Note On Cuban Tourism

According to a report broadcast April 18 by Prensa Latina, over 2,000 tourists from Western Europe and Canada and 2,900 from socialist nations are expected to visit Cuba this season on ocean cruise ships. In 1989, over 200,000 tourists traveling to Cuba via all modes of transport are expected. Last year's total included 193,000 from capitalist nations, who spent \$125 million. Tourism agency sources said a 4,746 tourists visited the island last year aboard six cruise ships (three from West Germany, one from France, one from the German Democratic Republic, and one from Poland).
