PASSOVER FEAST BEGINS APRIL 12

All Jewish Families to Refrain From Eating Leaven

The Feast of Unleavened Bread, otherwise known as Passover, begins this year on Wednesday, April 12, and will be observed by all Jewish people for a period of seven or eight days, according to their interpretation of the biblical injunction in Exodus 13:14.

During the Passover week all Jewish families abstain from eating leavened bread, and in addition, eat the Matzo, symbolizing the freedom of Israel.
