Mexico: Report On Petroleum Product Output, Exports

On Dec. 14, Petroleos Mexicanos (Pemex) released a report stating that in the past five years Mexico exported an estimated 198 million barrels of petroleum products for a total of more than \$4.9 billion. Mexico ranks 11th world-wide in refining capacity. In the last eight months, Pemex's daily output averaged 1.422 million barrels of crude, of which an average 121,000 barrels were exported per day. A partial breakdown of export products was as follows: liquified gas, 26%; gasoline, 16.9%; jet fuel, 14.9%; diesel, 7.6%; fuel oil, 16%; and, pentane, 6.1% (used as a solvent).
