Salvadoran Rebels Offer Another Peace Proposal

From Mexico City on April 6, the Farabundo Marti National Liberation Front (FMLN) offered a new proposal for ending the civil war. The offer states that the Salvadoran administration should declare itself a transitional government until new elections could be held. Next, the FMLN proposed that a negotiated ceasefire would be followed in six months by general elections. The new proposal also called for negotiations on a wide range of political and military issues, including constitutional reform and reducing the size of the armed forces.
