On Feb. 3 in Geneva, economic adviser for the Radical Party, Francisco Mezzadri, told reporters that the Radicals are committed to reducing the public deficit. Mezzadri participated in the 9th World Economic Symposium in Davos, Switzerland. Public spending, including debt service, said Mezzadri, accounts for 55% of gross domestic product.
