FIFTEEN YEARS FOR BANKER MORSE

CURTIS GETS OFF WITH SUSPENDED SENTENCE

Attorneys for Convicted Financier Apply for New Trial; Prisoner in Tomb Pending Court's Decision

(By Morning Journal Special Teamed Wire.)

New York, Nov. 6.—From a cell in the Tombs prison, Charles W. Morse, now director of the affairs of his company, is waiting for the court to decide whether he shall be sentenced to fifteen years in the federal prison at Atlanta, Ga., or the suspension of the sentence.

Morse's attorneys immediately applied for a new trial after sentence had been imposed. It is probable that the court will grant a new trial. Morse was arrested in the Tombs about a month ago, after having been indicted by the grand jury of the Southern district of New York. He was charged with having conspired with others to defraud the National Bank of North America, and with having obtained money from the bank by means of a check which was not cashed.
