Salvadoran President-elect Alfredo Cristiani left San Salvador for the US on April 6. He was scheduled to meet with President George Bush on April 7. The meeting agenda reportedly includes the on-going civil war, the country's deteriorating economy, human rights abuses, the Salvadoran judiciary system, and US support to the new government. Cristiani will be inaugurated in June. Accompanying Cristiani were Vice President-elect Francisco Merino, and several advisers from the Nationalist Republican Alliance (ARENA).
