## **Mexican Government Declines Invitation To Send Observers For Salvadoran Election**

On March 16, Mexico City declined an invitation by President Jose Napoleon Duarte's government to send an official representative to observe the March 19 general elections. A communique by the Foreign Ministry indicated that its decision was based on Mexico's traditional policy which holds that elections in a given nation are the business of that country alone.
