. Fifer of Illinois, for the surrender of Maron and McDonald, charged with the murder of Dr. Cronin. The governor denied the application without prejudice and with a renewal of the same, simply on the grounds: First, that the application was not accompanied by the indictment. Second, that no proof whatever was presented showing that the

accused are guilty of the crime charged against them, as required by the laws of this and all other states. The application was laid solely upon the affidavit made upon information given before the coroner's jury.

Millions of Land Involved.

ACAPULCO, Mexico, June 14.—It is estimated here by prominent lawyers that the decision of Judge Key, of the Trazas county district court, yesterday in the case of the state vs. the Southern Pacific railway involved the title of 29,000,000 acres of land of about \$100,000,000 in value. The decision does not invalidate the land covered by the veteran and other certificates located since 1876, as was at first supposed, but only railroad lands affected. The case will be immediately passed upon by the supreme court at its present term. If Judge Key is sustained, then it is by some proposed. It will call an extra session of the legislature between now and the next state election, so as to get a constitutional amendment adopted, making void the title which will be rendered void if the decision is sustained, and repealing the articles in the constitution on which the decision was based. Homesteads are not invalidated.

High Water.

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., June 13.—Although there has been no rainfall during the last twenty-four hours, White river and other Indiana streams continued to rise. Thousands of acres of farmland are under water, and the damage to crops and property is high up in the thousands. Several bridges have been carried away in the southern part of the state. The Vandalia is transferring its passengers near Evansville, and trains on other lines west and south are running regularly. In Owens county 2,500 acres of crops are under water and in Morgan, Bartholomew, Clay and Greene counties it is estimated that over 10,000 acres more are inundated.

A Texas Midget.

SHERMAN, TEXAS, June 14.—A little child of ten months died yesterday. It was a boy and was born fifteen days ago. After its death it was weighed and tipped the beam at one and three-quarter pounds. It was perfectly formed, but measured only fifteen and one-half inches in length. Its head was just about the size of an ordinary turkey egg, and its feet about the size of a small teaspoon. Another remarkable circumstance is that its mother died in giving it birth. The midget was apparently healthy up to the time of its death.

Downing a Trust.

SILVERWATER, June 14.—At the suggestion of Gov. Merriam, the board of state prison managers at their meeting here appointed a committee of two to investigate the question of making binding time at the state prison by the convicts. This method of preventing the pending lawless trust was suggested originally by the state legislature at its recent session and in some other states has been adopted by the authorities.

From Stanley.

ZANZIBAR, June 14.—A letter received here from Uruti, on the southeastern shore of Victoria Nyanza, dated December 2, reports the arrival there of Stanley with a number of invalid members of his force. The letter says that Stanley had sustained heavy losses, a large number of his men having died from disease and famine. The explorer had rejoined and left Emin Pasha on the northwestern shore of the lake.

INDIANS OFFER AID.

Young Bucks from the Training School Tender Their Assistance.

PITTSBURGH, June 14.—These telegrams passed between Gov. Beaver, of Pennsylvania, and R. H. Pratt, manager of the government Indian training school:

Gov. Beaver: If my services with 100 able bodied, well disciplined young Indian men, capable of performing more than ordinary laborers, and my trained nurses, with six trained assistant Indian girls nurses, will be of any use anywhere in the flooded districts, I can take trains and tents with us. Pratt, Captain.

Gov. Beaver replied: Capt. Pratt: Advice from all parts of the state where distress prevails seem to indicate that they are well provided for by Indian labor and nurses. We are employing the unemployed of the regions as much as possible for obvious reasons. Am grateful for your offers. The tables have turned in the Indian problem. Your generous offer I treat as a harbinger of the coming of a better day for the Indian and better relations between him and the white man.

Preparing for Winter.

PHILADELPHIA, June 14.—There was a rumor from Chicago that a consolidated coal trust company was to be formed with a capital of \$500,000,000. The story could not be verified in this city, and coal companies laughed at it. A prominent broker said: "There is something in it. The men back of it are in New York, Philadelphia and Chicago."

My Lord's Purse.

LONDON, June 14.—Lord Wolverton has requested the eight members of Derbyshire to nominate two artisans from each town to form a deputation to visit the Paris exposition. Lord Wolverton will not only defray the entire expenses but will give a prize for the best essay on any particular industry.

Men Murdered by Apaches.

TUCSON, A. T., June 13.—A report has reached here that two white men were killed in the Sierra Madre mountains 150 miles south of Hermosillo, Sonora, by Apache Indians. Four Indians were seen, but the band is thought to be larger.

Keeping It Shady.

CHICAGO, June 14.—The proceedings of the grand jury in the Cronin inquest are guarded with the strictest secrecy. A number of witnesses were heard yesterday, but none are likely to give sensational evidence.

A Hanging.

ALLENWOOD, Tenn., June 13.—Last night a mob broke into the jail and took Lloyd and Reynolds, double murderers, and hanged them to a tree near by.

Speedy Justice.

CORVOS, Ind., June 14.—Burglars James Davis and Charles Tennyson were taken from jail early yesterday by a mob and hanged to the bridge.

It Is Bad Enough.

JONESTOWN, June 14.—The general opinion among well posted people here is that the loss of life is between 3,000 and 4,000.

THE ROCK ISLAND.

The Far West Division Has a Little Meeting of its Own.

TOPEKA, June 13.—The annual meeting of the Chicago, Kansas & Nebraska Railroad company was held yesterday. About 2,500 shares were represented, mostly by proxy. The meeting was a matter of form, and a tended by few persons from abroad. It was decided to complete the Fort Reno branch of the southwestern division at once. This line will run from Fort Reno to Fort Reno via Kingfisher, a distance of over 100 miles. The following resolutions were unanimously adopted:

Resolved, That all acts, agreements and proceedings entered into by any existing agreements and contracts of said company shown by these records and executed by proper officers of the company for the lease or purchase of railroad rights, franchises and appurtenances of any other railroad company or any part thereof, as well as the contract dated 10th of April, 1889, between the Union Pacific railway company and the Chicago, Rock Island & Pacific railroad and the Chicago, Kansas & Nebraska railroad company be and the same be ratified and confirmed as acts, proceedings and agreements of the Chicago, Kansas & Nebraska railroad company.

A board of directors was elected as follows: M. A. Low; H. A. Parker; C. F. Jelson; H. F. Morris; D. Atwood; W. W. Samuel and W. W. Phelps. The board of directors afterward organized by electing M. A. Low, president; H. A. Parker, vice president, and Chief Engineer C. F. Jelson, secretary and treasurer.

Destination in West Virginia.
Baltimore, June 14.—Mayor Latrobe has received a letter from Dr. Butler, of Sheppardstown, W. Va., stating that great destitution exists in that neighborhood among the coal boatmen on account of the recent flood. The writer expressed much regret that the relief committee, which was last week at Point of Rocks and other places about Harper's Ferry, did not extend its investigations further up the Potomac.

Charges Filed.
WASHINGTON, June 14.—Charges have been filed with the secretary of the Interior against Agent Walker of the Winnebago reservation and against the register of the land office at Channon, Neb. It is expected that both these officials will be removed, and it is said by those who have seen the charges that the administration would be warranted in taking summary action.

Fear of the Mormons.
WINNING, June 14.—The newspapers in Alberta territory are calling upon the Dominion government to watch the Mormon colony founded near MacLeod, by persons from Salt Lake City. It is charged that they are practicing polygamy. It is feared they will shortly control the electorate. The government is being urged to sell them no more land.

Appointed.
WASHINGTON, June 14.—The president has made the following appointments: Charles M. Colburn, of Nevada, to be coiner of the mint at Carson City, Nev.; E. D. Breskie, of Nevada, to be meller at the same mint.

Bound to Have It.
HARTFORD, Conn., June 14.—The house has amended the secret ballot bill voted by the governor, by restricting its operations to state and presidential elections. As so amended it was passed by a large majority. An amendment, requiring the drawing of names according to politics was rejected, 82 to 102.

POLITICAL CHAT.
A New Mexico lawyer of some distinction, says the New York Graphic, who is stopping at the Madison hotel, is Louis Sulzbacher, of Las Vegas. His name may appear any morning in the list of federal appointments as the new chief justice of that territory, as he is indorsed for that place by three former delegates and three former chief justices of the territory. Mr. Sulzbacher is a type of the successful western man. He is a German, and years ago was conducting a small general store in New Mexico when a burglar broke in and attempted to rob him. He shot the man, who proved to have influential connections and they endeavored to have Mr. Sulzbacher indicted and punished for his act. He got clear, of course, but his glimpse of the courts gave him an ambition to become a lawyer. He could then neither read nor speak English with any fluency and could not write a word of it. But he set to work on the books, determined to master the language and master the law. He was finally sufficiently educated in both to be admitted to the bar, and since then has by the diligent practice of his profession accumulated a fortune of a quarter of a million dollars. He has given his children the advantage of education which he himself lacked and they have been sent to school in New York and abroad.

L. A. Hughes, who is making a strong pull to be the next collector of internal revenue for New Mexico, is down from Santa Fe, and says that he will pull the wool over the eyes of all the opposition candidates.—Albuquerque Citizen.
