A Northern Blizzard. CHEYENNE, Feb. 9.—The worst blizzard that has been experienced in Wyoming for four years has been raging for the last twenty-four hours.

10,000 Men Out. PITTSBURGH, Feb. 9.—The great strike in the Connellsville regions was inaugurated yesterday, and every mine and coke works in the region are closed down.

The Treasury Port Folio. NEW YORK, Feb. 8.—The Herald's Washington special says: There are grave reasons for the belief that President Harrison is considering John F. Swift, of California, in connection with the treasury portfolio.

Miles After McKeever. WASHINGTON, Feb. 10.—It is said to be almost certain that a sensational court martial will be one of the results of the recent Indian outbreak.

CONDENSED NEWS. Pierre Lorrillard is dangerously ill at Jacksonville, Fla.

By a majority of one the South Dakota senate adopted the report of the committee in favor of the abolition of the death penalty and substituting life imprisonment.

Chicago's board of trade, being against the free coinage of silver, an attempt was made in the Colorado house to pass a resolution refusing to take part in the World's fair.

The Indian Farmers' Alliance in the Indian Nation have protested to Chief Hayes against his leasing lands for cattle grazing at 50 cents per acre.

An injunction has been granted to Bishop Taylor, the African missionary, restraining the disposal of the assets of S. A. Kean & Co.'s bank until \$8,857 belonging to the African Congo mission fund is paid over.

After a four weeks' religious revival at East Liverpool, Ohio, during which more than 1,000 were converted, a crusade has been started against the saloons in old-fashioned crusading style.

A congress of representatives of all the western states will be held in Denver on May 14 to effect an organization designed to promote federal legislation favorable to this section.

Official Census. The census office has sent out from Washington the official announcement of the population of New Mexico by counties as follows:

Bernalillo, 20,913; Colfax, 7,974; Dona Ana, 9,191; Grant, 9,957; Lincoln, 7,081; Mora, 10,618; Rio Arriba, 11,534; San Juan, 1,890; San Miguel, 24,204; Santa Fe, 13,562; Sierra, 3,630; Socorro, 9,595; Taos, 9,888; Valencia, 13,876. Total, 153,593.

H. W. Easton is in receipt of a letter from Louisville, Ky., stating that the Kentucky Mining company will resume operations on the Clinch river placers early in the spring.

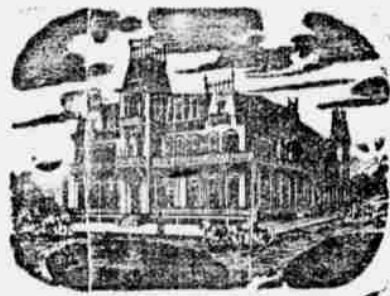
