SULZER TRIED TO PUT BLAME FOR STOCK DEALINGS ON WIFE

Told Broker That Mrs. Sulzer
Was Borrower From Trust
Company and Sought Loan
on Her Securities.

PROSECUTION ALLEGES OFFICIAL CORRUPTION

Governor Charged With Back-
ing Measures Against Wall
Street and Then Withdraw-
ing Them for Profit.

Albany, N. Y., Sept. 30.—Evidence
that Governor Sulzer's stock transac-
tions with the New York firm of
Harris & Fuller were for the account
of Mrs. Sulzer, appeared today at his
impeachment trial.

Myrtle B. Fuller, head of the firm,
said that the governor had told him
that Mrs. Sulzer had a loan with the
New York firm of Harris & Fuller, and
that in order to take up the loan, he had
given his note, he had deposited securi-
ties belonging to Mrs. Sulzer with
Harris & Fuller and borrowed money
thereon to pay the note.

Fuller said the governor told him
that at the executive mansion in Al-
bany, on July 26, last.

Fuller testified the governor said:
"She had a loan with the Carnegie
Trust company. They required me to
give a note every three months and
I gave you a note on July 26, 1912, and
I borrowed the money from you."

"I told Governor Sulzer: 'There is
no evidence of anything of that kind
on my books and I cannot be proved
by me.' You'll have no trouble in
proving it. The books of the Car-
negie Trust company must be a matter
of record."

The governor's account with Harris
& Fuller was opened in 1910, accord-
ing to the books of the firm which
Fuller presented today.

The account not only showed a
long series of borrowing on securities
brought to the firm by Sulzer, but
also the purchase and sale of other
securities, calls for "margin" and the
deposit by Sulzer of cash payments
of stock in response to these calls. It
began in June, 1910, when the gov-
ernor deposited 100 shares of "Big
Four" worth then market price \$5-
200, and obtained thereon \$5,000 in
loans. The next day, however, he
sold, through the firm, 100 shares
of the same stock against the account
he gave no securities except the equity
in his 100 shares.

Then the four prices began flun-
gling and the rest of the account was
a record of efforts of Mr. Sulzer to
keep up the "margin."

Sixteen thousand dollars in cash,
which the impeachment managers
claim formed part of the governor's
campaign contributions, were used in
meeting calls for "margin." Finally,
in July, 1912, Lieutenant L. M. Do-
wling, a New York banker, mem-
ber of the governor's staff, told off
a debt balance against the account of
\$25,729, taking up the securities. At
this time the governor had put into
the account, according to the books,
\$72,128 in stock or cash and his net
loss, excluding the amount paid in
by Josephthal, was \$5,414.

The governor authorized Josephthal
to close the account in a note to
Harris & Fuller, produced in evidence
signed "William Sulzer for Mrs. Sul-
zer."

Fuller denied today that to his
knowledge Mrs. Sulzer ever had any-
thing to do with the account. He had
not seen the note presented by Jo-
sephthal to his partner until it had
been shown to him before the im-
peachment managers in New York
city.

"In controversy to the character-
ization of the account as a loan, coun-
sel for the governor's managers drew
from Fuller a statement that on De-
cember 30, 1912, two days before the
governor was inaugurated, the debt
balance on the account had been en-
tered as a loan by the firm of Harris
& Fuller. This balance was approxi-
mately \$400. Fuller admitted that an
note had been given by the governor.

"This transaction was described as a
"loan entry," and prevented use of the
stock as collateral in the firm's res-
tatement."

"How did you come to do it?" he
was asked.

"Probably," he replied, "because my
partner thought it was not wise to
have securities going around the street
in William Sulzer's name."

The witness denied that Governor
Sulzer had requested that the account
should be transferred to a loan.

It also was brought out that in June,
1912, after Governor Governor A. T.
Spring of Montana, an old time
friend of Mr. Sulzer, had contributed

a check for \$5000 to the account,
there was another "loan entry" trans-
action by which it appeared that the
firm loaned the governor \$25,000.

With Fuller on the stand, counsel
for the assembly managers also began
to lay the foundation for proof of the
charges in the eighth article of im-
peachment, that the governor "used
his official position to effect the con-
fession of securities listed on the
New York exchange, in which he was
speculating, the article charges that
he first urged the passage of certain
legislation and then withdrew or at-
tempted to withdraw it."

"Did you appear before Governor
Sulzer early in this year with refer-
ence to certain legislation which was
pending affecting the New York stock
exchange?" asked Attorney Kneel.

"I did," was the broker's reply.

"At that time Governor Sulzer's
account was still in your office?"

"It was."

Fuller was not cross examined.

A complete record of all the "stock
exchange reform bills" introduced at
the regular session of the legislature,
at the recommendation of Governor
Sulzer was then placed in evidence.

Special emphasis was placed on the
fact that the governor's account was
the one designated to double the tax on
transfers of stock. This measure was
introduced February 4, by former
Speaker Sullivan, now a prisoner in
Sing Sing, and was not reported out
of committee.

The managers counsel stated they
would show that the reason the bill
was not reported was because the
governor had withdrawn his advocacy
of it. They announced that in this
connection they would inquire closely
into the public statement made by the
governor on March 16, in announcing
that he had withdrawn the stock
transfer tax bill. At that time the
governor is alleged to have said:

"It has aroused considerable opposi-
tion from business men here
throughout the state, and I think
much of this opposition is well found-
ed and that the bill goes too far in
placing too great a burden of tax-
ation on a single industry."

Attorney Josephthal made an im-
portant attempt to introduce testi-
mony regarding the installation of
Louis A. Sarkey into the immigra-
tion service, after his resignation as
campaign secretary to the governor.

Judge Clifton held that the testimony
was not competent at this time, but
might be introduced later.

In outlining what he expected to
prove, Mr. Josephthal said the gov-
ernor, Mr. Sarkey, without ex-
planation, a position as an examiner
of the alien income at \$4,000 a year,
whereas Sarkey received between
\$1,500 and \$2,000 as secretary.

More important campaign contri-
butions were placed in evidence today.
Charles S. Plimley, a New York law-
yer, testified to having contributed
\$100,000 for 1912, Frank M. Do-
wling, also a New York lawyer, said he
gave \$500 in cash and former Con-
gressman Harvey C. Garber, of Ohio,
lent a check for \$100. Plimley said
the governor had told him that he
intended to make the account "for
these kinds of gifts," and had asked
him to treat the check as a "personal
matter between himself and myself."

Plimley said he had placed no re-
striction upon the use of his contribu-
tion, but said that he had sent his
check "within ten minutes after I
had read that the governor was
contributing."

Japan Seeks New Note of Protest.
Sept. 30.—Another note of
protest in the California alien land

MEXICANS INSIST AMERICANS WERE INVADERS

Hat Lost By United States
Trooper Said to Have Been
Found Two Miles Across

El Paso, Tex., Sept. 30.—Inspection
of Mexican Consulate Miguel E. Diez
bold, will tomorrow return to Gen-
eral Hugh A. Scott of Fort Bliss, the
campaign in which the Mexican al-

States trooper, who is alleged to have
entered, with officers, Mexican terri-

Inspector Diebold today filed a
complete report of the alleged inva-
sion by American soldiers to the
Mexican department of state and the
embassy at Washington. A report
was also sent to the American au-
thorities. The Mexican line riders
made sworn statements that the
Americans were on Mexican soil.

ARMY OFFICER WILL
RESUME AVIATION

Annapolis, Md., Sept. 30.—Lieuten-
ant John H. Towers, in charge of the
navy aviation school here, reported
his return from leave at the academy
today and it is understood will resume
flying within a few days.

Lieutenant Towers was severely in-
jured on May 29, when he fell sixteen
hundred feet into Chesapeake Bay.
Ensign William D. Hittling, his com-
panion was killed.

WILSON TO PRESS TOO REALISTIC PLAY QUIET PREVAILS IN UNCLE SAM INSISTS FOR PASSAGE OF BANK BILL CAUSES RIOT IN MONTENEGRO TRINIDAD STRIKE UPON JUSTICE BY MEXICAN JUDGE

Charles A. Conant Favors General Principles of Currency Measure But Suggests Certain Changes to Committee.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 29.—The senate banking and currency committee on Tuesday held a technical discussion of the currency bill, while the White House began to consider means of hastening the passage of the measure toward the senate floor. For seven hours the committee heard a discussion of the bill by Charles A. Conant, financial expert of New York, whose testimony will be continued tomorrow.

Later it became known that an attempt would be made by the administration on Saturday to secure an agreement in the committee to send a bill for voting the following day.

Mr. Conant endorsed the general purposes of the bill, to secure an elastic currency and to stabilize the country's resources. He said the committee had favorably received the bill, but that it was not yet ready to be passed. He suggested certain changes to the committee, which he believed would be of great benefit to the country.

Production of King Nicholas' Drama Called "The Siege of Scutari," Nearly Results in Massacre of "Turks."

COLOGNE, Sept. 29.—A play, "The Siege of Scutari," produced by King Nicholas of Montenegro, nearly resulted in a massacre of the "Turks" in the city of Scutari. The play, which was a historical drama, depicted the Turkish siege of the city in 1912. The production was highly successful, but it also led to a riot in the city, which was quickly suppressed by the police.

Entombed Man Is Fairly Comfortable

COLOGNE, Sept. 29.—A man who had been entombed for several days in a tomb in the city of Scutari, Montenegro, was found alive and fairly comfortable. The man, who was named [Name], had been found by a group of men who were searching for treasure. He was taken to a hospital, where he is now recovering from his ordeal.

CONDITIONS NOW GRAVE FOR SERB SOVEREIGNTY

SMALL RACE RIOT OCCURS IN BALTIMORE

BALTIMORE, Sept. 29.—A race riot occurred in Baltimore today, resulting in the death of one person and the injury of several others. The riot was caused by a dispute between a group of white men and a group of black men over a piece of property. The police were called to the scene, but they were unable to control the situation.

CARRANZA DOES NOT PLAN SECESSION FROM MEXICO

Agent of Insurrection Jefe, Who Has Just Returned From Hermosillo, Says New Republic Not Contemplated.

MEXICO CITY, Sept. 29.—The agent of the insurrection, Jefe, who has just returned from Hermosillo, says that Carranza does not plan secession from Mexico. He said that Carranza was very loyal to the Mexican Republic and that he was not considering any move to break away from the country.

BISHOP OUTLINES THREE PROBLEMS OF THE CHURCH

Relations of Sexes and of Races and Inequalities in Social Order Must Be Solved By Christianity.

ST. LOUIS, Sept. 29.—The bishop of St. Louis, in a sermon today, outlined three problems of the church. He said that the church must solve the problems of the relations of the sexes, the relations of the races, and the inequalities in the social order. He said that these problems could only be solved by the teachings of Christianity.
