SOCORRO CASE IS LAST CAR OF PEACH ARGUED IN COURT OF APPEALS

Appellate Body at Denver to Pass on Litigation Affecting Legality of Deeds of Trust.

Denver, Oct. 1.—Arguments were begun today in the United States circuit court of appeals in the case of the Central Electric company against the Socorro Electric company, an appeal from the United States district court of New Mexico. A motion to dismiss the litigation was overruled.

The case grows out of the sale of electrical machinery by the Central Electric company to the Socorro Electric company. The Central company obtained a judgment in a state court for payment for the machinery, but before the judgment could be collected, the Socorro company executed a deed of trust, thus tying in its property. The issue in the present case is to determine whether the Socorro company was insolvent when the deed of trust was executed.
