Honduran President Accepts Feb. 14 Date For Summit

On Jan. 31 in Caracas (Venezuela), Honduran President Jose Azcona Hoyo told the Associated Press that his government had agreed to participate in a Central American summit on Feb. 14. The summit will take place in San Salvador. According to Azcona, Nicaraguan President Daniel Ortega continues to press for an earlier date, Feb. 8-9. He said he would meet with Ortega and Guatemalan President Vinicio Cerezo in Caracas on Feb. 1 to discuss the issue. All Central American foreign ministers and four presidents were scheduled to attend the inauguration ceremonies for Venezuelan President-elect Carlos Andres Perez. Salvadoran President Jose Napoleon Duarte will not attend. The Central American officials are to convene in Caracas to firm up the summit date. (Basic data from AP, 02/01/89)
