## BATTLE FLEET SAILS FOR JAPAN GHASTLY TRAGEDY IN OHIO HAMLET

Admiral Sperry Takes His Magnificent Vessels From Cholera-Infested Port With Scant Ceremony.

Manilla, Oct. 9.—The sixteen ship battle fleet of the Atlantic fleet is now on route to Japan. Sailing orders were given by Rear Admiral Charles N. Sperry, for the fleet to depart two hours earlier than the announced time yesterday, and early this evening the battleships "Connecticut" got under way. Half an hour later all of the great ships were in motion and followed the "Connecticut" down the bay.

The brilliantly sunlit morning, the battleships presented a magnificent appearance, their white sides gleaming as they moved out to sea. The people had been warned of the departure of the fleet, and a large number of them were on the shore to witness the departure.

There was consequently no ceremony of demonstration of any kind save the dipping of flags by the ships in the early hours of the day.

The principal fact that led to the departure of the fleet was the fact that the cholera epidemic which had been committed to the bay, and the long line had cleared Corregidor Island, at the mouth of the bay, and headed north into the China Sea.

Simultaneously with the departure of the fleet, the authorities of Manila started a new campaign to eradicate cholera. The police were ordered to make two house-to-house inspections daily, and the cholera epidemic was being kept under strict surveillance.

The disinfecting force has been increased and the general supervision of the work broadened. The number of new cases reported yesterday fell to a low figure.

## STEAMER RUN DOWN BY STANDARD OIL VESSEL

San Francisco, Oct. 9.—The steamer "Norwood" bound from Gray Harbor to San Pedro, Cal., was found in this harbor today in a waterlogged condition by the Standard Oil company's steamer "Audubon," which left this port two days ago with a cargo of oil.

The "Norwood" was reported to have been run down by the "Audubon" on the coast of Humboldt county, Cal. The "Norwood" was struck by the "Audubon" on the port side amidships and cut below the water line. The "Norwood" sank in rapidly and became waterlogged. Her four boats were immediately lowered and two women, two children, thirteen men and passengers and part of the crew had aboard them.

The boats of the "Norwood" were picked up by the "Audubon" and the passengers and crew of the disabled vessel, which was at once taken in tow, were brought to this city. The bow of the "Audubon" sustained considerable damage but otherwise the steamer was not badly injured.
