NOTICE.

State Engineer's Office. Santa Fe, N. M., July 24th, 1917. Number of Application 1047. Notice is hereby given that on the 24th day of July, 1917, in accordance with Section 26, Chapter 49, Irrigation Laws of 1907 Edward Crouch, of Caballo, County of Sierra, State of New Mexico, made formal application to the State Engineer of New Mexico for a permit to appropriate the Public Waters of the State of New Mexico.

Such appropriation is to be made from Las Animas Creek at a point whence the N 1/4 cor. Sec. 30 T. 15 S., Range 5 West, bears N. 44 deg. 30 min. E., 988.2 feet distant (1) whence NE. Cor. Sec. 30 (Same Twp. & Rng.) bears N. 887.7 feet distant (2) whence the same corner bears N. 38 deg. 40 min. W., 2245 feet distant, by means of diversion works and three-tenths cu. ft. per sec. is to be conveyed to lands in Section 29, Tp. 15 S., Range 5 West by means of main canals and laterals and there used for the irrigation of twenty acres and domestic purposes.

Any person, firm, association or corporation deeming that the granting of the above application would be truly detrimental to their rights in the water of said stream system shall file a complete statement of their objections substantiated by affidavits with the State Engineer and serve a copy on applicant on or before the 22nd. day of October, 1917, the date set for the Engineer to take this application up for final consideration unless protested. In case of protested application all parties will be given a reasonable length of time in which to submit their evidence in detail or arrange a date convenient for a hearing or appoint a referee satisfactory to all to take testimony. Appearance is not necessary unless advised officially by letter from the State Engineer.

SYNOPSIS OF THE GAME LAW.
(In Effect March 18, 1915.)
NOTE—Sec. 6 of the Act—Game fish as defined by this act, small and large mouthed bass and speckled trout, of what ever species or variety; also carp and ring perch.
OPEN SEASONS—GAME
Deer with horns (hors to accompany car asses at all times), limit one per. North of thirty-fifth parallel of north latitude, from October sixteenth to November fifth of

each year. And south of said thirty-fifth parallel from October twenty-fifth to November 25 of each year.

Tassel-eared Gray Squirrels, from June 1st to November 30th of each year.

Wild Turkey, (classed as big game) north of the thirty-fifth parallel of North latitude, from November 1st. December 1st of each year, and first of the said 35th parallel from November 25th November 25th of each year. Limit in possession in any one calendar day

Native or erected, Messina, California or Helemlet Quail, from October 25th to December 31st, of each year. Limit, 20 in possession in one calendar day.

Doves from August 16th to September 30th of each year Limit, 20 in possession one calendar day.

OPEN SEASONS—FISH
Trout, Large and Small Mouth Bass, Crappie and Ring Perch, from June 1st to November 25 of each year.

"Sec. 12 No person shall at any time shoot, hunt or take in any manner any wild animals or birds or game fish as herein defined in this state without first having in his or her possession a hunting license as hereinafter provided for the year in which such shooting, fishing or hunting is done. The presence of any person in any open field, prairie or forest, whether enclosed or not, with traps, gun or other weapon for hunting, without having in possession a proper hunting license as herein provided, shall be prima facie evidence of the violation of this section. Hunting licenses shall be issued by the county clerks when duly authorized by the State Game and Fish Warden, and such deputies as may be designated for that purpose by the State Game and Fish Warden. None of the provisions of this act shall require any resident of this state to obtain or have a license to fish for trout.

Agriculture Forest Service
THE SIX RULES
For Care With Fire in the Mountains.
If every member of the public strictly observe these simple rules, the great annual loss by Forest Fires would be reduced to a minimum.

1.—Be sure your match is out before you throw it away

2.—Knock out your pipe ashes or throw your cigar or cigarette stump where there is nothing to catch fire.

3.—Don't build a camp fire any larger than is absolutely necessary. Never leave it even for a short time without putting it OUT with water or earth.

4.—Don't build a camp fire against a tree or log. Build a hill one where you can scrape away the needles, leaves or grass from all sides of it.

5. Don't build bon fires
The wind may come at any time and start a fire you cannot control.

6.—If you discover a fire out it out if possible; if you can't, get word of it to the nearest U. S. Forest Ranger or State fire Warden just as quickly as you possibly can.
