GALLEGOS GETS A WADE THE MERRY WIDOW SUES THE VERDICT FOR MINSTREL IN HIS SANTA FE FOR ONLY \$500 FUNNYSTUNTS DAMAGES

Plaintiff in District Court Asked for \$5,000—Trial of Suit on Note Now in Progress Before Court.

The jury in the district court yesterday, in the case of Donaciano Gallegos versus E. M. Sandoval, returned a verdict awarding the plaintiff the sum of \$500. The amount sued for was \$5,000. Mr. Sandoval and C. P. Hovey were at first named as defendants in the suit, but the case of Sandoval was dismissed and Hovey is now dead. Sandoval was sheriff of Sandoval county at the time the alleged trespass in the case was committed. The trial of the case of Donaciano Gallegos against Mauricio Ortiz, deceased, C. R. de Rueda and Marcelino Baca, was begun yesterday in the district court. The suit concerns the payment of a note for \$100, which the defense alleges was paid in the lifetime of Mauricio Ortiz. Klock & Owen appear for the defendants, while F. H. Lester represents the plaintiff.

COUNTY PROBATE COURT MEETS

Numerous Routine Matters Attended to Yesterday by Judge Jesus Romero at the Court House.

The will of Candelario Lubato was proven and probated, as was the last will of Fred C. Nash. Mrs. Nash, the widow, was appointed as executrix at the regular meeting of the Bernalillo county probate court yesterday. Judge Jesus Romero presiding. Juan Gutierrez was cited by the court to make a report of his actions and doings as administrator of the estate of Maria Lopez de Taylor, upon the petition of Jose Leon Jaramillo. The inventory of the estate of Isidro Maria Lopez was approved. The petition of Robert A. Miller and Rosa Miller to adopt Floyd Chester Bullock, minor, was approved. S. F. Vann, special administrator, filed his final report of the J. H. Richardson estate, and it was approved. Several bills against the estate were allowed. The reports of the appraisers of the Richardson estate were also approved. Probate Judge Jesus Romero set December 9 as the day when he would hear the wills of William Morris and Jacob Lebes, deceased. An order for the distribution of \$700 from the Abel estate was made by the court. The reports of the appraisers of the Amanda M. Freely estate were approved. George Craig was appointed guardian of William H. Timmons, minor. A statement from D. H. Boatright, guardian of Maria A. Kemmerer, was ordered approved. Juan R. Zamora and Beatrice R. Zamora filed a petition to be appointed guardians of Juliana Torres, which was approved. Court adjourned, to December 9, 1907.

"SANDY" SANDERS DIES IN MICHIGAN

Well Known Old Timer in Albuquerque. Was Connected With the Old Atlantic and Pacific Railway.

A telegram was received in this city yesterday announcing the death in Houghton, Mich., of Charles W. Sanders, better known here for many years as "Sandy" Sanders. During the early days of the town, Mr. Sanders was assistant engineer of the Atlantic and Pacific, with headquarters in Albuquerque. He was married in 1887 to Miss May Coleman, and in the same year moved to California, where he entered the engineering department of the Santa Fe. At the time of his death he occupied a similar position with the Copper Range Mining and Railroad company. He was fifty-two years of age and a native of Worcester, Mass. A wife and three children survive.

Mrs. Darnell Would Recover \$5,000 for Death of Her Husband at Willard a Year Ago—Court Notes.

As a result of the accident at Willard, N. M., November 7, 1906, nearly a year ago, when a Santa Fe freight train struck and killed Charles W. Darnell, a suit was filed in the district court yesterday by Minnie E. Darnell, the widow of the deceased.

The plaintiff prays the court to award her judgment for \$5,000 and the costs of the action. According to her petition she alleges that the train was running at more than average speed and that Mr. Darnell received no warning.

A. G. Rieley and R. D. Rees, of Willard, are attorneys for the plaintiff. Darnell was crossing the trestle cut-off on the public highway at Willard when the train hit him and he was instantly killed. The deceased, who was fifty-three years old, is alleged to have been the sole support of his family.

Another Suit. Louis J. Bordin, a local painter, yesterday filed suit against Luis Trujillo, of Barcelona. The plaintiff avers that on July 15, 1907, he was employed by the defendant to paint a number of buildings in Barcelona, and that they agreed that the work would cost \$65.75.

All that Trujillo paid Bordin, it is alleged, was \$3.75, when he went into bankruptcy. On October 23, Bordin filed a suit for a lien above all other creditors of Trujillo's, and besides praying for \$67.50, the balance due on the bill, he desired that the cost of filing the lien suit, \$3.75, and the costs of the action be paid by the defendant.

CONDITIONS IN THE WOOL MARKET GROW QUIET

ORDERS ARE ONLY FOR IMMEDIATE DELIVERY

Big Mills Which Have Been Holding Off Find It Necessary to Get Into the Market; Prices Standing Firm.

Boston, Mass., Nov. 4.—The wool trade under review is naturally quieter than those which have immediately preceded it, says the Wool and Cotton Reporter. What buying has been done has been from those who desire and, as a matter of fact, must have immediate delivery. Among them are some mills which have been keeping persistently out of the market up until now, because they thought that there might be some reduction in prices. When the unexpected, at least to them, happened, and the big worsted men's wear and dress goods mills not only got active in the market but actually took out of it the very best wools and placed the dealers in that condition that no influence was likely to make them eager to sell wool for months, if at all during the entire season, these buyers realized that they had held back as long as they ought, and that if they were to keep their mills running they must come in.

Montana and Idaho Active. The bulk of the clothing wools sold have been Montana and Idaho. The prices have been on a clean basis of 65 cents for fine and 65 cents for fine medium. The demand continues to be mainly for these grades, although better inquiry all through the market for medium wools than heretofore is reported. Utah and Wyoming have not sold so well and continue to constitute the draggy end of the market. These prices are unchanged from those which have prevailed recently, but any buyer desiring much more wool would have to pay better prices for it than have so far been paid. Moreover, they could not begin to get anything like their own pick in such grades of wool. The Oregon wools, which are pretty generally graded in the west and come forward fairly, have also been disposed of. There are staple wools left among the Idaho and Wyoming grades, but among these it would be hard to get anything like the desirable qualities which have already been bought and are to be opened up and shipped.

Delinquent Are More Quiet. Although some are talking of 40 cents for best Ohio washed delinquent, no sales at that figure are being made and over against such optimistic talk and/or complete one to put the talk of buyers of such wools at 37 1/2 to 38 cents is the fair market figure. Probably the real figure is about 35 1/2 cents, for some of the most posted buyers of such wools state that for a good wool of such variety they would quite willingly pay 25 1/2 cents. Unwashed Ohio delinquent is worth 31 cents. But the principal houses handling delinquents are not doing any great volume of business for the minute, because, as has been said, the market is for the moment rather more a buying market than a selling one, and they are so busy getting ready and delivering the wools they sold some time back.

FINANCE AND COMMERCE

Wall Street. New York, Nov. 4.—The stock market had a brief attack of nervousness today, but it passed almost as quickly as a shadow through the human frame. The monetary situation caused some deep breaths on the prices but the recovered level of prices represented not only full repairs for the losses but some substantial gains. Before the day was over revised construction had been placed on some of the very occurrences which caused the opening break in prices, so that they were made to add very materially in the recovery. To start with significance was attached to the prolonged conferences which had been going on over Sunday between many prominent bankers and capitalists of high standing and what had been sought to attribute to a renewed crisis in the New York Trust company situation. The latter view of these incidents was what has resulted in solidifying and acerbating the trust company situation and incidentally, in paving the way for further consolidation of the iron and steel industry of the country. The view also found credence that protective measures for the stock market itself had been perfected by agreement among the financiers in New York. The fact that the prices of stocks were the lowest and that sufficient support was in force to work prompt check to the decline and early recovery added to the confidence of the reports of measures of protection adopted. The decrease in nominal proportions of the offerings of stock in the market left an uncovered short interest in a nervous state of mind and the buying from this source was an important factor in the latter stages of the recovery. The feeling of uneasiness was increased by the serious view taken of the Saturday bank statements and the demand for gold for New York. The advance to 6 per cent in the Bank of England's official rate of discount without waiting for the regular meeting of the board of governors on Thursday was regarded as indicating an opinion of the gravity in the situation. There was a residue of apprehension holding over from the publication at the close of Ray's stock market of the bank statement. But the banking situation steadily improved, the longer the features of the bank statement were considered, each item of apparent weakness in the statement being open to interpretation of a proportionate strengthening of the general banking position at points most required. The New York clearing house banks were thus seen to have been adequately fulfilling their function as the central reservoirs of the banks of the whole country, and to have met the heavy demand upon them with requisite resources while still in a condition of strength leaving no cause for alarm. The engagements of gold for import continued on a large scale, in spite of the means of obstruction in foreign markets. The realization became general late in the day, no much as that before operations were resumed in the stock market after the election holiday tomorrow the first installment of nearly \$5,000,000 of the incoming tide of gold would be safely lodged in our own bank vaults, to be quickly followed at frequent intervals by other streams of supply.
