ORDERLY ELECTION LOOKED FOR IN CUBA

Liberal Party Claims to Have
Victory Clinched Though Close
Contest Is Predicted.

HAVANA, Nov. 12.—At the close of the presidential campaign which ended last night, with a great conservative demonstration in Havana, the conservative and liberal leaders expressed themselves with the utmost confidence as to the result. The election probably will be very close, but indications are favorable to the success of the liberals. Much, however, depends upon the bringing out of the vote which was not cast in the elections in August, when only 233,132 votes were deposited as compared with a registration of 431,677. The conservatives claim a greater portion of the absent vote of 198,545, alleging that the parties were deterred by intimidation from going to the polls.

A careful canvass made by the Havana Free Press for the liberal party, which would mean a total of 62 electoral votes, eight in excess of the number necessary for a victory. Santa Clara and Matanzas are considered as doubtful, while Manzanillo is conservative.

SUPREME COURT TO PASS ON BIG FINE

Attorney General Decides to

The case, which has been argued in the circuit court, is to be heard by the supreme court in the month of November. 


