## **U.S. Trade Deficits, January & February 1989: Mexico, Brazil & Venezuela**

According to report by the US Department of Commerce released April 14, in February the Mexican trade surplus vis-a-vis the US dropped by \$45 million compared to January, from \$134.4 million to \$89.4 million. Statistics for Washington's trade deficit in the first two months of the year with Brazil were \$286.6 million (January), \$396.4 million (February). For Venezuela, the totals were \$135.5 million and \$36.3 million, respectively. (Basic data from Notimex, 04/14/89)
