Telegraphic Tidings

WASHINGTON MATTERS.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 6.—The president left yesterday for Cresson, Penn. He expects to remain until October 1.

SILVER PURCHASES.

The amount of silver offered to the treasury department yesterday was 1,077,000 ounces. The amount purchased was 250,000 ounces, at \$1.1720 (\$1.1737).

The secretary of the treasury, after an interview with the director of the mint, decided that he will purchase under the new law 280,000 ounces of silver between August 13 and September 30, so as to start on October 1 with the purchase of 4,500,000 ounces per month. Yesterday's purchases make a total of 4,500,359 ounces since the new law went into effect.

THE SURPLUS.

In the house Mr. Cannon made a statement of the probable surplus after all of the appropriations are made. For the fiscal year, 1891, he estimated a surplus of \$17,000,000. Mr. Sawyer, for the Democrats, also submitted an estimate, in which he claimed would show a net deficit of \$11,000,000 for that year.

CONGRESSIONAL.

SENATE.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 6.—The tariff bill was taken up, and consideration of the free list proceeded with.

Vance moved to strike out the provisions relating to animals imported specially for breeding purposes. The proviso requires animals to be pure-blooded, of recognized breed, with a record of pedigree. Defeated; yeas 22, nays 34.

The senate then went back to the paragraph relating to gloves, which Plumb had yesterday moved to amend by striking out the additional rate on men's gloves. The motion was defeated—yeas 22 to 30, Plumb being the only Republican who voted yeas.

Quay moved to insert on the free list wild animals intended for zoological collections for scientific and educational purposes. Agreed to.

Plumb moved to strike hide, raw or un-cured, off the free list. Defeated; yeas 19, nays 29. All the affirmative votes were Republicans.

Davis moved to insert binding twine on the free list.

Vance moved to amend the amendment by adding cotton bagging.

Vance's motion was defeated; yeas 19, nays 29.

Davis' amendment was agreed to; yeas 38, nays 18.

HOUSE.

The Clayton-Breckinridge contested case was taken up. Breckinridge was accorded the floor in his own behalf. He denied that the murder in his district was committed for political purposes, as charged by the committee on elections. The men who charged either on the floor or in the press that the people in Arkansas or any group of people representing that state, had ever shown sympathy with the infamous murder of Clayton, or that he (Breckinridge) had any knowledge of it in the slightest degree, uttered that which was cowardly and mean and which they knew to be false. (Democrats applause.)

Breckinridge continued by arraigning the committee as biased. Clayton, said he, was a bosom friend. It had been said he should have resigned after the murder. To have done so would have been to admit he believed the Clayton murder effected the result of the election. The sub-committee had denied him witnesses. No greater delinquency of free ballot was ever committed. He closed with the words: "Come to your conclusion, and I will take my appeal to the people, regardless of party, in the district. I have a party to represent on the broad ground of common honesty, and in November they will reverse both your conclusion and the method of your conclusion."

MEAT INSPECTION BILL.

The Foreign Countries Must Now Eat Yankee Beef or Get a Taste of Retaliation.

CHICAGO, Sept. 6.—A special from Washington says:

Now that the president has signed the meat inspection bill it is in order for the state department to call the attention of the United States ministers to Germany, France and England to the propriety of inviting the attention of those governments to the measure. This will be done next week. No further action will then be taken in the matter for a couple of months, but unless the discriminations exercised towards American meat products in those countries are withdrawn by that time the president will be advised by many members of the senate and house of representatives who are watching the matter closely to put in force the authority to retaliate, with which he is vested by the law in question.

Powderly a Jonah.

BALTIMORE, Sept. 6.—The federation of labor last night laid on the table a letter asking for contributions from unions represented in the federation for the New York Central railroad strikers. The members of the federations who spoke said they had every confidence in the local organization through which the money would be transmitted, but had no confidence in the general executive board of the Knights of Labor. They did not believe the money would ever reach the strikers. One delegate said Powderly is the Jonah of the Knights of Labor. He hoped that at the next general convention of the knights they will throw Powderly overboard and that no whale will catch him up.

The Climatological Association.

DENVER, Sept. 6.—The National Climatological association which has been in session here all week adjourned last night, after electing the following officers: President, Dr. F. J. Knight, Boston; first vice-president, Dr. E. L. Trudeau, Saratoga Lake; second vice-president, Dr. T. S. Hopkins, Thomasville, Ga.; secretary and treasurer, Dr. J. B. Mer, Philadelphia; representative to medical congress, Dr. A. L. Loomis; alternate, Dr. F. Donaldson, Baltimore; council, Dr. F. C. Shattuck, Boston; Dr. R. G. Curtin, Philadelphia; Dr. T. E. Soliv, Colorado Springs; Dr. A. L. Loomis, New York; Dr. E. L. Shurley, Detroit.

FAREWELL ADDRESS.

Major-General Nelson A. Miles Takes Leave of His Troops.

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 6.—In taking leave of the troops he has so long commanded, Major-General Miles yesterday issued the following farewell order.

In accordance with the provisions of general orders No. 34, current series, from the headquarters of the army, the undersigned hereby relinquishes the command of the division of the Pacific and of the department of California. In taking leave of this division, after twenty years' service west of the Mississippi, and nearly ten years in command of the department of the Columbia, Arizona and division of the Pacific, he desires to express his appreciation of the zealous efforts and faithful services of the troops who have constituted this command. He recognizes the difficulties that have been encountered and the hardships incident to service in the most remote regions of the United States, and remembers, with gratitude the faithful discharge of duty of troops who have served from the Upper Yukon, in Alaska, to the Yaqi, in Old Mexico. To the people and press of the Pacific coast, who have rendered assistance and encouragement to the troops, the undersigned takes this opportunity to express his appreciation.

Gen. Miles is now enroute east for the scene of his new command. He goes by way of Portland, Tacoma and Seattle, and expects to arrive in Chicago in about ten days.

EUGENE H. COWLES.

Prepared to Press His Suit Against His Wife's Relatives.

MONTREAL, Sept. 6.—Eugene H. Cowles, who arrived here last spring, followed by his brother-in-law, C. C. Hale, and was shot by the latter, is again in the city preparatory to the opening of the trial of Hale on a charge of attempted murder.

Cowles is not now as inclined to let his wife go free as he was when he voluntarily surrendered his child to her legal advisers. His wife agreed when she received the child to remain in Montreal until he recovered, but under pressure from her father immediately broke all promises and left the city. Upon his recovery Cowles attempted to open correspondence with his wife, but without success, all his letters being referred to her legal advisers.

Thus failing in his object he determined to turn the tables upon Mrs. Cowles and her family, and at once entered action against his father-in-law, E. B. Hale, and brother-in-law, Willis Hale, claiming damages of \$100,000 each for conspiracy to break up his family, ruin his reputation and cause his death. He has been asked to refrain from prosecuting C. C. Hale, his assailant, but, as he puts it, (Cowles) must proceed with the case as a vindication of his character and a refutation of the charge brought against him.

Mrs. Cowles and her friends charged him with infidelity, failure to support her and her child and various other pretensions in duty. He affirms that his wife refused to live with him, that she never visited him in his various illnesses, that he formed an intimacy with a Miss Rathbone which is a matter of great concern to her family. He justified the abduction of the child on the grounds of ill-faith on the part of his wife. Cowles looks none the worse for his shooting, but a further operation will have to be performed to remove a piece of decaying bone.

CATHOLIC CONGREGATIONS

A Census Being Made and Nearly Ready to Be Reported.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 6.—The general census of the Catholic church and congregations in the United States has been nearly completed, and it is expected that full returns will have been received by Sept. 10. The task of gathering these statistics was entrusted to Rev. Dr. Carroll, of Plainfield, N. J., and was greatly simplified by sending to the chancellors of the various dioceses blanks containing full instructions, and which have been transmitted to the pastors of the various churches to be filled up.

It is probable that with this return will be incorporated a record of the services of Catholic chaplains, Sisters and nurses during the war, which is in course of preparation by Rev. P. P. Cooney, C. S. C. of St. Peter's church, of this city, and who was chaplain of the 35th Indiana regiment during the war.

HISTORICAL.			
Santa Fe, the city of the Holy Faith of St. Francis, is the capital of New Mexico, trade center, sanitary, archiepiscopal seat, and also the military headquarters. An Indian pueblo had existed on the site previous to the 15th century. Its name was O-ga-p-ho, but it had been abandoned long before Coronado's time. The Spanish town of Santa Fe was founded in 1680, it is therefore the second oldest European settlement still existing in the United States. In 1804 came the first venturesome American trader—the forerunner of the great line of merchants who have made traffic over the Santa Fe world-wide in its celebrity.
