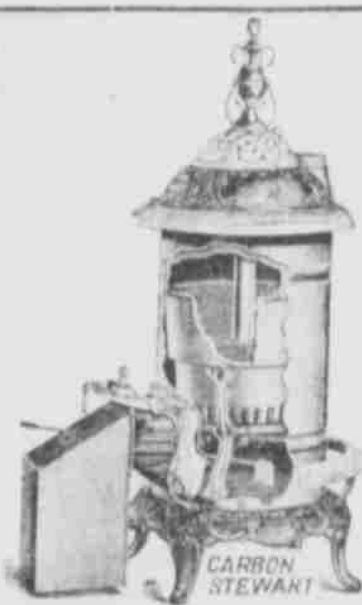

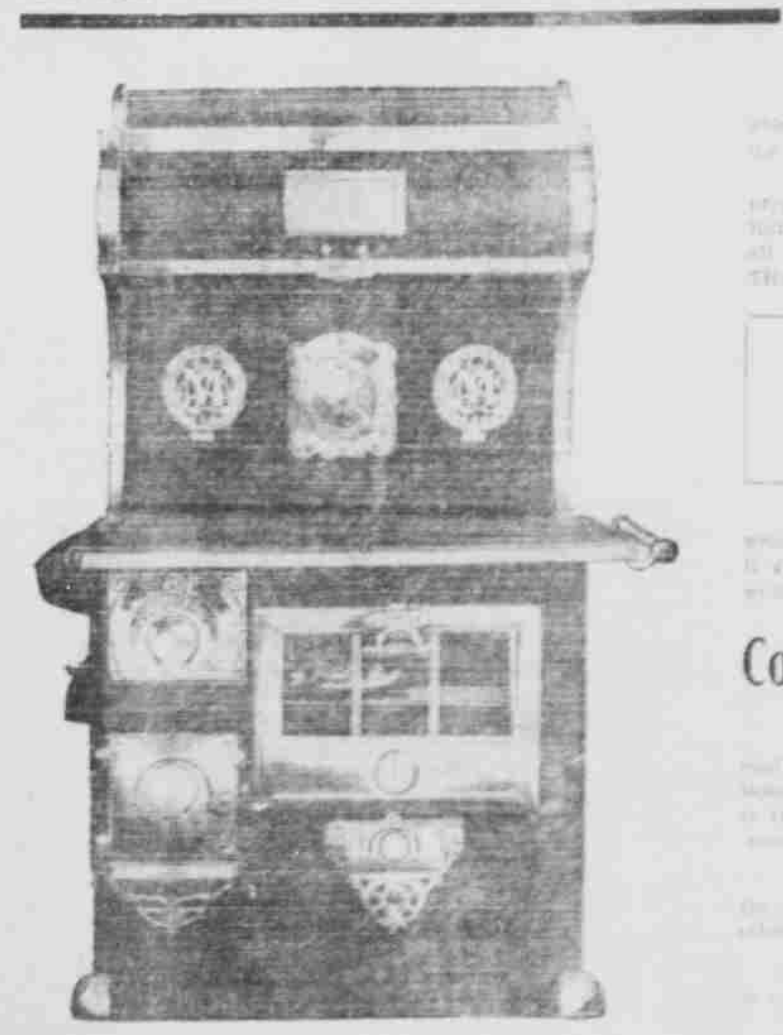

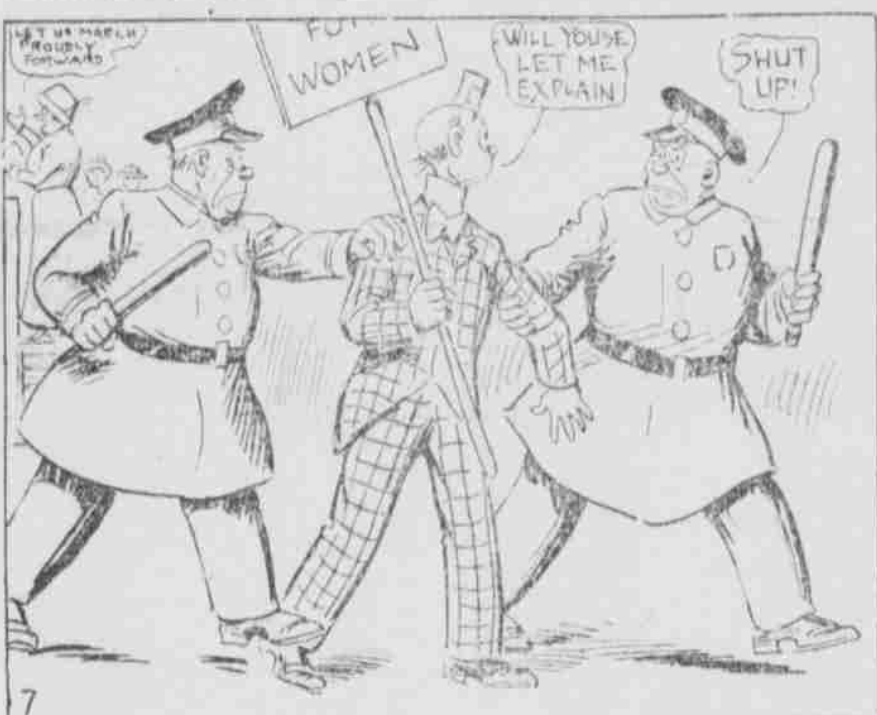
GRAND CIRCUIT RACES
