On Feb. 3, US Vice President Dan Quayle arrived in San Salvador, accompanied by Salvadoran Foreign Minister Ricardo Acevedo, for a seven-hour visit from Venezuela. Members of the Movement for Land, Work and Freedom (MPTL) punctured car tires and used a bus to block traffic in the downtown area. They left behind placards saying Quayle had come to "give orders to puppet (President Jose Napoleon) Duarte, to continue and escalate the war and repression against our people."
