## **Mexican Foreign Minister On Central American Tour**

On Jan. 24, Mexican Foreign Minister Fernando Solana Morales arrived in Guatemala City on an official visit, the first stop in a Central American tour. Solana Morales was scheduled to meet with President Vinicio Cerezo, Vice President Roberto Carpio Nicole, Foreign Minister Alfonso Cabrera Hidalgo, and with officials responsible for cooperation programs with Mexico. According to Notimex, major agenda items included the status of Guatemalan refugees in Mexico, bilateral relations and the regional peace process. The tour marks Solana Morales' first trip abroad as foreign minister for the government of President Carlos Salinas de Gortari. Salinas assumed power in early December, 1988.
