The trial in Abraham Huff, which was interrupted by yesterday's dramatic shooting, will be resumed Monday. It having been decided that the vents in the court room did not prejudice the rights of the defendant, he jury will being present.

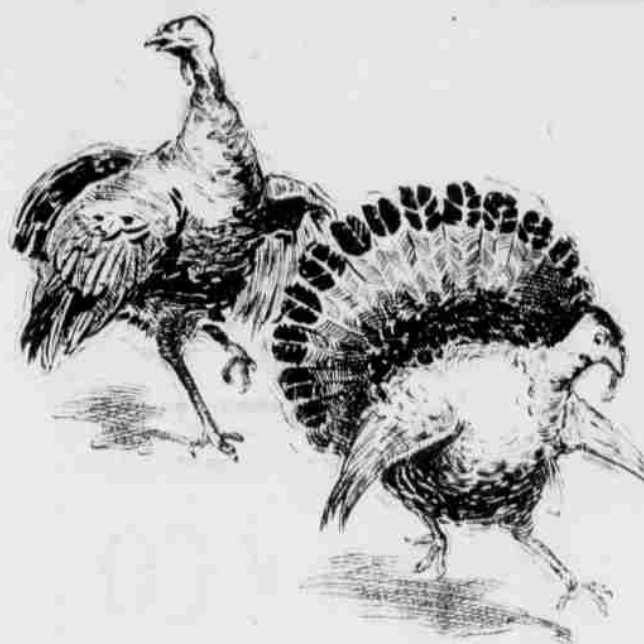
There was some intimation today that the defense would ask for a change of venue, basing their plea on the fact that the trial of the public had been prejudiced by such a mind. But it is thought that such a request would not be considered by Judge Lawlor.

At a conference today between Judge Lawlor, Chief of Police Biggy and Under Sheriff Haggerty, preliminary steps were taken to secure the court from further disorder or violence and to safeguard the rights of the defendant, Huff.

The vicinity of the court room will be patrolled, and a large force of police will be held in reserve.

Suspicious characters will not be allowed in the court room, where a large force of plain clothes men will be stationed to watch in order to keep the jury in ignorance of the precautions taken and not to jeopardize the result of the trial.

The plans further provide that in the event of any disturbance the defendant can be quickly and quietly taken from the court room.
